Cold quiz

How good are you at avoiding or managing the common cold? Answer true or false:

Damp, cold or drafty weather causes colds.

False. Colds depend not on the weather but on human contact. Hand-to-hand transmission of virus-contaminated nasal secretions spreads most rhinoviral colds. If you have a cold, you're especially likely to touch your infected mucous membranes, contaminate your hands, and then touch and infect others.

You're more likely to catch a cold in the winter than in the summer.

True. But not directly due to the weather. Cold or bad weather brings people together indoors, which leads to more person-to-person contact.

Most colds are acquired by children in school and then transmitted to adults.

You can easily catch a cold from people who sneeze or cough without covering their mouths.

False. It may be possible, but it's not easy. Coughing, talking and sneezing don't send viral particles very far; and the particles contain only a small concentration of rhinovirus.

Thorough hand-washing and disinfecting kitchen and bathroom counters gives protection against transmission.

True. Rhinoviruses can live for hours on hands. They also survive on inanimate hard surfaces, such as Formica, wood and plastic.

Take plenty of vitamin C to prevent a cold or to keep it from getting worse.

False. Well-controlled scientific studies show that vitamin C is of little help in preventing or curing colds.

Chicken soup can help relieve cold symptoms.

True. Steaming hot, homemade chicken soup can help clear mucus particles from your nose. Removing nasal secretions that contain viruses and bacteria is part of your defense against upper respiratory infections.

Additional advantages: Chicken soup is nutritious, tasty, inexpensive and has no known side effects. (See *Mayo Clinic Health Letter*, October 1984.)

Alcohol is an effective cold remedy.

False. The only potential benefit stems from its sedative effect.

Fatigue makes you more susceptible to colds.

False. There's no proof that fatigue or "feeling tired" makes you vulnerable to colds. But it can make you feel worse once you have a cold.

You can "sweat out" a cold.

False. Working up a sweat, during exercise, for example, may make you feel better temporarily, just as breathing warm, moist air can help. Both methods loosen head and nose congestion.

The only way you can get rid of your cold is by waiting for your body to make enough antibodies to destroy the virus that is causing your cold. Doctors sometimes refer to this "treatment" as "tincture of time." For colds, it generally takes three or four days.

