# PHILLIP RAYMOND SHEIMO

Philip Raymond Sheimo was born November 13, 1899 at the Sheimo homestead 1 mile west of Fertile. He was the youngest of 11 children and was the son of Kittle O. and Marie (Ouverson) Sheimo.

He was baptized and confirmed at Fertile Lutheran Church, served on the Cemetery Board and other committees. Phil was a lifelong member.

While attending school in Fertile he was the captain of the basketball team and at 6'1" played center position. In 1921 was a graduate of Iowa School of Auctioneering located in Logan, Iowa. Because of his gift in sales it was said he could sell razor blades to Santa Claus.

The year 1926 Phil introduced Coca Cola as a new product in 8 counties in and around Marshall in southwestern Minnesota.

In 1936 Phil with his brother, Andrew, opened the Webster County Implement Company (Oliver) in Fort Dodge, Iowa. Again Phil was in sales and Andrew the business manager. That same year he was married to Naoma who preceded him in death in 1978. They were the parents of one daughter, Paula.

He returned to his beloved hometown, Fertile, to farm, raise livestock and cry auctions. Phil also served as mayor of Fertile for several years. Was voted the best dressed gentleman at the Fertile Centennial in 1956 and was again able to wear the same outfit 25 years later at the Quasquicentnnial in 1981.

An 85<sup>th</sup> birthday party was held at his home hosted by his family. He felt very honored that so many attended because he always enjoyed visiting with everyone.

On June 28, 1990 Phil was taken home. He is still admired and missed by his family.

# The following was taken from "More About Fertile" 1976

My father Kittle O. Sheimo, at the age of 20, came from Norway to New York and then on to Madison, Wisconsin. Then he came to Iowa to work for Knut Brattrud a few years. He married Marie Ouverson whom he had met in Daleyville, Wisconsin.

They moved to the area of the location of what is Hanlontown. Three years later my father bought the Sheimo homestead – west of Fertile- the house of one of his grandsons now.

Our family lived in a log house until 1891 when the present house was built.

There were eleven children (as Paula mentioned), first child born in 1877 and the youngest child in 1899. We attended the Knutson rural school. Tracking rabbits or playing fox and geese or snow ball battles were the usual recess games in fall and winter. In spring trapping gophers or drowning out gophers kept us busy. Occasionally some wrestling and fighting took place. Later after 8<sup>th</sup> grade I attended school at Fertile

Going back to 1912, the first dime I made was planting potatoes for Abraham Halsor. Wages were 10 cents an hour for planting and later in the year for picking up potatoes. On Saturdays or after school I split wood for neighbors.

About 1916-1917 I helped John and Gunder Hegney make cement tile --- this enterprise was going on about where Lester Burtness's have the patio of their home. At other times I helped with threshing, hauling water for the steam engine or working on farms by the month.

I recall when No. 9, a state highway, was built through the town of Fertile in the spring of 1923. Horse and mules with dump wagons were used to move the dirt, The road crew was camped west of Fertile near where the cemetery is now.

From 1925 into the thirties I worked with bottled Coco Cola business, Marshall Minnesota. Then I sold milking machines in the Fort Dodge area and later Oliver machinery.

In the late 1930's I came back to Fertile and farming. I had begun auctioneering in 1920 and still sell and occasional sale.

There may come a time in your life when you find yourself cooking for one after cooking for a family all your days. It is not an easy thing to suddenly do and takes some thinking.

When making a casserole divide and put in small baking dishes, bake and freeze or you can freeze, then bake..

When baking a cake us 2 -8 inch pans instead of a 9 x 13 pan. Give half away or freeze it. Perhaps you have a neighbor or a close friend that would enjoy the one cake.

Buy ground beef in the 10# rolls (or any amount of pounds you desire. Divide it up according to the amount you want in a package and freeze. Mix up your meatloaf recipe and divide it into small bread pans or casserole pans, freeze. Male hamburger patties with onion etc., put single patty in a small plastic bag and put several into a larger bag, freeze.. You can use one at a time. Mix up poor man's steak and do this, also.

I can my green beans in half pint jars as that is all I want at one time, or can have!

Homemade soup can be frozen in 1 cup containers which is just enough for a meal.

#### **Healthy Fried Rice for one**

#### 1 large egg

1/2 cup cooked brown rice (or white rice if that's what you have -- brown has more fiber and more flavor)1/4 cup frozen peas1 TBSP Tap Water

Break the egg into a bowl and mix it well.

Add the water to help make the egg fluffy if you would like. Take the 1/2 cup brown rice and mix it into the egg. Add any extra seasonings as you like to the mixture (I often do Pepper, Red Pepper Flakes, or a shake of hot sauce -- but you can use whatever you like)

Heat a frying pan that's been sprayed with nonstick spray Meanwhile, defrost the peas for 30 sec in the microwave. stir fry the egg-rice mixture and once it's about half cooked add the defrosted peas.

The fried rice is done when the egg is cooked and the peas hot.

#### Barbecued Muffin Pan Meat Loaf 1 # ground beef 1/8 t. nutmeg 3/4 c. rice krispes 1 T. minced onion 3 T. Brown sugar 1 t. salt ½ t. pepper ¼ c. catsup 1 t. dry mustard

1 egg

Combine ground beef, egg, cereal, salt, pepper, & onions and mix well. Mix together brown sugar, catsup, nutmeg and mustard. Add ½ of the mixture to the meat. Add just a little milk if mixture is too dry. Shape meat into muffin pans. Top meat with remaining barbecue sauce. Can put in a small pan, also.

#### THOUGHTS OF FARMER RON

I was reading an article about growing specialty crops in the June 15, 2016 issue of the Iowa Farm Bureau Spokesman. Since I have been doing this all my life, there are a few things that need to be added to explain the difference between specialty vegetables and row crops (corn and soybeans.) With row crow, production is the key. It doesn't matter what kind of marketing plan we have if we don't have bushels. In specially vegetables, it ranks fourth.

No. one is food safety. We are producing a product that is consumed, either raw or processed, by the public. Some buyers demand a Food Safety Plan. The Federal Government may say we are exempt because of small size. However, if the buyer wants a plan, that trumps the Feds and you need a plan. No plan, so sale.

No. 2 is a market. Having the market comes before planning. You are also competing with other established growers. It took us years to get into the markets we are in. You can have a field of the very best produce and it could rot in the field for

lack of a market buyer. We have sold onions below cost of production because the only two choices were to do that or dump them. There is no Government Price Protection either. Number three is labor. Specialty vegetables are very labor intensive for most, If not all, year. Planning isn't too bad, but then comes the growing, harvesting, and labor to get the product ready for sale. When you count insects, disease, and weeds, we will drive the same rows of onions anywhere from ten to fifteen times per season. Each time we use at least fifty gallons of water per acre. The end of July and early August when the tops are big and if it is bad blight weather, we may go up to 150 gallons per acre to get coverage. We still hand weed the escapes. I.P.M (Integrated pest management) is a never ending job because things can change fast.

As you can see, relatively speaking, row crops are easy to grow and have a low risk. Still want to do it?

Until next time, thank a farmer for the food on your plate, thank a vet for the freedoms we enjoy, and above all, thank God for your daily blessings.
