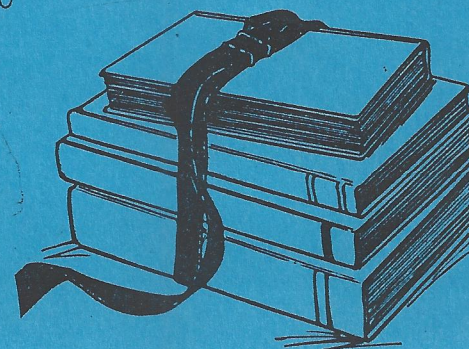

JULY EXPENDITURES

The Fertile City Council met in regular session on Tues., Aug. 1st, 1995 with Mayor Elthon presiding and council members Thompson, Brcka, Felland and Smith present.

Thompson reported signs are up on car bridge at an approximate cost of \$60 for the four signs.

Motion to approve the local option sales tax resolution. Carried

Brcka reported the library bathroom is nearly finished. Ceiling will be installed and floor covering put down.

Discussion on footbridge and possible demolition of the old part of the building at the Community center. Felland reported a meeting will be held Tues., Aug. 15 at the Community Center at 7:30 PM. with Dave Brunswold of Win-Worth Betco. He will discuss possible grants for demolition of the old building at the Community Center.

Mayor will contact Tuttle Asphalt to see if they will remove the asphalt that was dumped at the lagoon.

Motion to leave the alley between Corey Kock's and Mark Anderson's as it is. Carried

Smith reported Bob Purcell will allow the park sign to be put on his property. City will pay for the cost of a perpetual easement, if any.

Library needs an issue on the Nov. election. Motion to vote on changing the number of members on the board and the length of the trustees terms. Carried.

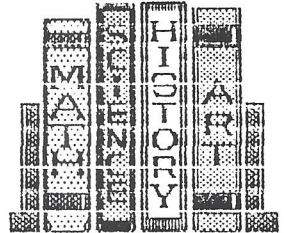
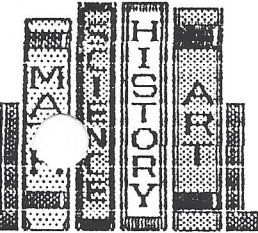

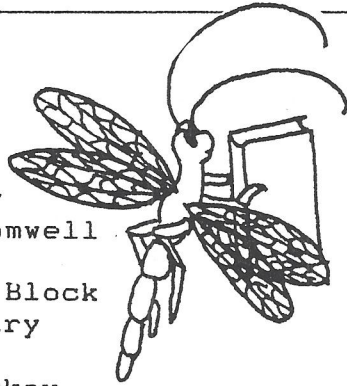

What A Drag!

For some people any job is a drag. They would rather go fishing or do almost anything other than work. Some jobs are so dirty or dangerous that they are always a drag. Still, as they say, *somebody* has to do them. On the other hand there are people who enjoy their jobs and just love going to work. Since I left home for college in 1949 I've had many different kinds of jobs, some of them much better than others. Whenever the work got to the point that it was a drag I moved on to something else. My philosophy of work is love it or leave it. It is fair neither to your employer nor yourself to merely put in your time and go through the motions. Give it your best or give it up.

Hank Van Den Bosch moved to Fertile from a Dutch community in western Iowa. He was always on the lookout for business opportunities, and bought one of the first Schield Bantam draglines in the county. This machine, mounted on the back of a surplus army truck, (World War II was over) was mobile enough to be driven to a dredging job and yet light enough to work in the marshy fields which needed to be drained. Ages earlier the last glacier to retreat from the area left the terrain around Fertile fairly flat. Large low spots in the countryside acted as basins and collected excess surface water which in wet years drowned out the crops. The solution was to dig a drainage ditch beside the field and to lay perforated tile lines under the fields to move the surplus water to the ditch. Dank swamps became rich fields when they dried out. When farmers saw the value in this venture Hank got all the business he could handle.