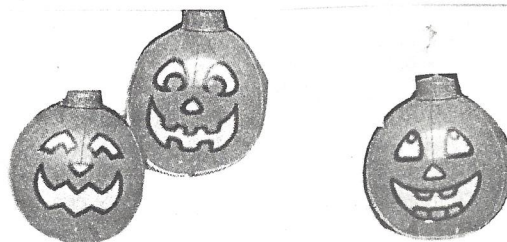

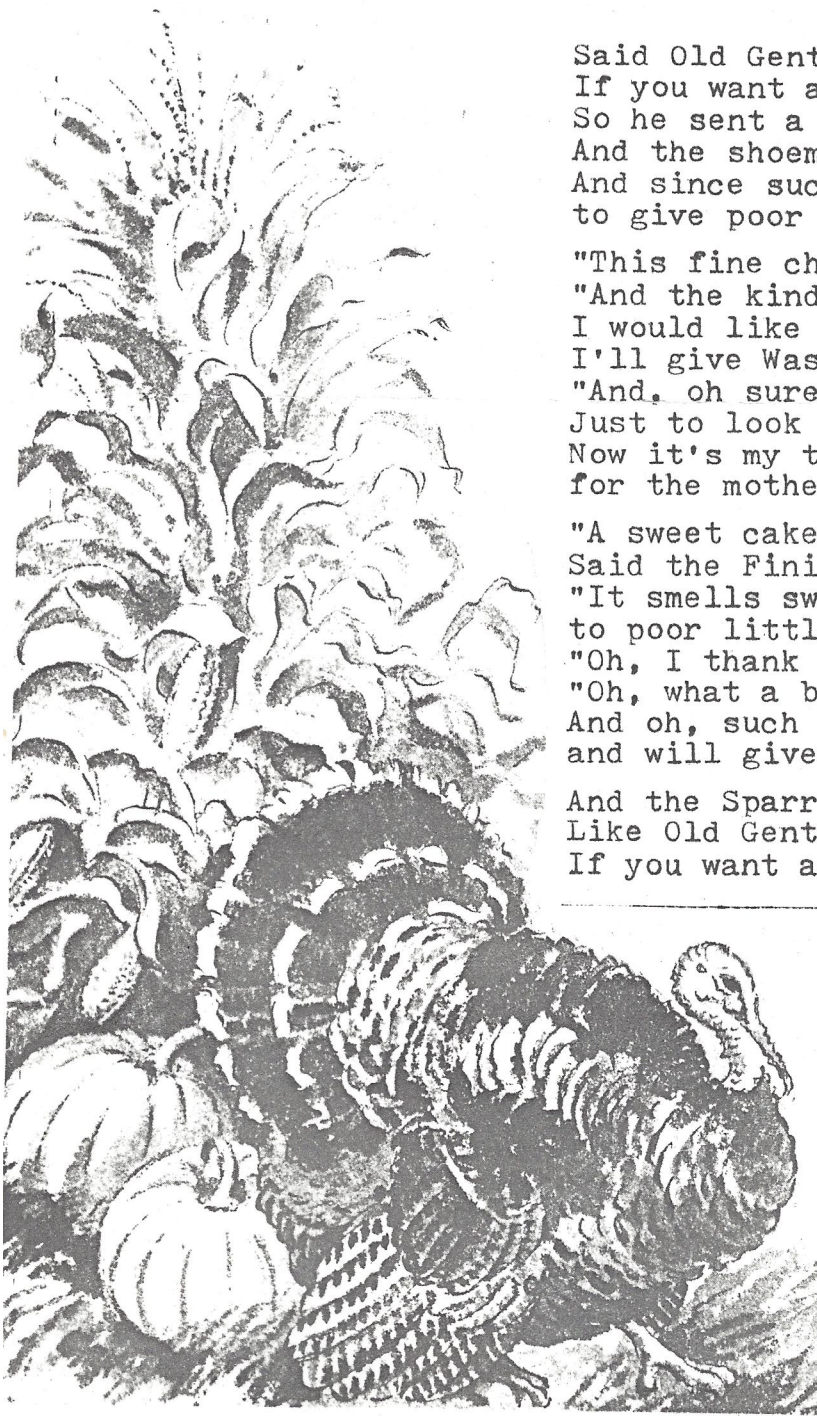
Said Old Gentleman Gay, "On a Thanksgiving Day,

for the motherless Finigan children I'll bake".

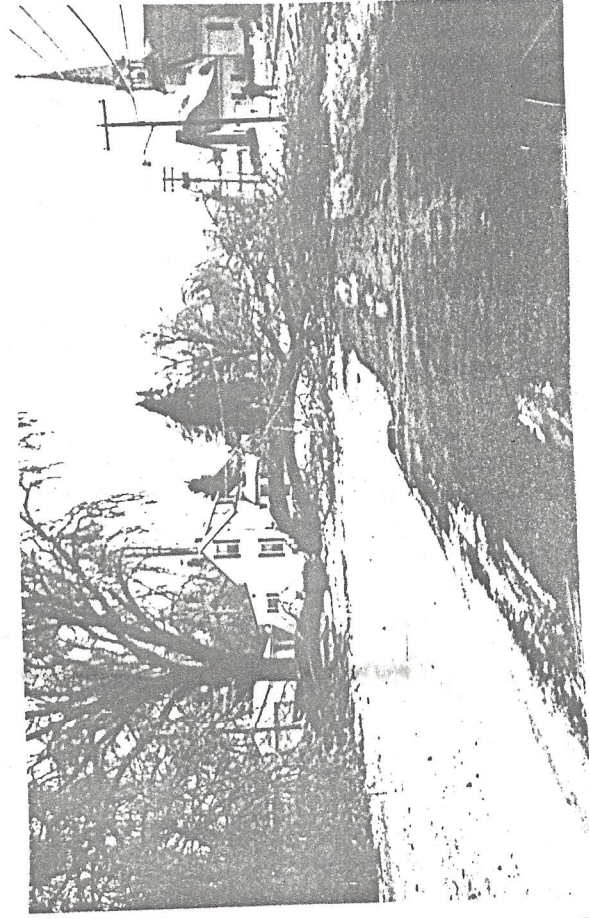
"A sweet cake all our own! Tis too good to be true!"

If you want a good time, then give something away!"

