City of Fertile

City Council Meeting Minutes May 30, 2013 - 7:00 PM, City Hall

Call to Order & Roll Call

Present were: Mayor Joyce Russell; Council Members: Jeff Berg, Julie Jessen, Penny Miller, Tad Miller and Pat Renchin; City Clerk, Cindy Peters & Maintenance Manager Steve Roberts.

- Penny motioned, Jeff 2nd to approve the April minutes. Unanimous
- · Jeff motioned, Julie 2nd to accept agenda. Unanimous.
- Agendas are posted at City Hall, at the Library, and at the Post Office, 24 hours in advance of each Council Meeting. If you wish to be on the Agenda, please contact City Hall two days before the meeting.

City Maintenance Report

- Steve reported that most of his time has been trying to keep up with mowing due to all of the rain.
- The tile in the alley between 2nd & 3rd St. was repaired. A big root ball had damaged the tile and caused constant flooding in that area. Steve will clean up the alley just as soon as it becomes dry enough to do so.
- The city purchased a Stihl Echo industrial weed wacker for maintaining the park, riverbanks and lagoon area. This will cut down enormously on man hours.
- A manhole ring in the alley between 1st St. & State St., was moved away from the cone and a hole was allowing water to empty into the sewer. Steve moved the manhole ring over the cone, back to the proper location and repaired the hole.
- Clapper Tree Service cut down tree limbs, and or fallen branches and disposed of them, after the big May snowstorm.
- Steve is attempting to draw down the lagoon, but due to the constant rains, had to call the DNR and appraise them of the situation. The DNR is well aware of this problem and has given us additional time to complete the draw down. We are to just keep them informed of the situation. Steve set up the big pump near PIM to allow the pumping station to catch up with the water intake during all of the rainstorms.
- · Pat motioned, Tad 2nd to approve report. Unanimous.

Library Project Update

- Joyce handed out the latest drawing that Jose' Rivas of CRW had emailed and discussed with her. The library committee in attendance asked if Jose' could possibly increase the size of the opening between the old library and the new addition. Joyce asked that the library committee look over the drawing and submit any changes to her and she would forward that onto CRW. Joyce reiterated that once we accepted the contract no more changes would be allowed without major expense. Joyce also advised the library committee that CRW would need to have \$29,400 to begin the process of procuring construction bids, etc. Joyce gave the committee an itemized report explaining the timeline for the billing from CRW. CRW would not bill us for the final \$6,000 portion of the total of \$35,400, on the contingency that we receive a grant. In order to obtain grants, finalized bids must be available to attach to the grants before submission. Joyce also wanted to remind the committee that there is no guarantee that the City of Fertile would receive any grants, and that once CRW undertakes the project, we would still be responsible for their portion of the design work, whether we received a grant ornot.
- Nancy advised the council that Elin Miner would be the representative and spokesperson for the library construction committee once it has been established. The library would also need to raise funds for sidewalks and the parking lot. According to CRW, the library will only need to close it's doors for approximately 4 weeks. Construction on the new addition will be first and

the library can remain open in the older section. Then once the new addition is completed, the library can move into the new addition and work will continue on the old portion of the library.

Corner of Main and 1street repair

- Jeff stated his concern regarding the deterioration of the street at the corner of Main and 1street due to the heavy quarry truck traffic. The Mayor stated that the last estimate she received would cost the city approximately \$30,000 to repair that corner of the intersection. The County will not fund the repair as the city receives Road Use Tax funding from Worth county for this road. Joyce stated that Worth County will be repairing other roads this summer, and she will ask for an estimate from the contractor they have hired. Joyce stated that she would also request quotes from other paving companies for the repair work.
- Joyce attended the Worth County Supervisors meeting to ask them to clarify
 exactly what amount of funding would be dispensed to the City of Fertile.
 The DOT has revised earlier correspondence regarding lowered funding
 amounts and it was determined that Worth County is exempt from the new
 ruling,

Move Council meetings to the first Tuesday of the month

• Jeff asked the council to consider moving future meetings to the first Tuesday of each month. The council discussed this option and the Mayor stated that one of the reasons the meetings are held on the 3rd Tuesday of the month is to allow the clerk to collect information and generate reports that the Council must approve. Utility billing, taxes, and payroll are also done on the first week of the month, which would also conflict with the many reports that need to be generated for the council meeting. It was determined by the council to drop the request for a change in the date for future council meetings.

Request by the city clerk to change Steve and her payroll period to a biweekly time frame.

- Currently, the clerk and the maintenance person are paid on the 1st and 3rd.
 Wednesday of each month. The council discussed the idea and a motion was made by Julie to change the payroll period from the 1st and 3rd.
 Wednesday of the month to a bi-weekly time period, which would be paid every other Wednesday of the month.
- Julie moved, Pat 2^{nl} to change the city clerk and the maintenance person's
 payroll period from the Ist and 3rd Wed of each month to a bi-weekly time
 frame. A roll call vote was taken, passed Unanimously.

