COUNCIL MEETING

The Fertile Town Council met April 7, with Mayor Worsley presiding and council members Lundgren, Faber, Van den Bosch and Hare present. Others present were Daryl Hansen, Byron Dodd, Roger Humphrey and Allen Berg.

Allen Berg presented a request for additional boots and new hose for the Fire Department. These will be purchased with their county revenue sharing runds. He will present a complete list at the next council meeting.

Discussion on water users and meters. Mr. Hansen of FmHA told the council how the water project budget was set up. Water costs will remain as they are now, at least until fall. A letter will be drawn up and mailed to everyone who signed up for water, asking them to hook up.

Jean Van den Bosch will be the council's representative to the Central Disposal Landfill at Lake Mills.

Discussion on the city's insurance rates and also insurance for the 125th celebration in August.

Discussion on a beer garden permit by Millie's Place during the 125th celebration. Motion made to allow the beer garden on restaurant property and not on Sunday. Carried.

Town Clean-Up Day will be May 2. Work in the park to be on April 18 and 25.

Discussion on junk cars. Owners will receive a copy of the ordinance.

Mayor Worsley reported the gas company expects to start work in Fertile by April 20.

Discussion on street re-surfacing. Motion to amend the budget at the next meeting. Carried.

Discussion on drop box for the sewer and water bills at the library.

Motion to pay monthly bills. Carried. Meeting adjourned.

GARDENING TIPS from Garden Club members: 1. Have your garden tilled twice, once in each direction, pays off in labor saving later.

2. Plant garden pea seeds in rows no more than 12 inches apart. The vines of each 2 rows will tangle and hold up to shade the soil and hold moisture to produce more peas.

3. Dig a trench 8" to 12" deep, set your gladiolas bulbs 6" or 8" apart. Cover with some soil. As the bulbs start to grow, keep pushing in more soil. This keeps the glads from falling over when it is windy.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH: VEGETABLE SALAD

3 oz. package orange gelatin 1 c creamy mayonnaise like salad drassing 1 c cottage cheese 1 c grated carrots 1 c chopped celery 1 small onion chopped

1/3 c chopped green pepper (optional)

Dissolve gelatin in 1 c boiling water. Add salad dressing (have it at room remperature). When cool, add cottage cheese and vegetables. Turn into rectangular baking dish or 4 cup mold. Chill until set.

To serve, cut into squares and serve on lettuce or invert mold onto serving platter, garnish with greens, olives or other vegetable decorations.

MARCH RECIPE OF THE MONTH: APPLE-CARROT CASSEROLE

5 large carrots (cook, slice) 5 large apples (peel, slice) 5 T sugar (can use less)) 2 T flour)Combine 1 t nutmeg) ½ c orange juice

3 T butter or margarine, melted

Layer carrots and apples. Sprinkle each layer with dry mixture. Pour juice and butter over all. Bake 40 minutes at 350⁰.

MARCH WAS NATIONAL NUTRITION MONTH

Curb the sweet tooth for better nutrition! U.S. Dietary Goals recommend that sugar consumption be reduced by 45% so that sugar accounts for only 10% of total energy intake.

Many people could achieve the recommended sugar reduction by totally eliminating soft drinks from their diet.

Suggestions to start on the way to using less sugar:

Simple desserts such as custards, cheese and crackers, or fresh fruit.

Drink fruit juices, ice tea, buttermilk or low fat milk.

Eat an orange rather than a candy bar. Use half the sugar or none at all on cereal.

Substitute nuts, popcorn, carrot sticks, peanut butter on crackers, specialty breads or milk for sweet snacks.

Make yeast breads, rolls, biscuits, muffins and quick breads instead of cookies, cake and pies if you like to bake.