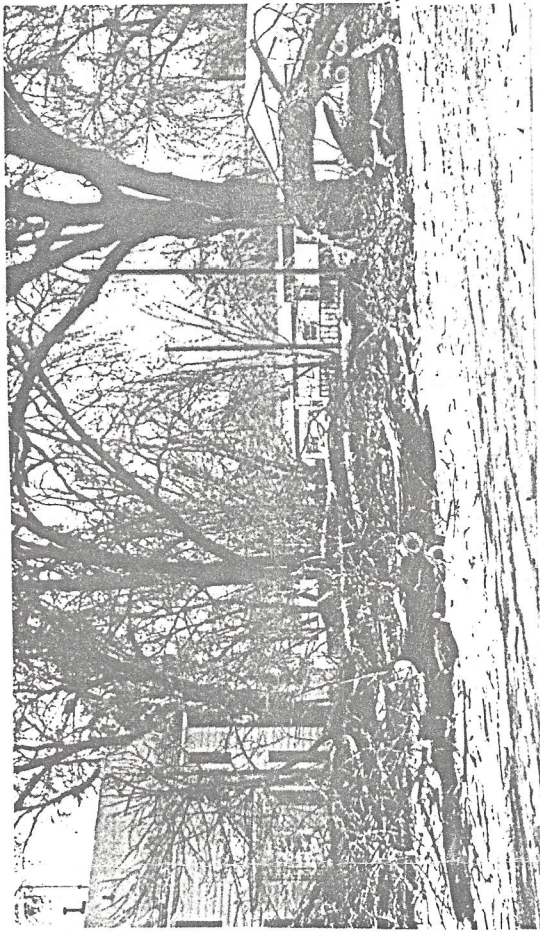
Thankful hearts are happy hearts-

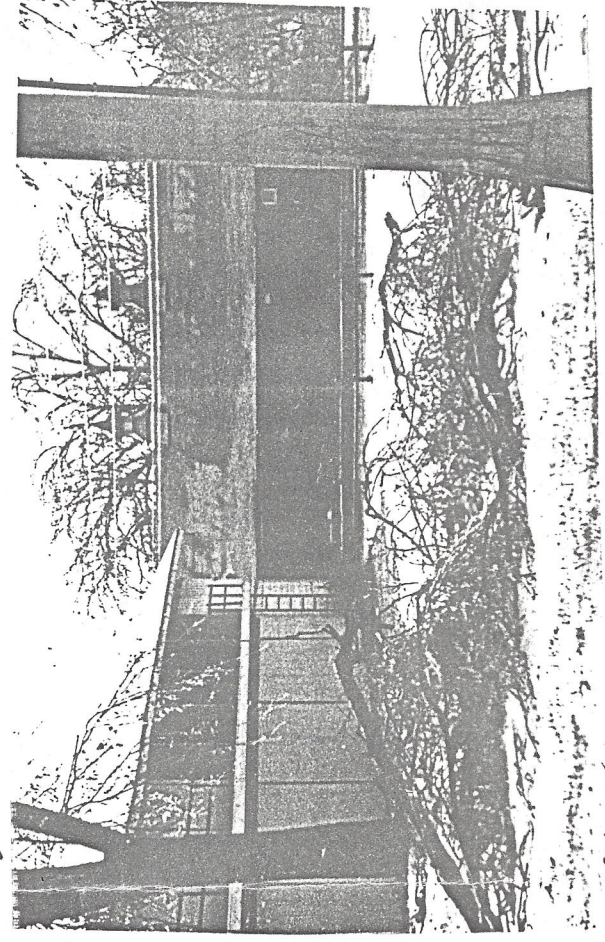
Tree across the road in front of Fertile School House.



