## MAY RECIPE OF THE MONTH

## COUSIN MILDRED'S 5 o'clock BUNS 30-50 buns 1 pkg. dry yeast

- 3 c lukewarm water
- 2 c shortening
- 1 c sugar
- 1 T salt
- 2 eggs
- 10-12 c flour

Dissolve yeast in water. Add melted shortening, sugar and salt. Add well beaten eggs and then flour. Mix until soft dough forms. Knead dough down every hour for 5 hours. Works best if punched down starting at 5 PM.

Then at 10 PM, shape into buns and place on greased pans. Cover with a towel and then a plastic bag. Let rise until morning. Bake 350° (or 400° for more brown buns) for 15 minutes.

Makes dinner rolls or sandwich buns. Just vary the size. Freeze well.
