Taco Bell's April 1, 1996, prank caught the nation, and the National Park Service, off guard. It began the morning with full-page ads running in six of the country's largest newspapers, including the *New York Times, Washington Post* and *Philadelphia Inquirer*. The ad claimed Taco Bell was buying the historic icon in "an effort to help the national debt," and urged other corporations to purchase national treasures.

A news release issued by Taco Bell showed its chief executive officer with an actor portraying Benjamin Franklin in front of a Liberty Bell replica. The release said the bell would continue to be available to the public, but it would spend half of its time in Philadelphia and the other half at company headquarters in Irvine, Calif.

The phones started to ring at the National Park Service and at Taco Bell headquarters. Among the concerned callers were aides to two U.S. senators. In Philadelphia, the Park Service hastily called a news conference to declare that the bell had not been sold. "The Libery Bell is safe. It's not for sale," a spokeswoman said.

By noon, Taco Bell issued another news release admitting the prank and pledging \$50,000 for the Liberty Bell's upkeep.

At the White House, spokesman Mike McCurry got into the spirit of the hoax, telling reporters that Ford Motor Co. was purchasing the Lincoln Memorial, which would be renamed the Lincoln Mercury Memorial.

#### City Council Meeting Minutes March19, 2013 - 7:00 PM, City Hall

#### Call to Order & Roll Call

Present were: Mayor Joyce Russell; Council Members: Jeff Berg, Julie Jessen, Penny Miller and Pat Renchin; City Clerk, Cindy Peters & Maintenance Manager Steve Roberts. Absent was Council Member Tad Miller.

- Agendas are posted at City Hall, at the Library, and at the Post Office, 24 hours in advance of each Council Meeting. If you wish to be on the Agenda, please contact City Hall two days before the meeting.

#### **Resident Sidewalk Issue**

• An unsigned letter was placed in the drop-box at the maintenance building regarding a non-shoveled sidewalk. The resident complained that a sidewalk located at 104 N. 4<sup>th</sup> street was not cleared of snow and as a result the resident fell. The letter stated that this anonymous person may pursue further action if the city does not remedy the situation. Mayor, Joyce contacted an attorney and was advised that the city has no liability, and that the resident would have to take it up with the owner of the sidewalk. In addition, the city does not require residents to have sidewalks at all.

#### **Resident Water Bill**

Sara Innes was present at the meeting and asked for a variance for the property she just purchased at 306 West Main Street. Sara stated that she will be demolishing the house, just as soon as the weather permits and will turn the lot into a green space. No water or service will be required and she asked that the \$150 deposit and minimum service charge be waived. After discussion by the mayor and the council, Penny motioned and Julie 2<sup>nd</sup> that the deposit and monthly water bill would be waived until such time that a new building or house would ever be constructed and services would be reinstated.

#### Library Project

 The council and mayor reported that two of the three meetings were well attended, but that the third meeting had to be cancelled due to inclement. weather. A total of 73 questionnaires were returned, with 14 requesting that the library be built next to the community center and 59 requesting that the library be built on Main Street. Julie asked that further cost investigations be made as many of the questionnaires were concerned about the cost that the present designs would incur. Julie also presented information and pictures of the library located in Staceyville that had been built in 2004 and seemed to include most of the requirements that the library board desired. Julie and the mayor had both visited with the Staceyville librarian and were very impressed with the structure as well as the layout. The library board members present were given the pictures and the floor plan to look over. Two Fertile residents advised the mayor, prior to the meeting, that they had measured the lot and had determined that it would be feasible for the new building to be constructed alongside the old library, allowing the library to be open throughout construction. Jeff motioned that that the library be built on main street. Pat 2<sup>nd</sup> and a roll call vote was taken: Penny-Yes, Jeff-Yes, Pat-Yes, Julie-Yes. Unanimous.

#### **City Maintenance Report**

• Steve reported that both trucks were detailed in-between snow and ice storms, even though it might not be apparent today. The sand vibrator on the snow plow stopped working and Steve just got another load of sand that he hopes will be the last load of the year. Steve stated that at one of the classes he took, a company that designs lift stations commended the gate design Steve implemented to prevent foreign

objects getting into the sewer. The alternate solution would be to construct pits that would be 15-20 ft deep. This would be cost prohibitive to retrofit and that the gates will provide the most cost effective solution for now.