"Skinny" Van Den Bosch, Hank's second son, became a skilled operator with the dragline. He could throw the bucket with the precision of a fisherman casting a lure next to a log. He drew it back toward the machine, cutting out the dirt and leading a trickle of water. This indicated that the ditch would drain heavier flows during the rainy season. When Skinny completed shaping the ditch banks in that section someone had to drive the truck ahead several yards. It made no sense for Skinny waste his time doing this so Hank hired me for the job at a dollar an hour. I listened for Skinny's voice, drove ahead as he told me, and stopped when this was what he wanted. It was no big challenge, but for a buck an hour it wasn't too much of a drag. I sat in the cab of the truck and drank coffee.

At quitting time we shut down the equipment, got into Hank's pickup truck and headed for home. We compensated for all the very slow dragline driving during the day by really raising the dust on the way home. Occasionally Skinny would see how close to a farmer's roadside mailbox he could swing the back end of the pickup. We missed becoming felons by a matter of inches. Fortunately the skill with which he maneuvered the back end of the truck did not match his deftness with a dragline bucket.

Summer faded and so did my job when school started again in the fall. Sometimes when I drink coffee that has spent a little too long in a thermos bottle the smell of it drags my thoughts back to those long summer afternoons in Iowa on the dragline. I'm a kid again, waiting for Skinny to tell me, "Go ahead."

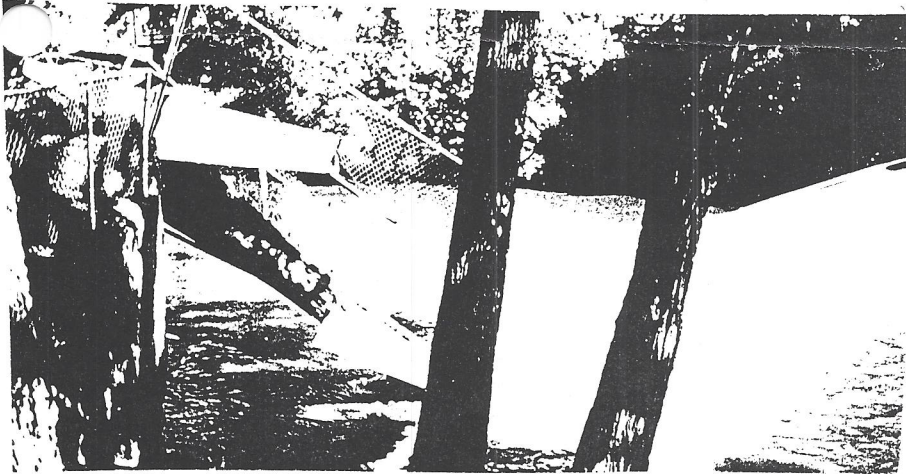

OUR BRIDGE IS HISTORY

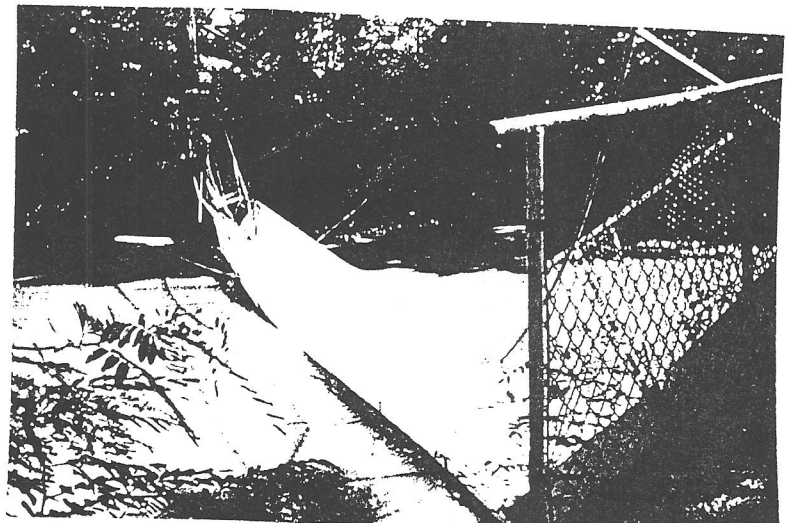
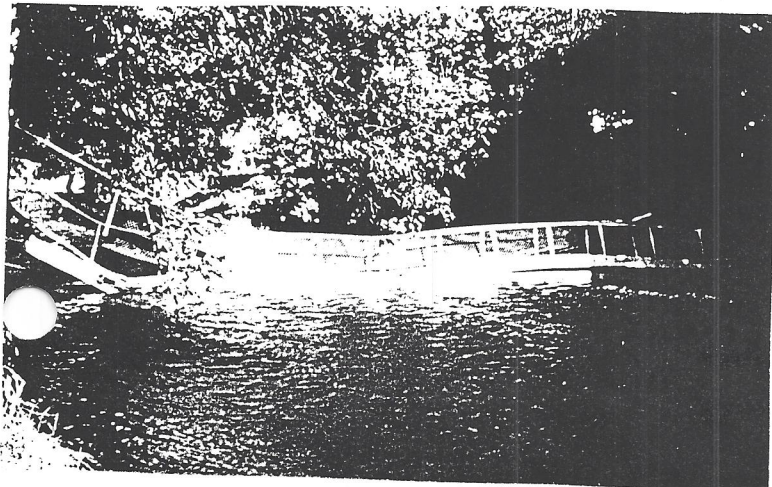

