A Penny a Dozen Neil L. Kuns August 24, 1993

Strange things have happened to our money and our values over the last fifty years. It is now more economical, (although illegal) to drill a hole in a penny and use it for a washer than to buy a washer. In California, at least, they sell for two for a nickel. If I find a penny on the ground I still bend over and pick it up. That's more than can be said of the current generation. For many of them it seems hardly worth the effort. Grandma Carr always told me never to put a penny in my *mouth*, because maybe a dog had "piddled" on it. Putting it in my pocket *was* permissible, and at an early age I learned to do this and to value even a single cent. Two penny ante chores were my teachers.

Nearly every family in Fertile had a vegetable garden. Why not in a place called "Fertile"? Along with the corn, carrots and cabbage we usually planted potatoes. There were beetles we called potato bugs. If they ate the vines we didn't get to eat the tubers, so it was either them or us. I learned later that this insect is one of the most destructive agricultural pests in the world. We were "organic gardeners" before it was "cool". If the pesticides existed we couldn't have afforded them. I didn't realize that at the time. The standard way of dealing with the bugs was to pick them off by hand, and I was hired to do this at the rate of a penny a dozen. It didn't matter if they were the hard shelled or the younger soft shelled bugs. They were all worth the same bounty. After the patch was picked clean the bugs were counted and then destroyed by dousing them in gasoline.

The other job was picking up nails at the Fertile Lumber Company. In those days they not only sold lumber and hardware but also fabricated hay racks, hog houses, and other such useful constructions for the farmers in the area. The carpenters worked efficiently, and that meant not stopping to bend over and pick up a nail which might slip from their hands. The roads around and the passages though the lumber yard were dirt or gravel and the smaller nails especially could work their way into the dust and later into the tires of the vehicles.

The youngsters in town were used to pick up the nails. When either the vast array of interesting activities in town or our pocket change were exhausted we would go to Henry Halvorson or Les Burtness and ask if we could "get a job picking up nails." We were cautioned to stay out of the nail room and to only pick up nails from the ground of the lumber yard. We would then carefully go over every inch of the roads, especially where the carpenters had been working, looking for the lost nails. Our bounty was then taken to the office and we were paid a penny a dozen for our foundling nails. We not only bent over to pick up a penny, we bent over twelve times to pick up the nails to earn a penny.

Looking back now I realize that the lessons relating to the value of work and the need to toil, even for a few pennies, was worth far more than the money we earned and I'm grateful for those early lessons.
