Our sympathy is extended to the family of Lawrence "Bud" Jenkins who passed away on May 21, 1992. Bud was born and raised in Fertile, son of Frank & Lena Jenkins. He attended school in Fertile and was a custodian at the school for 8 years and was also a school bus driver. Prior to his working at the school he had the Philgas Dealership 1 Jenkins Plumbing & Heating Business in Fertile for 35 years. Bud and Cora moved to Clear Lake in 1986 and the past year Bud had been a resident of IOOF Home in Mason City.

CARL M. SHEIMO BUSINESSMAN, FARMER, AUCTIONEER, MAYOR, BOARD MEMBER, SHERIFF

Probably few men were as well known in this area as Carl Sheimo. He knew personally practically everyone in the *county* and the surrounding area that had any connection with farming. -taken from The Northwood Anchor, March 14, 1963.

Carl Melvin Sheimo was born April 5, 1891, in a farmhouse about three miles west of Fertile.

He was the first to be born in a new large frame home on the K.O. Sheimo



The Sheimo Hardware (1915-1940) was located next to the bank building (now Burtness Plumbing) on main street. On the left of the interior of the hardware was a large warehouse for storage of machinery and supplies. The Sheimo Hardware also had the franchise for John Deere farm equipment throughout the years. Carl also erected windmills and serviced them.

A room in the back of the main store was equipment for soldering, tinsmithing, and plumbing supplies. The big pot belly stove, in the picture above (with men standing around it) was a place for farmers to smoke, chew tobacco and spit, and to "gossip."

farm. Five siblings preceding him were born in a small log cabin on the same property. Five more followed his birth. He was raised on a 300 acre farm that his father, K.O. Sheimo, established. Carl attended a one-room country grade school. His education at that time did not proceed past the seventh grade, as was the custom for many sons who were required to work on the farms by the age of 12 or 13. Later he briefly attended Waldorf Jr. College in Forest City.

On September 7, 1913, he married Hilda Marie Sagen, a grade school teacher who was living with her mother in Fertile. For the next few years he continued farming on the Sheimo farm.

In 1915, he became a hardware and implement merchant in Fertile. From this time and throughout

the 1920's, he became quite successful in the business and participated in all the community activities. He served on numerous school, church and town committees. He was mayor of Fertile, a member of the town council, secretary of the Fertile school board for many years, and he became a director of the local bank.

In addition to the hardware business, he also had the local ice business for several years. This meant storing ice in the winter from the local river to be distributed to surrounding small towns throughout the summer. For some time he also ran a local gasoline and service station and had the Chevrolet franchise. During this period Carl also had a steam engine and threshing equipment and did all the threshing of grain in the surrounding area.



Through the 1920's and 30's, Carl had a complete threshing rig that serviced all the farmers surrounding Fertile. It was a delight to the children in late August and early September to see the steam engine come through Fertile hearing the steam whistle. Eddie Rodberg operated the engine, Frank Jenkins was on the separator and "Kentucky Jack" often ran the straw blower. "Kentucky Jack" was proud of this job. He was a legend to all the Fertile kids at that time, since he also claimed to be the fish game warden. He was what you now call a homeless recluse whom everyone in Fertile accepted and helped out as he needed.

Along with everyone else, he felt the effects of the depression. In the early 1930's, he took up auctioneering, and from that time until the day before his death, March 11, 1963, this was perhaps his favorite and most rewarding occupation.

In 1940 he was persuaded to run for sheriff of Worth County. He sold the hardware business in Fertile and moved to the Worth County seat, Northwood, where he lived until his death. He was a very popular and well-liked sheriff for three terms, when he decided not to run for further terms. He had continued on with his auctioneering and went into the sale barn business in Northwood. For the 15 years prior to his death, he conducted a large livestock sales business in the North Central Iowa area. He had auctioneered a large farm sale in cold weather the day before his sudden death.

Carl Sheimo and his wife, Hilda, lived in the house Mr. and Mrs. Don Sunne now live in. In the late 1880's and early 90's Mrs. Sheimo's father (Halvor Sagen) ran perhaps one of the first hardware stores in Fertile which was a small one room building located across from the mill and one lot west.



Bennie Nelson was a close friend and partner of Carl's in the 1920's in the hardware store. Rueben Rodberg worked for Carl as manager of the Tydol Service Station and Chevrolet car sales (where Marv's station is now). Bud Jenkins also worked several years delivering ice, when Carl put up ice in a large ice house next to the station.

Mr. and Mrs. Sheimo had one child, Dr. Stanton Sheimo, who lives in Tacoma, Washington. All of his childhood experiences and roots are in the Fertile years of 1919 to 1936, when he graduated and went on to college.

The Reminder Staff thanks Dr. Sheimo for the information on the Sheimo Hardware and Station.

Dr. Sheimo sends his greetings to all who remember him in Fertile and expressed that his years spent in Fertile are some of his most cherished memories.

When the depression started (1929-30), the hardware and implement business went into a marked decline at that time. Carl went to auctioneering school and became a licensed auctioneer which he loved doing. He was a natural, with his strong voice, sense of humor, a fast patter, but most of all-the full trust from all the people in the county who knew him.

Report on humidifier and fans at Water Treatment Plant. Low will check with engineers on ceiling repair and report back.

Thompson will flash and patch roof at the Library.

Drain on property west of Esther Haugen property will be opened.

Discussion on lights at tennis court and vandalism in the park. Lights have been repaired several times this year. This is the final time the lights will be repaired.

Thompson reported water tower needs to have paint touched up and inside cleaned.

Marvin Dahn requested a small ditch along his property for drainage. He will do the work.

Recycling bill of \$2.00 monthly will be added to the garbage amount in July. It will be charged to houses and businesses. Discussion on drainage problem near Gary Anderson's property. Motion to talk to County Engineer and see if they would pay half, check on the cost and report in July. Carried.

Culvert at the Community Center has been repaired.
