HISTORY OF FERTILE LUMBER COMPANY

The Fertile Co-op Lumber Company was organized in 1903, by Wm. Rhodes A.A. Elthon and P.J. Ouverson.

The first manager was J.A. Ellefson, followed by Elmer White, who during his managership started the first Library in the office of the Lumber Yard. He was followed by Henry Halvorson, who served the Co-op for at least

forty years. The last three or four years Henry served, he had his office in his home and Lester Burtness, who had worked at the yard for more than twenty years, acted as manager at the yard.

Upon the death of Henry Halvorson, Leo Elthon took it over for a year or two, and then bought out the Co-op, and operated it until his death in 1967.

Led's son, Alan Elthon, bought it from the family, remodeled it and combined the former Fertile Hardware, and operated it as Fertile Appliance and Farm Store for over a year. He then sold it to Roger Humphrey, and the name was changed to Fertile Lumber and Hardware, in April 1969.

HISTORY OF FERTILE CHURCH OF CHRIST





Come September 15, 1994, Fertile Church of Christ will be 100 years old. The preaching and spreading of the Word of God has been the main purpose of the church whether the location be the old Rood schoolhouse on the northeast corner of property now owned by Mr. and Mrs. Clarence Ouverson, a church building in Fertile that was destroyed by fire on January 28, 1917, a second building built and dedicated on December 9, 1917, or a new brick structure on the hill finished in 1977.

In the summer of 1889 S.H.C. Class, an old buttermaker, asked a man by the name of Deval to come from Marble Rock and preach in a grove at the Old Law schoolhouse. Deval was called a Disciple or Campbellite. In January of 1892, G.W. Hasty of Des Moines came and preached in the Rood schoolhouse. In the summer of 1893 M.S. Johnson of Mason City preached a series of sermons at the Burr Oak grove (where Dale Hyde's now live). In May of 1894 several got together and signed a petition to ask Ben Hill of Maniteau Co., Missouri to come and hold a six week meeting for \$2.00 per week. There were 128 converts and out of this meeting the Church of Christ was organized on July 9, 1894. The church building was built that summer and fall. Formal incorporation papers were filed by William Paschen, O.S. Mitchell and Squire Humphrey on September 15, 1894. Baptismal services were held in the Winnebago River, west of the mill on the north bank. The first preacher after incorporation was T.A. West.

During the fall and early winter of 1916 the church building was raised. A basement was constructed and a new heating plant installed. The work was completed on January 26, 1917, but sadly the church building was destroyed by fire two days later. A new building was constructed during the summer and fall of 1917 and dedicated on December 9, 1917. The total cost was \$10,000.

In 1972 a building fund was begun to replace the old structure. The church family broke ground in 1976 and moved into the new building in November, 1977. The completion of the new building culminated plans and duscussions that had begun in the middle of 1969, during the ministry of Bernard Bliss. Dennis Ganz has served as minister with the congregation since August, 1974.

Over twenty-five men have served as ministers of the congregation. Many young people from the congregation have attended Bible Colleges and gone to serve the Lord in churches across the United States. Also, sons and daughters who have been taught in the church now serve in various ways and locations. We thank God for His many blessings through the years and pray that we will continue to serve Him by spreading the Gospel in our communities and the world. in station with The Church of Christ is an independent congregation of believers, led by elders and deacons selected annually by the congregation. Last charter member died in 1961, Dora Carr, was the mother of Vesta Kuns. Maude Robinson Emmert, 99 years old, a resident at Good Shepherd Center in Mason City, is the oldest person living who has had association with the church. Descendents of charter members still active in the local Church of Christ are: Vesta Kuns Roger Humphrey Jean VanDenBosch & son Bob Bob Ouverson & son Brian Eugene Hall & sons Tracy & Troy Brian Hall Dean Haugen & son Allen & daughter Dee Ann Our oldest living member is Bob Kuhn, now 89, but a newcomer, having been a member only since 1947. These have been members over 50 years at the present: Melvin Ouverson Vesta Kuns Elaine Hall Iva Schuler Lois Anderson Gertrude Lindquist Ruth V Ouverson Virgil Ouverson Jean VanDenBosch Viola Roberts Violet Hall Verle Miller Corrine Miller Those presently serving in a specialized church ministry who have gone from the church here are: Neil Kuns - minister - California Gary Hall, brother of Eugene and Brian - College Professor, Ill. Kevin Blanchard - campus minister, Minn. Robert Blanchard - minister in Wisconsin Mark & John Plunket - ministers in Ohio & Illinois Charley Gard & Dennis Haugen - both deceased have worked in plupit and youth ministry Rhonda Ganz Jensen - worked several years for Minnesota Bible College and interin youth ministry in Minnesota Worship services are at 10 A.M. and 6 P.M. Sunday School classes are at 9 A.M. year around for all ages beginning at 3 years of age. Youth groups meet a 6 P.M. Sundays for ages 4 through high school during the school year. The church has Bilbe study groups available presently meeting on Wednesday and Thursday evenings. Ladies Christrian Workers meet on the last Friday of each month at 2:00 P.M. and Evening Groups the last Monday of each month at 7:30 P.H.
