What is being done is not to cause hardship, tearing up of lawns, uprooting trees, etc., just for the sake of doing those things, but, because it is the only way to get accomplished, what we as a majority of the community have set out to do.

How much more pleasant a place to live, our community would be (and the world, too) if everyone would work together instead of causing as much turmoil and confusion as they can.

We appreciate those who are understanding and tolerant. We appreciate those who have legitimate complaints presenting them to us. We appreciate citizens coming to the council meetings to present their suggestions to us, rather than to everybody else. Fertile needs a population pulling in the same direction, not a few pulling in every direction.
