## CIUB BEGINS 1982 YEAR

Fertile Garden Club will begin the 1982 year of meetings with a pot luck luncheon, 12 noon, Tuesday, March 9, at the Fertile Library.

A few brief hints for gardeners during these winter days are:

1) Study seed catalogs, dream up a garden plan, write out seed and plant orders. Then when seeds arrive, sow down. Most seeds do best when sown not sooner than 6 weeks before the last frost date, usually ready for setting out about May 15. 2) Check stored bulbs for drying or rot problems. Discard any showing injury. 3) Plan for new trees and shrubs to improve the landscape. 4) Do not fertilize house plants in February.

RECIPE OF THE MONIH: FAVORITE VEGETABLE SALAD (economical)

- 1 3 oz. pkg. orange gelatin
- 1 c creamy mayonnaise like salad dressing
- 1 c cottage cheese

220

- 1 c grated carrots
- 1 c chopped celery
- 1 very small chopped onion

1/3 c chopped green pepper (optional)

Dissolve gelatin in 1 c boiling water. Add salad dressing (have it at room temperature). When cool, add cottage cheese and vegetables. Turn into rectangular baking dish or 4 c mold. Chill until set.
