He never complained about our driving fof course he gave us a dirty look when we made a direct hit in a fox Hole with the hay rack wheel).

Farming was different back then. A group of farmers would work together on one man's field then move to the next farmer's field until all was completed. Being 8 or 9 years old, he made you feel like one of the men.

Back at the home farm, lived grandpa, grandma, and his brother. Relatives from all around flocked to their farm like ants to honey. A11 quests were treated with love, unmatched anywhere in the world. Life was always exciting. I remember several times when other relatives and this man would gather chicken eggs for Grandma and bring them to the house. Well, the result was somewhat disastrous. One would threaten the other and grandma would say, "You wouldn't dare." You can guess the result, one huge egg fight. After the fun was over, Grandma never even got mad. Another custom in the home was all new guests were initiated into the cattle water tank.

This man never taught us the socalled important things of this world like reading, writing, arithmetic making money, etc. He taught us to enjoy life, love everyone, help your neighbor (everyone was his neighbor) and to be proud yet humble. Money didn't mean much to him.

His brother has the same loving heart, only his brother's was milder and patient.

Candy bars were always in the

front seat of his pickup but if he was out of candy he would take you up town to get some.

The reason I put A Man with No Name is because alot of people didn't know his real name. They called him what he was "Buddy". He lives in the hearts of everyone who met him. Buddy never married, but had more so-called, adopted children than you could count. Buddy babysat and loved to do it. He loved all children. He never would take money for it and made you feel you were insulting him for offering it. 1 IF I THE

When winter would come he would go around and blow snow from driveways and lanes. This doesn't sound special except he did this without telling anyone or taking money for it. He would drive miles to help anyone do anything. In the past, he drove quite alot.

Buddy was the jack-of-all trades. He did dishes, cleaned, cut wood, farm work and the list goes on. Many generations of children have been influenced by this man. Even on the day he died, he was playing with children.

Two days before he died, he was teasing his great niece and asked if we would take his picture when he kissed her and put it in the Fertile Reminder. We granted his wish.
