City Council Meeting Minutes December 18, 2012 - 7:00 PM, City Hall

Call to Order & Roll Call

- Present were: Mayor Joyce Russell; Council Members: Jeff Berg, Julie Jessen, Penny Miller, Tad Miller, Pat Renchin; City Clerk Eddie May; Deputy Clerk Nicole Hare & Maintenance Manager Steve Roberts.
- · Penny motioned, Pat 2nd to approve the Nov. minutes. Unanimous.
- · Jeff motioned, Penny 2nd to add Budget as a discussion option and approve agenda. Unanimous.
- Agendas are posted at City Hall, at the Library, and at the Post Office, 24 hours in advance of each Council Meeting. If you wish to be on the Agenda, please contact City Hall two days before the meeting.

Library Project

- Mayor Russell abstained from this discussion to avoid the appearance of conflict of interest pertaining to potential WCDA funding.
- The Library Board presented updated floor plans for 2 project options as well as estimated construction and operating costs comparisons. They also presented talking points regarding pros and cons of both options. The Council approved one option and requested that the Library Board reduce the size of the second option by 30-40%. The Council offered some suggestions on how and where to do that. The Library Board agreed that those cuts could be feasible and would present a new floor plan for option 2 at the next meeting.
- The Library Board will also prepare an informational packet and survey to present the two options to the public for their input. Jeff will help the Library draft the survey before submitting to the Council for their approval.

Spring WCDA Grant Request Options

- Mayor Russell abstained from this discussion to avoid the appearance of conflict of interest pertaining to potential WCDA funding.
- Steve presented a proposal to apply for a grant to paint the water tower. It has been over 20 years since the City has painted the tower and it is starting to rust out. The City obtained two separate bids. The low bid was \$80,000.00
- Eddie presented a proposal to apply for a grant to construct a bike path Budget from the new Community Center to the Rhodes Island Park. The proposed path would abut up to the west side of 1st Street effectively increasing the size of the shoulder. The project would not affect water run-off or mowing capabilities for residents. The path would be separated from the road with a rumble strip and yellow paint. Signage would alert drivers of the right-away for pedestrians, bikers and golfcarts. Eddie had secured one bid from Heartland Asphalt and is waiting on two others, therefore the bid price will not be posted yet.
- Eddie presented a proposal to pave Main Street from State Street to 3rd Street. Eddie had secured one bid from Heartland Asphalt and is waiting on two others, therefore the bid price will not be posted yet.
- Jeff motioned, Penny 2nd to approve application for the low bid for painting the water tower and the Heartland Asphalt bid for paving Main Street from State Street to 3rd Street (unless Heartland does not end up being the low bid—in that case a special meeting will be called). Roll call vote was unanimous. The bike path will be considered for a future or alternative grant.

City Maintenance Report

- Steve has been babysitting the controls at the sewer lift station as they have needed to be manually restarted. Parts are ordered to fix the issue
- The mower has been cleaned up with new blades and an oil change.
- The snow plow is back with 4 new tires, a new radiator and welding.

- IA Rural Water Association helped fill out our Sewer permit. This permit is required to be updated every 4 years.
- Lagoon draw-down was successful, everything closed up tight.
- Steve and Warren sprayed the thistles and re-seeded to help run-off.
- Steve did some repairs at the Library.
- Steve did some landscaping at the new Community Center.
- Pat motioned, Tad 2nd to approve report. Unanimous.

Mayor's Report

- Snow removal ordinance posted at City Hall, Library & Post Office. Please be considerate of the space needed to plow snow, keep all roads, alley ways and right-of-ways clear.
- Insurance companies have been calling requesting new FEMA flood plain maps. If you are currently required to purchase flood insurance, you may want to look at the new maps to see if you can discontinue.
- Repairs were done on the Emergency Management repeaters on the water tower.
- Eddie and Joyce obtained a quote from Simmering-Cory for updating the City Ordinances. The Council requested a second quote.
- Alliant Energy fixed a street light on West Main & N Hill Street.
- Larsen's fixed a water leak in the beverage room in the Community
- Tad motioned, Julie 2nd to approve report. Unanimous.

City Council Meeting Minutes January 15, 2013 - 7:00 PM, City Hall

Call to Order & Roll Call

- Present were: Mayor Joyce Russell; Council Members: Jeff Berg, Julie Jessen, Penny Miller, Pat Renchin; City Clerk Eddie May & Maintenance Manager Steve Roberts. Absent was Council Member Tad Miller.
- Pat motioned, Penny 2nd to approve the Dec. minutes. Unanimous.
- Penny motioned, Julie 2nd to add Vicious Dog Ordinance as a discussion option and approve agenda. Unanimous.
- Agendas are posted at City Hall, at the Library, and at the Post Office, 24 hours in advance of each Council Meeting. If you wish to be on the Agenda, please contact City Hall two days before the meeting.

