Post Office History

Mrs.Seglem Retires From 20 Year Service

Mrs. Enos Seglem of Fertile retired from 20 years services as substitute clerk in the post office at Fertile last Thursday. Mrs. Seglem began her duties

as substitute clerk Nov. 12, 1945.

A retirement tea was given uring the afternoon last Thursday in the post office lobby. She was presented a corsage by Postmaster James R. Purcell, a potted yellow mum plant from business men and cards and gifts by friends. Refreshments were courtesy of the Fertile Service Women. Mrs. Hilda Johnson registered 90 guests.

Charles Eikenbary was postmaster when Mrs. Seglem first began her duties. He retired in 1946 and his wife, Anna, was appointed. She served until 1959.

Thelan Elthon was actng postmaster for two years and James R. Purcell was appointed during 1961.

Mrs. Seglem recalled the move of the new post office after it had been in one location for 50 years. During the first years she worked for the post office there was no safe and money was put into money pouches and kept in the Eikenbary home at night.

First class mail pouches were hung on hooks until the new mail bag racks were installed in the old post office shortly before the move.

The retired civil servant also recalled how the mail was hauled

by car from Fertile to Hanlontown and put onto the train there. The run was made for about five years.

Train service was discontinued after the star route was started. Rural carrier out of Fertile is Dean Haugen.

Mrs. Seglem is a native of Winnebago county. She was born, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Ole Kingland, eight miles northwest / of Fertile.

She is the mother of four chldren including Vernon at home, Mrs. Arden (Fern) Midtgaardand Jim Seglem, both of Fertile and Mrs. Howard (Audrey) O'Leary of Mason City.

As for plans for the future she has none definite. Mrs. Loris Scobee will take her place at the post of Fiere

How to lose weight

■ Don't skip breakfast — During the day when you're active, your body needs maximum calories and nutrients. Missed meals slow the rate at which you burn calories and can lead to overeating at night when energy demands are down and calories are more likely to be stored as body fat.

■ Limit meat — Whether it's fish, poultry or lean beef, meat is a major source of fat. Reducing fat is the best way to cut calories.

■ Eat real food — You can drink liquid meals only so long. Eventually, you'll go back to eating regular food again.

Unless you've learned how to eat a variety of foods and still lose weight, bid long-term weight control good-bye.

■ *Exercise* — Any exercise burns calories. To promote weight loss from body fat, exercise at a moderate intensity for 30 to 45 minutes three to five times a week. Walking is a good form of exercise.

■ Drink enough water — Your body needs a quart of water daily to rid itself of wastes. Water also curbs your appetite and slows the pace of your eating. People who eat fast tend to overeat.

■ Don't weigh yourself too often — A weekly weigh-in is about right. Daily shifts in body water can show up as pounds on your scale. Frequent weighins won't give you an accurate picture of your weight loss and may discourage you. □

<u>Correct way to boil eggs:</u> Cover eggs with cold water and let the water come to a boil. Turn off heat and let eggs stand in hot water for 20-25 minutes. Then rinse in cold water.
