COUNCIL MEETING

The Fertile City Council met August 9, with Mayor Shropshire presiding and council members Hare, VanDenBosch, Hall and Burtness present.

Others present were Charles Stock, Laurence Kroeze, Dick Sheimo, and Reva Nelson.

Minutes of previous meeting were read and approved.

Requests were received for reduction on water, sewer and garbage on vacant property. Council decided no reduction would be given.

Mr. Stock explained electrical franchise election. Mayor Shropshire read resolution to hold electrical franchise election. Motion to dispense with additional readings, seconded. Carried. Motion that electrical ordinance be No. 54, seconded and carried. Motion to adopt resolution that electrical franchise election to be Tuesday, September 20, from 12 noon - 8:00 PM. All in favor. Carried.

Report on water leak found in town and water problem caused by plugged tile on School Street. More will be done in this area.

Discussion on mower and weed problem along ditches and in park.

Discussion on street repairs. Two prices were received. Motion to have Bailey check with two contractors and then have repair work done by the cheaper. Carried.

Discussion on culverts in ditch east of town. Supervisors will be called to replace one culvert that is too small.

Several complaints received on barking dogs and dogs being allowed to run on other prople's property. Owners will be notified that their dogs are a public nuisance.

Council discussed overflow for sewer. Two contractors will be asked for prices. Also discussion on repairing leaks in manholes. City will hire someone to repair the leaks.
