
Classic Movie Matinee

<u>Maker Mondays</u>



Bird Training with Jessica Beaver



TINKER TUESDAY

A New Season of After School STEM

Tinker Tuesday for this school has started. At our first



session we learned chemistry concepts using the Happy Atoms kit. Using the atom models participants made models of molecules. Using an app on the I Pad they could determine what molecule they had

made and learned how it is used in everyday life. Other

activities were also available such as KEVA planks, Snap Circuits, Goldie Blocks, and Cubelets. This group meets the second Tuesday of each month (except October) from 3:45-5:00 pm to learn about STEM concepts using hands-on-activities. This program is FREE and open to youth Kindergarten through sixth grade.
