Mosquito Kits



In August, children and their families will have the opportunity to learn more about mosquitos and their habitats and contribute their scientific data to NASA and worldwide through the Glove Observer App.

The Globe Observer website has this to say about the Mosquito Habitat Mapper, "By identifying potential breeding sites for mosquitoes, sampling and counting mosquito larvae, and by using optional equipment to examine, photograph and identify the genus of your specimens, you will be enabling scientists to verify predictive models of mosquito population dynamics. In addition, public health authorities can use your observations to inform where, when, and how to intervene in their communities to reduce disease risk."

The Glove Observer App is free to download, available in several languages, and has other citizen science opportunities Clouds, Land Cover, and Trees. NASA @ My Library supplied a magnifier that can be used as a phone attachment or without the phone. It will enable kids and their families to see the mosquitos and their habitats up close.

Children's Librarian, Paula Spoo, was one of several librarians across NW Iowa who created a video reading STEM inspired children's books for the National Library Week STEM Challenges Festival. Over 700 students, K-4th, registered and received a free kit with supplies to

complete the STEM challenges related to each STEM book. The challenges can be completed virtually between April 1-April 30.

Mary Trent, NW STEM Region Manager, stated, "The goals of festivals are to promote, inspire and engage youth in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) activities and to

introduce students and parents to STEM careers in Northwest Iowa" and "to encourage families to go visit their local library often."

Many of the STEM books featured in the festival are already in the EPL collection and the rest have been ordered.
