

The Fertile City Council met September 1, 2003 at 7:00 PM in Fertile City Hall. Present were Mayor Joyce Russell, Council persons Tammy Hall, Jeff Berg, Richard Bruns, Tad Miller, Melanne Bang. Berg moved, Hall 2nd to approve the August minutes. Passed. Report was given by the Mayor, including the smoke testing of the sewer, a request of the Senior Citizen group and the successful Fertile Celebration. A copy of the Smoke Testing results is available at the Fertile Library. Hall moved, Bang 2nd to appoint John Greve of Northwood as City Attorney. Passed. Richard Bruns, sewer and water committee, reported a plugged transfer tube at the lagoon. Bruns said no dumping of concrete or other garbage is allowed at the lagoon site. Clay will be used to plug the rodent holes at the lagoon. The sewer work on the east side of town will be begin in October. The clerk reviewed the Annual Street Report. Talks are continuing with WCTA concerning damage done to the alleys during the WCTA cable installation. Bruns moved, Berg 2nd to approve expenditures. The Fertile Garden Club is planning to plant daffodils and other flowers at the corner of Highway 9 and 1st Street. Discussion of an entrance sign and options for the site took place. Robert Clark, Traffic Tech, for the Iowa DOT will meet with Fertile to determine placement of a sign. No action on a sign was taken at this time. Berg moved, Hall 2nd to approve expenditures. Passed. Standing committee reports were given. Meeting Adjourned.



Baloney!©Neil L. Kuns

Most people think that the most attractive feature of Wisconsin cuisine is its cheese. When the Badgers represented the Big Ten in the Rose Bowl a couple years ago, many of their fans unabashedly represented themselves as "cheeseheads" by wearing plastic cheddars on their heads. Californians thought it was bizarre. On the other hand, Californians think Wisconsin cheese is delicious. They are right.

For me a better representation of tasty treats from "America's Dairyland" is the German and Polish sausage, baloney and wurst that is available there. Small neighborhood butcher shops still do a brisk business in La Crosse, Wisconsin, and many other cities and towns in the state. The old Schockinger's Meat Market in La Crosse is now known as Breidels, but changing the management and name has not changed the way it smells or the wonderful taste of their wieners and baloney. Until city inspectors decided it was unsanitary the market still had sawdust on its floors. We visit my in-laws there a couple times a year, and never miss sampling their spicy, smoked specialties.

Up until the time I was ten Mort Haugen ran a meat market and baloney business on Main Street in Fertile, Iowa. It too had sawdust on the floor and a wonderful smoky smell in the store. Mort's wieners were wonderful, and his ring baloney was relished all over northern Iowa. One of the secrets of the sweet smoky taste of his meats was the inclusion of a bit of apple wood to the smoke-box while the meat was curing. Mort bought the meat and ground it. He seasoned it, stuffed and cooked it. After he smoked his product he loaded it into his delivery truck, and peddled it to grocery stores all over the area. His was a very busy schedule.

Occasionally I happened to be in the shop when Mort was stuffing the sausages. The ground meat was stuffed into the casings, which were most often the intestines of butchered animals. Of course the entrails had been thoroughly cleaned, but knowing what that natural product had been before it became a part of wieners or baloney took a little getting used to. I didn't especially like the looks of the links as they were squeezed out of the stuffer, either. They looked like giant worms crawling out of an apple. But when the time came to eat the meat, any squeamishness went up in smoke. It made little difference whether Mom served the ring baloney hot or cold, in thin slices or thick chunks. The flavor was delicious. In those days no one ever cared or even thought about fat content or cholesterol. Taste was the only thing that mattered.

When the Second World War started one of the first local casualties was Mort's meat market. Meat and gasoline rationing made it difficult for him to continue. Soon the business folded, and left us with only fond memories of the meat that made Mort famous, at least around Fertile, Iowa. The most appropriate thing I can say about that loss is, "Baloney!"






The meeting was called to order by President Penny Miller. The Pledge of Allegiance was said.



Mashed Potato Casserole

Serves 6-8 400° 20 minutes

Preheat oven to 400

Cook and mash

3-4 large potatoes

Add: 1/3 cup sour cream or yogurt

1 tsp. Salt

dash of Pepper

1/2 tsp. Sugar

1/4 cup Margarine

Add just enough milk to bring to proper consistency and beat until fluffy.

Add: 1/8 tsp. Dill seed

2 tsp. Chives, chopped

1 cup cooked spinach, well drained &

chopped.

Place in greased casserole and top with

1/2 cup grated cheddar cheese.

Bake 20 minutes.

May be made a day or two ahead and refrigerated or make a double recipe and freeze half to add to the future oven meal.

COATING MIX FOR OVEN-FRIED CHICKEN

Makes 2 1/3 cups mix. 350° for 1 hour. Combine in a bowl:

2 cups dry bread crumbs

1 tsp. Salt

1 1/2 tsp. Paprika

1 tsp. Celery salt

1/4 tsp. Pepper

1 tsp. Poultry seasoning (optional)

1/4 cup vegetable oil

Blend ingredients with fork or pastry blender until well mixed. Keeps un-refrigerated in tightly covered container.

Ready to use.

Put 1/2 cup of Coating Mix in plastic or paper bag. Moisten chicken pieces with water or milk and shake on piece at a time in bag. Add more mix as needed. Lay chicken skin-side up in greased and bake 1 hour or until tender. Can be used for fish fillets also.