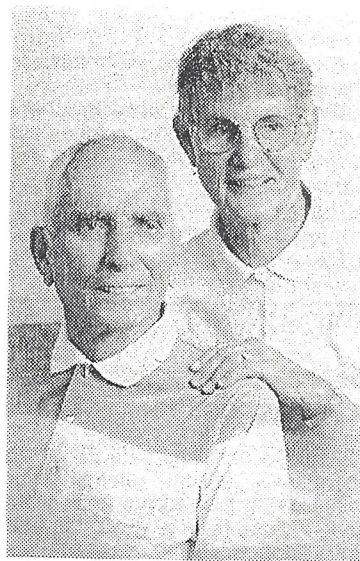

OTHER VEHICLES

Cars are not the only means of transportation on the road. It is very likely you will operate some other type of vehicle during your life. It could be a bicycle, motorcycle, truck or bus.

Even though you may never use any other kind of vehicle, you still should know about them. They affect you as a driver and as a pedestrian.

Learn the "rules of the road" for each kind of vehicle and something about their operation. This puts you in a better position to anticipate their movements when you approach them on the highway. This will help you become a better and safer driver.

Motorcycles

A separate manual, called "Iowa Motorcycle Operator Manual," is available from any driver license station. It gives a more complete explanation of operating techniques for motorcycles and traffic laws that relate to motorcycles.

Bicycles

Bicycle riders are common on Iowa's roads. You will meet them in the city and on country roads. Bicycles are a recognized form of transportation. They have the same right to the roadway as cars and trucks.

Just as motor vehicle operators have different levels of skill, you will come across bicycle riders with varying riding skills. When you approach bicycle riders, judge their experience and skill and act accordingly.

Common warnings of inexperienced include:

- riding near the gutter.
- swerving unpredictably.
- ignoring traffic signs and signals.
- riding without a light at night.

If you see these signs, be ready for anything.

Bicycle riders have the same rights and responsibilities as motorists. Most drivers know the responsibilities — stopping at red lights, signaling and yielding where necessary. Unfortunately, many motorists do not give cyclists the full lane they deserve and need for safety.

To give bicycle riders the room they need, change lanes when passing. On multilane roads with wide outside lanes allow at least 3-4 feet for clearance. On narrow, two-way roads, wait for a break in traffic before

passing. Bicycles often travel nearer the right edge of a traffic lane because of gravel, sand and oil on the pavement, but sometimes they need a full lane. They may have to move away from the curb to avoid sewer grates, potholes, broken bottles or other debris.

Failure to see bicycle riders is a major cause of car/bicycle accidents. Be aware that an experienced cyclist on a multi-speed bike can maintain a speed of 15 to 25 miles per hour on level pavement.

