A 14 member citizens committee was appointed in July to study and make recommendations about the future of a Worth County Jail.

The committee has recommended to the Worth County Supervisors that a bond issue for a new County Jail be included in the November general election.

An information meeting for public questions and answers period is being held at the Fertile Community Center dining room, Thursday, September 2nd, 7:30 FM. This is one of seven meetings to be held in various locations in the county.

The County Supervisors will chair the meeting with members of the citizens committee present to help answer questions. Worth County Sheriff, Chuck Stoffregen, will be present and a film will be shown.

COUNCIL MEETING

The Fertile Town Council met August 3rd, with Mayor Shropshire presiding and all council members present. Others present were Harriet Ouverson, Viola Roberts, and Phil Stone.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Mr. Stone reported the procedure for selling GO bonds to repair the streets. Motion was made to sell \$25,000 worth of GO bonds to surface all streets. Bids to be opened September 7, 1982 at 2 PM. Carried.

Discussion on insurance. Town will accept the lowest price with \$500 deductible. Request received and approved to give \$100.00 of revenue sharing funds to Girls Softball.

Discussion on water bills. Meeting adjourned.

FERTILE COMMUNITY CENTER

We have had the Center for one year and feel that we have accomplished a lot. The Center is used by the Senior Citizens, the Booster Club, Tops Club, Fertile Lions, Girl Scouts, Boys 4H, Pre-School and Community Band. The gym is open on Saturdays in the winter for the children.

We held a Variety Show and a Christmas Program. Both were well attended.

It takes a lot of cooperation and working together by everyone to make a project like this work. The Boosters have had dinners to raise funds to contribute \$2,000.00 a year to the Center. We need more people to help serve and also more to attend the meals.

Bingo games were started in the spring and will begin again in September. A May Fair was held and \$1,200.00 were raised.

The Senior Citizens pay rent; a fund drive will be held each fall to raise the money needed to operate the building. Last winter's utility bills were \$8,870.34 including gas, water, sewer, electricity and telephone. We hope to cut the gas bill in half by installation of a new furnace, at an approximate cost of \$6,300 installed. This does not include heat for the gym.

Each of the groups using the building make a cash donation or pay rent.

We have received a total of \$4,500.00 from the Hanson and Winnebago Foundation for roof repair and the furnace.

The board feels that we have come through the first year in good shape and are looking forward to many more.

We are fortunate to have a building to use for all of our meetings. It is also for rent for family gatherings, special meetings, showers, etc. Anyone wishing to rent the facilities may do so by calling 797-2267 or 797-2440 for a reservation.

AUGUST RECIPE OF THE MONTH: SCALLOPED CABBAGE

1 head cabbage

Chop cabbage and cook in small amount of water until tender. Drain well. Put in a buttered casserole and cover with cheese sauce. Place buttered bread crumbs on top. Bake at 350° for 20 minutes.

2 T flour

2 T butter

2 c milk
