

LOVIK ABOARD SHIP NEAR HAITI

Navy Petty Officer 2nd class Steven M. Lovik was unexpectedly called upon aboard the guided missile cruiser USS Sterett to break off a training exercise near Guatanamo Bay, Cuba, and respond to the deteriorating situation in Haiti.

The Belknap-class guided missile cruiser had been serving in the eastern Pacific Ocean and Caribbean Sea supporting the narcotics interdiction mission with five other ships. They were ordered to Haiti by President Clinton to inforce the UN-imposed sanctions against Haiti. The change came after the assassination of Haiti's finance minister and after another Navy ship was not allowed to dock with personnel and supplies to help Haiti prepare for the return of the country's elected president, Jean-Bertrand Aristide.

USS Sterett steamed to Port-Au-Prince to establish U.S. presence in the area. Lovik is one of 450 men aboard the ship which is armed with torpedoes, guns and missiles.

Steve is a 1976 graduate of Clear Lake High School and joined the Navy in January of 1981. He is the son of Mary Baca of Albuquerque, New Mexico and Marcus Lovik of Fertile and a grandson of Stanley and Erma Brue of Fertile.

Steve's wife Tarh and two daughters live at ElCajon, Ca. off the San Diego, Ca.

IT WAS A FINE DAY TO EAT CAKE AND SHAKE A COD MAN'S HAND -

It was amusing enough.

Here were 75 or so people, almost all of them seated, in the town Community Center room of the former Fertile School building. They conversed happily over cake, coffee and punch on a recent Sunday afternoon. Some of them watched my cousin's daughter, Erika, work the crowd.

"Hi!" the 1-year-old said enthusiastically to a woman sitting at the end of one table.

"Hello, there," the woman replied, smiling back. "Aren't you a cute lit...."

"Bye!"

Waving her tiny right hand conclusively, Erika wandered over to the next table. she exclaimed.

Near the entrance in the far corner of the room, a small, thin edlerly man stood quietly, somewhat stooped, in his best suit. A rose was pinned to its lapel. Two large hands protruded from his suit sleeves. He lacked cake, drink and company - but not contentment.

"Grandpa," I asked, "Why are you over here

by yourself?"

He smiled and then spoke in that low, soft ice of his: "I've just been greeting people as they come in."

I nodded toward the gathering of people, including my grandmother, standing and chatting with a neighbor. "Nobody's coming in at the moment," I told Grandpa. "Why don't you go and join them?"

"Well, someone might come in." I chuckled. "I'M sure of that. But believe me, they'll find you. That's why they're coming. Look at all these people. They're here to be with you."

I wrapped my arm around his shoulders. "Go on," I said. "Get some of that cake. I'll watch the door."

Grandpa glanced back to the door.

"Here comes somebody," he said, quietly pleased. Three longtime friends walked in. "Hello, there," he said, smiling.

Then he extended that large right hand to the first.

Oh, well. I'd never begrudge anyone who wanted to shake Grandpa's hand.

When I was a little boy, Grandpa's hands fascinated me. Next to my miniature pair, his were enormous paws, thick and sturdy, a bit

riry on the back and digits, in some places scarred. So much experience in those hands.

Grandpa's had been a farmer's hands for years. After that, he used them to cut meat, moving huge sides of beef and hogs.

He had a horseman's hands, too. I still recall him riding in parades, holding the reins in one hand and a flag mast in the other. Or

in the barn on the old farm, lifting and carrying huge pails to feed the hungry part-Arabians my grandparents used to show.

But Grandpa's big, sturdy hands impressed me most in serene situations. Such as before each meal.

"Stan," Grandma signals softly. She and Grandpa tip their heads slightly. I see Grandpa's hands join.

"Our heavenly father," he begins, softly, "we come to the"

I can see Grandpa's hand gently cradling a Bible during a sermon in the Evangelical Free Church that my grandparents have attended for about 35 of their 59 married years.

I wasn't around 40-some years ago when Grandpa's hands gently assisted my grandmother, stricken with polio. But she's talked about those times, many times while holding hands with her quiet man.

"We're hanging in there, aren't we, Stan," she says.

"I should say so," he replies softly.

Nearly 10 years ago, I saw Grandpa's hands resting on the bedding of his Rochester, Mn. hospital bed. They were as pale as his face. He already was weak, tired. He faced major heart surgery the following day.

But that night, we watched a University of Iowa basketball game-my grandparent's favorite weakness. And before I left, I clasped Grandpa's left hand with my own small hands. I held tight while making some small talk. His grasp was firm, too, and I knew we were both thinking the same thing.

So more than five years later, when I took Grandpa to his first Minnesota Twins game, I understood entirely when he took a handkerchief into one of those big paws and quietly dabbed his eyes.

And when Grandpa's voice faltered at home, just hours before neighbors held the open house for him at the Community Center, I sought no explanation. Reading aloud from the Bible, his voice faltered when he spoke, "Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life."

No one minded a bit at the restaurant that night when Grandpa wept again, while we sang "Happy Birthday." In fact, we couldn't have been happier.

And more surprised, too, when we learned earlier that, between two hours of handshakes, hugs and heartfelt greetings with 120 or so fans, an 80-year old found time to eat four generous pieces of cake.

Grandpa just chuckled. He didn't deny it. Maybe the pieces just looked small next to

his hands.

I thought you might like to know the amount of food we prepare. 200 lbs. potatoes, 24 (22 to 24 lb.) turkeys, 50 lb. cranberries, 50 doz. buns, 100 loaves of bread for dressing, 90 pies (we ran out), 18 gal. corn, 15 gal. cold drink and many gallons of coffee. The cost was \$610.00 with a profit of \$2021.50 being made.

Improvements we have made this year are two new furnaces, two air conditioners, new gas lines, new water lines at the cost of \$6489.89. We are in the process of having a gas heater installed in the gym at the cost of \$1550.00. The gym will be heated on Saturdays this winter for kids activities. Tom and Nance will be in charge of this project.

Future projects are: February, soup supper; March, barbecue pork supper; April, community auction.



 $\frac{3}{2}$ cups flour $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. salt

1 cup shortening

1 egg yolk

cup milk

1 cup crushed corn flakes (optional)

Filling:

6 cups apples

 $1\frac{1}{2}$ cup sugar

 $\frac{1}{4}$ cup butter or ole (melted)

2 T flour

1 tsp. cinnamon

Glaze:

1 egg white lightly beaten

Frosting:

cup pwd. sugar

2 or 3 tsp. water

Mix as for pie crust, combine egg yolk & milk, to flour mixture. Roll half of dough, put 1 15 x 10 in pan. Cover with corn flakes if desired. Toss together filling and spoon over pastry. Roll remaining dough, place over filling brush with egg white. Bake 350 to 375 for 40 minutes or so. Drizzle frosing over while warm.