When making a right turn near a bicycle rider, move to the far right before turning. If there is a bicycle lane, merge into it to prevent being overtaken by a cyclist. Do not race around a cyclist and make a right turn across his or her path. You may be setting up an accident if the cyclist cannot stop in time. Check the blind spot over your right shoulder, then turn.

Do not blow your horn at a cyclist. Generally it startles the rider and may cause the rider to swerve and possibly cause an accident. If a bicycle rider decides to ride on the street when there is a bicycle path available, give the rider the needed space. Some studies show there are more bicycle accidents on bike paths than on highways.

Pedestrians, motorists and bicyclists can share the state's roads if they just treat each other with respect and courtesy.

Pedestrians

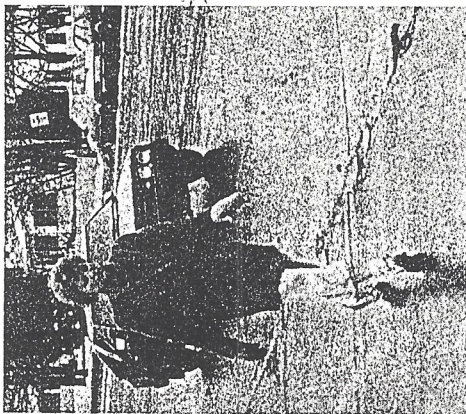
Even though you are walking, not driving, you are still subject to traffic laws. You have the same responsibility to obey traffic laws as do motorists.

Motorists should yield to you in marked crosswalks, but don't bet your life on it! Watch out for yourself. If you cross the street anywhere but at a crosswalk you must yield to motorized traffic. Jaywalking and dashing across intersections could be the end of you. Of every five people killed in a traffic accident, one is a pedestrian.

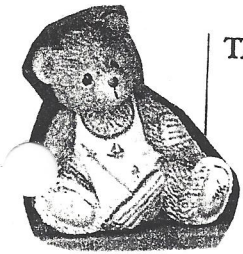
If you must walk where there is no sidewalk, walk on the left side of the street facing the oncoming traffic. At night wear light-colored clothes so you can be seen easily.

Driver Responsibilities

As a driver you must yield to pedestrians at all times. Even if they are jaywalking or crossing where they should not be, you must stop for them! School and residential areas are very dangerous. Watch out for children running out from between cars. It is a good idea to drive slower than the speed limit in these areas so you can stop quickly.

APRICOT JELLO SALAD

Recipe!

- 1 box orange or apricot jello
- 1 cup boiling water
- 1 (3 oz.) pk. cream cheese
- 1 (#2 or 16-17 oz.) can unpeeled apricots halves

Dissolve jello in water, add cream cheese and beat with wire whip until dissolved. Add apricots halves or cut halves in 1/4 sections depending on size of apricots. Chill until set.

The ladies were seated around the table and on either end of the table sat these bowls of something pink and looked so nice. Before going home the ladies asked the hostess what it was and was informed "Jello" and could be purchased at Rye-Bray's store in Hanlontown. The next time in town Tille purchased a box and made just plain jello with no fruit in it.

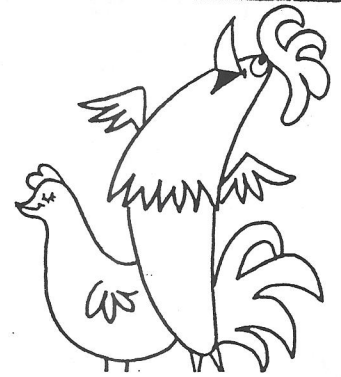

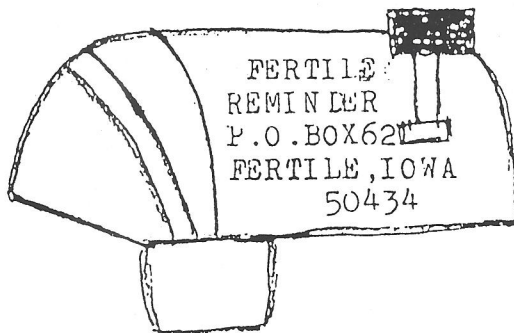
