#### BEN AND ELLEN MILLER

Ben and I were married February 10, 1907. We moved on what was then the Frank Clark farm NW of Goodell. Mr. Clark was a bachelor and boarded with us that year. Our first little boy, Verle, was born there Nov. 25, 1909.

The first of March 1910 we moved on the WR Boom farm east of Klemme. The first of March 1911 we moved on the Dutcher

farm (south of the Lindon Ranch) where we farmed with my folks and lived in part of the same house and here is where our second little boy, Alvin, was born April 7, 1911.

In the fall of that year we moved to Canton SD. Ben fixed a cover over the wagon and took our stoves and some of the other stuff in the wagon. He drove all the way out there. We shipped the rest of the furniture by train. The two children and I went on the train.

When we all got there we rented an apartment in Canton for one winter and Ben worked by the hour at whatever he could find to do. It sure was a cold winter 40 below zero part of the time, frost ½ in. thick on the windows and the curtains froze in it some, but we were warm.

In the spring of 1912 we rented a house by ourselves and Ben worked in the Molten Engine Factory in Canton pouring the hot iron. We lived in Canton until the spring of 1913 when we moved to the country and Ben worked for Bill Brown on the farm and this is where our little girl, Leona, was born April 15, 1913. We lived there until fall corn picking and moved to Clondike down by the river, not many miles from where we had lived. Ben picked corn for different farmers and was only home over Sunday. Our 3 children and I stayed alone with our Collie dog, Flossie.

Well, Ben moved a year to Ohio to visit his folks who he had not seen since he came to lowa when he was 17, so the first of the year 1914 we locked up the house and he went to visit and folks for 3 or 4 weeks while the children and I stayed with my folks, on what was then the Prestholt place, then the Loveless place (south of Fertile).

That spring my folks moved to the place west of Fertile what is now the Gilner place & the children and I moved with them. Ben went back to SD when he got back from Ohio and worked for a road gang who took charge of our house and everything. Of course, Ben was with them & our little girl, Viola, was born at my folks on May 31, 1914.

Ben had made plans with his Dad (while he was in Ohio) that we were to move to Ohio and live on his father's farm, so Ben packed our furniture and everything & sent it out to Ohio. We could not go yet as Viola was not old enough to go that far, so while we waited for her to be old enough to travel, Ben's father passed away and that changed the plans. Ben went to the funeral and while out there he shipped the furniture back here and we moved on the place west of Fertile that was then owned by Sondergaard and later Leo Elthon owned it. Ben worked by the day for Johnny Ouverson's Dad and other places.

Then in the spring of 1915 we moved south of Fertile on the Prestholt place north of Ted Back's old farm that was then where Ouver Ouverson lived and Amos Ouverson was a baby. Ben tiled most of the time we lived there, Joe lived with us and worked with Ben.

In the spring of 1916 we moved to the Overgard farm NW of Ventura. Ben used the money he got from his share of his Father's estate and bought some horses and a few things so we could farm & we had a big crop of



sugar beets. We lived there 2 years and that is where our little girl, Verna, was born on March 15, 1916 & that year was the last time we saw Joe as he went to Canada.

Then in the spring of 1918 we moved to the Stone farm south of Ventura and that is where our little girl, Iva, was born on May 26, 1918. We farmed there two years, we had a sale and moved to Wisconsin in October 1920, lived in the old log house and in April 6, 1921, our boy, Glenis, was born (but not in that log house) but in Bayfield at my folks house, as they had moved to Wisconsin the same time we did. My father died in May 1921.

Ben drove school bus while we lived in Wisconsin and he and the boys cut wood. We raised strawberries, string beans, potatoes, vegetables besides the apples. Ben went to N. Dakota three different years to work at thrashing, Alvin drove school bus and Verle went with him for one year. Well, we lived in Wisc. eight years.

Our little boy, Amos, was born in the old log house April 22, 1924 and our little boy, Orland, was born in the old log house Feb. 10, 1927. In June 1928 we packed our stuff (or at least the best of it) and moved back to Fertile, shipped part and brought part back in the old school bus Ben had made on the truck (it has a little stove in it for the school use.) Well, Ben used the school bus to haul children here for Fertile school for a while and he worked at anything he could get to do. We moved in with my mother and stayed there until March 1, 1929. (Mother went to Washington to visit her sister) We moved on this place (the one where she was writing this history) March 1929. Ben worked at anything he could get to do, then he started carpentering and working for the Lumber Yard.

## The story is now written by someone in the Miller family to bring it up to date.

Ben and Ellen purchased the house East and South of the old Church of Christ and lived there until Ellen entered the Good Samaritan home in Forest City. Tracy and Tammy Hall bought the home and completely remodeled it.

Ben was very active in the Church of Christ and even became ordained. He traveled many Sundays to preach in Clarksville. Ben continued to work out of the Fertile Lumber Co. building many chicken and hog houses for farmers in the area.

Ellen continued making a home for their nine children and was known to make the best applesauce cake and homemade bread.

Ben passed away in August, 1962 and Ellen continued to live in Fertile until she moved to the Good Samaritan Home where she passed away in October 1984

Ben and Ellen had nine children and twenty-seven grandchildren. Of the nine children, two are still living. Viola Roberts will be 103 and still lives in her own home in Fertile and Orland who is 90 lives in his own home in Hot Springs, SD.

This article was written by Ellen and I tried to write it exactly as she did so that you can almost hear her telling the story.

We are the last to remember ration books for everything from gas to sugar to shoes to stoves.

We saved tin foil and poured fat into tin cans.

We saw cars up on blocks because tires weren't available.

Newspapers and magazines were written for adults and the news was broadcast on our table radio in the evening by Gabriel Theater.

We are the last group who had to find out for ourselves.

As we grew up, the country was exploding with growth.

The G.I. Bill gave returning veterans the means to get an education and spurred colleges to grow.

VA loans fanned a housing boom.

Pent up demand coupled with new installment payment plans put factories to work.

New highways would bring jobs and mobility.

The veterans joined civic clubs and became active in politics.

The radio network expanded from 3 stations to thousands of stations.

Our parents were suddenly free from the confines of the depression and the war, and they threw themselves into exploring opportunities they had never imagined.