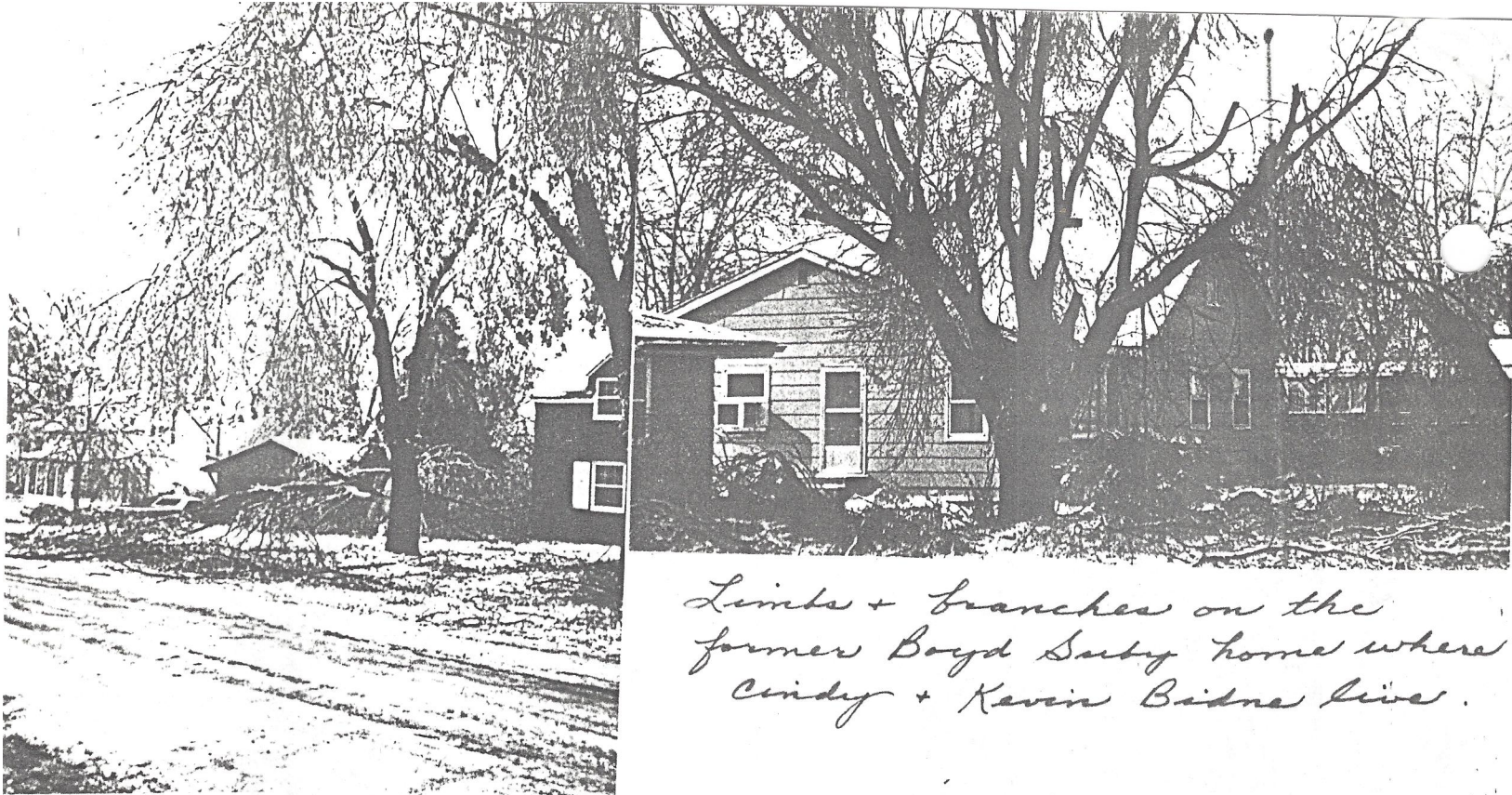
Trees in Luther's yard across from the school house.

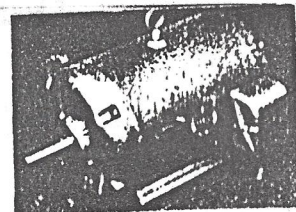

The members of the community will have to decide if they want us to remain open. Whether the cafe is open or not the bills go on. Heat stays the same as the boiler has to be kept at 5# pressure.

2. Donate money to keep it open.
3. Close just the cafe.
4. Help with money making events.
5. Close the whole building.

Bus barn rent is paid once a year. Senior Citizens pay quarterly so that income is not included this month. Rent for dining room has been raised to \$25.

In the past year we have painted the kitchen and dining room plus the womens restroom. We have added new wiring to the kitchen and dining room and had 220 wiring installed in Senior Citizens room. We also painted in the gym. Labor for painting was all donated. Cost of paint was \$250.00 and cost of wiring \$940.00. We also pay the city \$458.00 a year for liability insurance.

The center is run by volunteers and all money is raised by grants, donations, rent and money making events. We are not a tax supported institution.



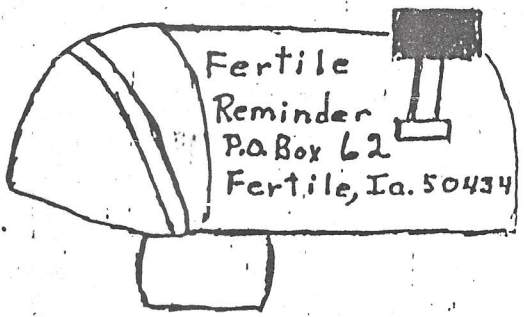