Library Project

- The Library Board presented updated floor plans for 2 project options as well as estimated construction and operating costs comparisons after shrinking option 2 by 18% from the last plan submitted. They also presented a letter to the residents including reasons for a new library, talking points regarding pros and cons of both options and cost comparisons. Pat motioned, Jeff 2nd to approve the tentative floor plans for option 1 and the letter to the residents. Roll Call Vote: Unanimous.
- The 2 options will now be presented to the Architect for final review and confirmation of cost comparisons. As long as the architect confirms the floor plans and cost comparisons, the letter and floor plans will be mailed to every resident of Fertile and Fertile Township. Representatives of the City Council and Library Board will go door-to-door to solicit public opinion regarding both options. Once opinions have been collected and organized, a public hearing will be scheduled to announce the results and fully explain the option choosen by the public.

Budget

- Eddie presented budget worksheets to help the Council prepare the budget for July 2013 - June 2014. The Library Board, Fertile Days Committee, and Garden Club presented financial statements and budgets to the Council for approval. The City estimated budget amounts for the Fire Department and Little League as budgets had not been submitted. The Fire Department is working on their budget and the Little League is currently looking for new directors.
- Each department submitting a budget was approved for their full request with anticipated grant assistance from the City Clerk.
- Tax rates were not increased for next year. (This Fiscal Year, the City's portion of property taxes is lower than 4 of the 7 cities in Worth County, only 2 cities are lower than ours. The school portion of our property taxes raises our rate so that only 1 other city is higher than our overall tax rate. This last fall, the residents of Fertile had an opportunity to vote on removing a school tax from our property tax rates. The vote was overwhelming in favor of keeping the tax to support our children's education.)
- Next year's budget includes a 2% increase in garbage and recycling fees to cover a 3% increase in cost scheduled in our contract with Waste Management. Garbage would increase from \$11.95 to \$12.19 and recycling would increase from \$2.34 to \$2.39.
- A public hearing is scheduled for the next Council meeting on February 19th (7:00 pm at City Hall). The proposed budget will be published in the Northwood Anchor and posted at the Library, Post Office and City Hall. The public is encouraged to come to the meeting to voice their opinion.
- City Maintenance Report

- Steve cleaned out the second unit in the business incubator so it is ready for development. Businesses looking to start-up or expand are encouraged to apply for the program. Rent is on a sliding scale (1st year is 25% of fair market rent value, 2nd is 50%, 3nd is 75%, 4th and 5th is 100% of fair market rent value.)
- Steve took down the Christmas lights off the footbridge.
- Steve fixed the leaky coffee pots at the Community Center.
- Steve found a water leak caused by frozen pipes. Leak has been fixed.
- The transfer switch at the sewer plant has been fixed.
- Remaining doors from the Community Center renovations have been sold and removed from storage.
- Steve called about a surcharge proposed by Waste Management and our representative arranged to remove the surcharge keeping in line with our contract.
- Pat motioned, Julie 2nd to approve report. Unanimous.
 Mayor's Report
- Joyce and Eddie obtained quotes from Simmering-Cory and NIACOG for revising the City's Code of Ordinances. Iowa law requires Cities to revise their ordinances every 5 years. Julie motioned, Penny 2nd to approve the low bid presented by NIACOG. Unanimous,
- Joyce attended a retirement party for Worth County Auditor Kay Clark. The City wishes all the best for Kay and welcomes Jackie Backhaus as the new Auditor.
- Joyce and Warren filled out 2 DNR reports (Sewer, Tier 2) and (Water, Disinfection Monitoring Plain).
- Alliant will start converting our current street lamps to the new LED lamps starting in January. The new lights will save money and energy and will be brighter.
- The City received \$1,325 in rebates from Alliant for putting LED lights in the new Community Center.
- The City will be writing a grant to get new flashing stop light signs for the corner of 1st and Main.
- The City Council approved the mill and dam design for a bronze statue to be placed at the Worth County Fairgrounds. If fundraising is high enough, a second copy of the statue will be placed in Fertile.
- Interest in joining the Library Board was voiced to Joyce. Interested parties should contact the Librarian and/or Library Board who recommend membership to the Mayor who officially appoints the members and are approved by the Council. The Library Board consists of 5 members (2 from out of town and 3 from in town). There is currently 1 open seat on the Library Board. New members are welcomed.
- · Pat motioned, Jeff 2nd to approve report. Unanimous.

Any dog found wandering may be reported to the Sherriff's Department and/or collected and taken to an animal shelter. If threatened, residents have the right to wound or kill an animal on their property or in the public right-aways to protect themselves or their family.






