COOK'S CORNER

FROSTED PUMPKIN SOFTY COOKIES

1 cup margarine (I used half butter/half Margarine)

3/4 cup sugar

1 egg

1 3/4 cups of whole purpose flour

1/4 teaspoon salt

2 1/2 cups "quick" rolled oats

3/4 cup packed brown sugar

1 can of pumpkin, 15 oz. size

- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1 teaspoon baking powder

1 teaspoon pumpkin pie spice (or cinnamon)

Heat oven to 350 degrees. Beat butter and sugars until creamy. Add pumpkin, egg, and vanilla. Beat well.

Gradually add the dry ingredients. Mix well. Stir in the oatmeal. Drop by tablespoonful/or use a small cookie scoop. Bake 11 to 13 minutes or until golden brown. **Cool** one minute on cookie sheet and then move to a wire rack to cool.

Icing

3 oz. of softened cream cheese

1/2 teaspoon of vanilla

2 T. milk

2 1/2 cups of powdered sugar.

Mix well and lightly frost each cookie. Store in refrigerator, tightly covered. Makes approx. 4 dozen