#### · Pat motioned, Julie 2nd to approve report. Unanimous.

#### Mayor's Report

- Feb. 20<sup>th</sup>, Joyce met with ICAP (city insurance) to go over the policy. Everything checked out ok.
- A resident called in to report that a pit bull had been sighted at the Gildner Apartment s. Joyce spoke with the owner of the property and he assured Joyce that pit bulls are not allowed at any of his apartments. Another resident reported that they had seen a pit bull running at large on the East end of town. There was a complaint earlier regarding the same animal and the mayor had called the Worth County Sheriff to investigate. Joyce believed the dog was no longer in town. Joyce will call the sheriff's office to determine if this is another dog or the same animal. If it is found that the pit bull is still residing on the east end of town, the mayor will send the letter to the owner regarding the city's ordinance in reference to pit bulls. Residents state that the dog is able to leave his kennel by jumping on to it's dog house.
- Mar. 7<sup>th</sup> the Mayor and new city clerk, Cindy Peters signed new signature cards at the bank, and past city clerk Eddie May's signature was eliminated. The credit card has also been transferred to Cindy and Eddie's name has been eliminated from the account. Once again, the city appreciates all the work Eddie did to bring the city up to date and in accordance to city, county and state regulations. The mayor introduced Cindy to all of the county offices and the sheriff's department in Northwood.
- The new ICAP policy has given the city a voucher of \$477.82 to deduct from the annual policy amount of \$12,410.31. Joyce signed all of the paperwork for our insurance and we are up-to-date for the year.
- A big thank you was given to council member Julie Jessen and to Dave Bang for taking over the Little League duties. This will enable our Little League to continue and thrive as it has in the past. Julie will be responsible for the financials and for the concession stand. Dave will be responsible for the operation of the League games. The deadline for registration is March 26<sup>th</sup> and you can contact Dave Bang with any questions at 797-2217 or Julie Jessen at 797-2629.
- Once again, Fertile will be doing a Spring Clean-up. Complete Appliance will also be available to pick up appliances, computer monitors, and tv's. Appliance pickup will be free, computer monitors are \$15, TV screens 20-27" are \$20, screens 28" or larger are \$25. The date of the Spring clean-up has yet to be determined.
- A benefit for Jay Langenbau was held in the community center last Saturday and was very well attended. Signatures Restaurant was in charge of the food and the Northwood Jaycees served it. A bake sale, silent auction, and local home business vendors all helped to make the event a huge success. A big thank you goes to Nicole Knudson and Jennifer Leerar for all of their hard work and effort to help the Langenbau family.
- The residents at 110 East Main Street have asked that their water be shut-off to winterize the home. Unfortunately, the curb stop is broken and the owners have been informed that they must repair it before the water can be shut off.
- A prior lien for the water bill at 101 School Street, will need to be revised as the resident paid a partial payment and the lien amount will

need to reflect that change. The lien will be revised and submitted for payment.

#### CHEESEBURGER SOUP

¾ cup shredded carrots 1 ½ LB, hamburger 4 T. butter, divided 1 tsp. basil (opt), 1 ½ cup milk 4 cups diced potatoes, ¾ cup chopped onions ¾ tsp. salt ¾ cup chopped celery 1 tsp. dried parsley flakes ¼ cup flour 3 cups chicken broth 1/2 tsp. pepper 8 oz. Velveeta cheese cubed Brown beef; drain and set aside. Sauté onion, carrots , celery, basil & parley in 1 T. butter until vegetables are tender; about 10 min. Add broth, otatoes & beef; bring to a boil. Reduce heat; cover and simmer until potatoes are tender. Meanwhile; melt rest of butter, add flour. Cook 3 min. Add to soup; bring to boil. Cook 2 min. add cheese, milk, salt and pepper. Cook on low until cheese melts.

Rhubarb grows just about anywhere. Did you know that rhubarb is a vegetable? For fact, it is. So why do we put it in our desserts?

Did you also know that the leaves are poisonous and IF the stalk gets touched by frost it is not to be eaten as it turns poisonous?

#### RHUBARB CUSTARD PIE

Pastry for 2 crust pie 4 cups rhubarb 1⁄4 cup flour 3 eggs (slightly beaten) 1 T. butter



2 cups sugar ¾ tsp. nutmeg 3 T. milk

Mix flour, sugar & nutmeg together, add eggs with milk and mix thoroughly. Add rhubarb. Fill pie crust with filling, dot with butter, cover with top crust. Bake at 400 oven 50-60 minutes

**VARIATIONS of PIE**: 1 or 1/12 cup sugar instead of 2 cups, and use 3 cups of rhubarb instead of 4.

Don't forget you can freeze rhubarb and it is great in freezer jam with strawberries, blueberries or cherries. So easy to make.
