Minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

The committee to acquire the school distributed copies of the resolution from the school board. The committee reported they would like to see a change in the resolution and will let the council know of their decision.

Discussion on weeds and mowing. Motion was made to hire Richard Hanner to do mowing with tractor mower. Carried.

Motion to adopt a resolution to borrow on anticipated revenue to complete work on two main streets and the street by the car wash. Carried.

## GARDENING TIPS FROM FERTILE GARDEN CLUB MEMBERS

1. Soak ground deeply in gardens when you do water and then give no more for several days. One inch per week is usually sufficient. Watering with a soaker hose uses less water and puts it in the right place.

2. Mow lawns at a height of two inches during hot weather.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH - FRUIT SLUSH

- 2 6 oz. cans frozen orange-pineapple juice
- 1 can crushed pineapple in its own juice
- 1 pkg. frozen strawberries or raspberries
- 3 or more diced bananas, pears or peaches (fresh or frozen)
- 2½ c water

Mix all of these together and put in individual containers and freeze. Makes about 20 servings in plastic punch cups. Remove at least 30 minutes before serving.
