Somehow people in Fertile heard of their problems and took up a collection of money and and food for them. In the spring the family left the area but the place where they camped was called Hungry Hollow.

### HOW PREPARED ARE WE?

Bev Kaduce, Worth County Emergency Management Coordinator, spoke at the Fertile Senior Citizens group on Tuesday, May 2, 1995. The focus of her talk was on how prepared are we to meet the needs of the disabled or elderly in the town of Fertile.

Kaduce indicated that we need to look at how we inform, warn and if necessary evacuate individuals, and more specifically the disabled or elderly, in an orderly and efficient manner.

She explained how to do "in-house protection" if public safety officials would indicate it would be necessary in a hazardous materials spill. Measures to take in such a situation include:

\* Seek shelter indoors \* Close all doors, windows and vents and shut off systems that draw in outside air, such as furnaces, heaters, air conditioners and other ventilation systems \* Seal gaps under doorways and windows with wet towels or thick tape \* Put out fires in fireplaces, close chimney flues \* Turn on your radio for additional instructions \* Stay indoors until it is announces that you may resume outside activities \* If explosion is possible, close drapes, curtains and shades over windows \* If you suspect gas has entered the structure you are in, hold a wet cloth over your nose and mouth.

Kaduce also answered questions about 911, weather and other emergency preparedness or response questions.
