#### **Public Art @ the Public Library**

Thanks to a grant from the Knoxville Heritage Community Foundation, the library was able to commission two local artists.

Beginning in May, Kim DeSocio began designing a mural upstairs, depicting a fairytale setting with elements included from recommendations from the public. The mural is completed and available for viewing in the children's area.



In June, ceramic artist Amy Uthus hosted a series of online art classes for children, teens,





and adults. Each week, a new project was posted to the website: painting a mug, canvas pour paint, library creatures,

Participants for this year's summer reading program were encouraged to "Imagine Your Story" by celebrating the different cultures, fairytales, and folklore found around the world.

This year, we had the added flexibility of viewing and completing activities at home. Reading logs were available online and at the front desk, so participants could keep track at home.
