A great number of people attended this wonderful tea and extended to these telephone people their appreciation for the wonderful service they had rendered their community. We would like to include in this issue of our Dial Tone a few excerpts from the program on that evening as we think these poems and skit are typical of any community which had a magneto system and cuts over to dial operation. We are unable to include all of these in this ssue but expect to carry a few additional excerpts in next month's issue.

FAREWLL TO THE OPERATORS AND OUR TELEPHONE COMPANY Hark! The telephones, are ringing and they are very new, for we have changed from black ones to yellow, pink and blue. And that is why we are here tonight, to bid farewell to a familiar sight; to a telephone office and its operators two, who will leave this scene for a life that's new. Let's turn back the pages of Old Father Time and reminisce in rhythm and rhyme. The first switchboard found a tiny niche, in E. E. Brown's Meat Market where they all could switch. The calls that came through were very few so it wasn't hard to take care of two. But the time soon came to change its place; they built a new room and lifted its face. The Brown's were there as the keys fell down, to answer the calls for the old home town. It changed hands real rapid as time went by and several people thought they'd give it a try; but at the end of a year or two they would always announce that they were through. So in 1929 two new operators finally arrived with two small boys who were quite alive; and Aimee Nye with Norman ANd Max moved in and took over and relaxed; and Bess Purcell Rodberg moved in that day and the Fertile switchboard was far on its way. In '36 another change was due and they all moved to a place that was

new. They found themselves right on Main Street and don't ever think that wasn't a treat. For the public asked evey question under the sun and were sure the operators could answer every one. By 1937 Myna Smith and Darlene joined the force and Myna was taking a telephone course. She helped each, time as she saw their need and in 1948 became an operator indeed. To the best of their ability theyve served the town and switched the country folk for miles around.

No calls were to be answered after nine but some people forgot to look They rang at nine at their time. or eleven or two and expected each call to go right through. They reported new babies here and there, how much they weighed and what color hair. They'd ring the fire whistle strong and loud and it would always draw quite a crowd. The keys would drop down like stars in the sky every time the fire engine passed by. They'd hear voices ask, "Where's the fire today?" And they'd all get an answer somehow, some way. Husbands would get lost and couldn't be found, and they'd ask the operators if they'd please look around, and if they could see him on the street would they please send him home with the luncheon meat. Some poor little mother just pulling her hair would ask the operators if her kids were there, and would she please tell them to stay right by the door, she'd be there when she got the wax on the floor. The doctor would 'call that his vacation was due and a lot of his patients were feeling blue, but if anyone fell and broke their leg send them to the hospital to get it The gas truckers thpegged. ought it would be nice if the operators would take their calls instead of their wives. They had to sit by that board anyway and why keep their wives home all day. They have given death messages and heard, its knell and listened to many a wedding bell. They have seen other children as well as their own get their education, grow up and leave home. For when you've spent so much of your life at one thing there's bound
