MERRILL WOMACH CONCERT

Merrill Womach, vocalist, recording artist and inspirational communicator, will appear in concert on Sunday, April 24, 1983, at 2:30 PM at the Fertile Community Center in Fertile, Iowa.

Womach has been acclaimed for his four-octave voice which has excited audiences all across the United States and in dozens of foreign countries.

He has come back to not only fly his own airplane again, but also to sing again - with a new face, fashioned by more than 60 skin graft surgeries, and with a voice that critics say is better than before the accident.

During his concert he will share many of the incredible experiences relating to his remarkable recovery. A man of deep personal faith, Womach has encouraged, challenged and entertained hundreds of thousands in personal concert appearances on radio and on television.

APRIL RECIPE OF THE MONTH SALIED PEANUT COOKIES

1 c brown sugar	1 t vanilla
1 c white sugar	1 c crushed corn
1 c shortening	flakes (or wheaties)
2 eggs	1 c quick oatmeal
1 t baking powder	1 c salted peanuts
1 t soda	(may be chopped,
2 c flour	

Cream sugars and shortening. Add eggs, one at a time. Sift baking powder, scda, and flour. Then add vanilla, corn flakes, oatmeal and nuts.

Roll in balls the size of walnuts. Press down with fork. Bake 375° oven about 8 minutes. Be careful not to over-brown.
