RECIPE OF THE MONTH

BEET PICKLES

Leave 1¹/₂" of tops on beets Scrub beets Cook in salted water until tender Reserve some water. Cool beets.

Peel beets and slice if necessary. Bring to a boil, 4 c. sugar

3 c. vinegar

2 c. water (beet water)

Add beets to syrup, bring to a boil. Place in glass jars, add syrup and seal