Mayor's Report

- The yellow waste management garbage bags will no longer be sold or can no longer be used by the residents of Fertile. The 96 gal garbage containers are the only option that is available for garbage pickup, due to the use of automated trucks.
- A homeowner called to ask why they were being billed for a house that was unoccupied, and the Mayor informed the owner that there is an ordinance on file, stating that vacant houses are to be billed a minimum charge for utility services
- May 2, a major snowstorm dumped an accumulated total of over 15 in of snow and the Forest City Summit interviewed the mayor for information on the damage to the trees in Fertile and for information about the potential for river flooding.
- The library had a successful tumout for their "Fiesta Fundraiser".
- A house on West Main Street that suffered a house fire, was torn down by Brian Nettleton at the request of the new owner.
- The Mayor stated that an opportunity to apply for a grant from "Vision lowa" is available for libraries in small towns. Tad mentioned that his wife is familiar with grant writing so Joyce forwarded the information over to Tad.
- On July 23rd a sheriff's sale will be held regarding the property at 110 East Main Street.

City Council Meeting Minutes June 18, 2013 - 7:00 p.m.

Call to order and Roll Call

- Jeff motioned, Julie 2nd to approve the May minutes. Unanimous
- Jeff motioned, Pat 2nd to accept agenda. Unanimous

Library Project Update

 A revised floor plan was presented to the library board and the council. There was discussion on some changes. Joyce called Jose to discuss the changes as follows: moving the bathrooms to the west wall in the new addition, removing the kitchenette and putting a regular sink, microwave, refrigerator in the work room, drinking fountain in the new addition just inside the door, putting in a fire proof book drop box in the east corner of the store room with a book drop slot outside the building, electrical outlets and a water spout on the outside of the building and taking out the north wall and putting in beams for support to make visibility for the Librarian better. Removal of the north wall and beams will raise the cost of the project about 4 to 5,000.00 more. Jose will send a new floor plan tomorrow for the library and council to approve.

City Maintenance Report

- Steve spent time cleaning the park after the water resided.
- The little league had Steve pick up a refrigerator from Forest City and after getting to the concession stand found out it didn't work.
- Steve has started the spring draw down. We have been given an extension from the DNR due to the excessive amount of rain.
- The drain down near the lagoon wasn't flowing well so Steve called a jetting service to blow it out. They pulled out around 40 to 50 snapping turtles that were caught down in the drain. Steve and Buck made a screen to catch the wild life from going into the drain.
- Steve finished the landscape on the east side of the community center and trimmed the pine tree next to the Fertile sign.
- Steve will be flushing the fire hydrants this summer.
- Steve collected two bids for fixing 1st and Main street. Complete Concrete - \$14,793.00 and Charlson Excavating Company - \$26,125.00. Julie motioned, Pat 2nd to hire Complete Concrete. Unanimous
 - The street will be closed while the road is being replaced. BMC will be notified to reroute their trucks during this
- Pat motioned, Jeff 2nd to accept the maintenance report. Unanimous

Mayor's report

- The tornado warning siren will be set off for 10 minutes when the Emergency Management declares a storm/tornado watch to a warning. Fertile is listed in the path way of the storms. The siren is to let you know to take cover, watch the weather channel and be ready.
- 6-4-13, Joyce took the liens to the court house that was approved by the council last meeting.
- 6-7-13 Joyce hand delivered two letters and ordinances to residents for nuisance and vehicles before the city wide clean up.
- Thank you to Pat Renchin, Jeff Berg, Cindy Peters, Buck and Joyce Russell, Steve Roberts and Ray Sandifer for helping at our city wide cleanup day. Both dumpsters were filled and 31 tickets were turned in. CAD was nearly full with his trailer as well. Thanks!
- Darwin Stecker has hired Brian Nettleton to fix the tile between Lake street and Main.
- Cindy Peters was hospitalized this last week. The council asked Advantage Business Solutions to fill in the accounting portion while Cindy is recovering. Mayor Joyce Russell was diagnosed with shingles, also.
- Nomination papers were handed out to the following people who are up for re-election: Mayor Joyce Russell - 2 year position Council member - Tad Miller - 4 year position Council member – Pat Renchin – 4 year position Council member – Penny Miller – 4 year position Anyone who would like to run for office can pick up the papers at City Hall. Deadline is September 19th at 5:00 p.m.
- City received a refund check for \$722.48 from ICAP Insurance. We are a 5 year vested member and had no claims this last year.
- Pat motioned, Jeff 2nd to hire Brian Nettleton to repair the curb stops at 101 East Main and 501 West Washington. Both residents will be billed. Unanimous
- Fire department had training in the Fertile park on June 17th for jaws of life tools. Hanlontown, Joice, Fertile, and Forest City fire departments and Forest City Ambulance participated.
- McGuire Water Tower painting will begin painting our water tower after the 4th of July.
- Julie motioned, Pat 2nd to accept the mayor's report. Unanimous.


