RECIPE OF THE MONTH

RHUBARB PIE

*

3 cups fresh rhubarb (diced) l¹/₂ cups sugar 3T flour 1/8 tsp. salt 2 eggs beaten 1 T butter

Mix sugar, flour and salt. Stir in beaten eggs. Mix with raw diced rhubarb and let stand while crust is prepared. Make lattice top crust.

Bake 400° for 10 minutes, then reduce heat to 325° for 30 minutes.
