PUTSY By Donald E. Rye

As I read the "Fertile Reminder" it stimulated memories of my youth. My initial recollections were of the War Years when automobile use was severely restricted and our infrequent drives would usually be to farms near Fertile, or into Fertile to visit friends and relatives of my parents.

My parents were Harlan Nelson Rye and Grace Johanna Raun Rye, who were born and raised in the Fertile area and now share, with many of my relatives, Brush Point Cemetery.

Subsequent to the War Years, many trips were made to Fertile. In the spring when the river was high due to the thaws, we would enter the park by driving over the cement slab that was usually covered by shallow but rapidly moving water, and walk to the dam. We would stand for considerable time enjoying the sound and power of the water tumbling over the dam, creating large collections of foam on the river's surface.

Being out of school in the summer, I was permitted to stay a few days with relatives. My rod, reel, and tackle box were always part of the meager elongings that I brough with me. Upon arrival I selected a place to fish. My favorite spot was below the dam on the mill side on the stone wall. Frequently I shared this location with an elderly gentleman.


Although few fish were caught, the quiet setting with the water slipping over the top of the dam created a feeling of serenity that made drowning worms worthwhile. The silence between the old fisherman and myself was occasionally punctuated with a suggestion or encouragement.

When the day's fishing had ended I returned to my host relative's home, Eva Rye Faulken. When asked if I knew who my fishing partner was, my response was, I don't know! If my memory serves me correctly she said, "Gert or Gerd Orcutt. I was later to learn his family was one of the founding families of Fertile and that his roots were in another century. Imagine, an octogenarian and a preteen sharing a place and time which seemed to provide equal rewards to both parties.

Another of my memories was observing pickle cocessing. If the older boys weren't working, they would collect around the area and likely make suggestions which were easy to ignore. All seemed

to have nicknames and were able to turn boredome into fun and laughter. Names I recall were the Elthon boys, my relative James Sanderson, and boys my age like Dick and Jerry Jenkins. Their tolerance of my presence was the basis for rich memories for a Forest City kid who came to visit.

Thank you for triggering my memories through your "Reminder". I view with some sadness that today's youth will likely never enjoy similar experiences. God bless Fertilities past and present, and be assured "Putsy" wll always be special to me!



That's it! An exceptional limited edition blend of Europe and East Africa, cultivated organically in the heartland of America resulting in a bold, robust,



STANLEY L. ZIRBEL 1918 - 2003

Stanley L. Zirbel, 85, of 23798 Finch Ave., Clear Lake, died July 20, 2003 at the Good Shepherd Care Center in Mason City.

Memorial services were held at 2 p.m.on July 23rd at the Christian Church in Clear Lake with Rev. Mark Young officiating. Private graveside services were held

in Clear Lake Cemetery with military honors by the Clear Lake V.F.W.

Stanley was born May 17, 1918, the son of George and Petrea (Back) Zirbel, in Grant Township, Cerro Gordo County where he lived his entire life.

He graduated from Fertile High School in 1935. He was in the United States Army from June 11, 1942 - Oct. 11, 1945, as part of the 312th Medical Battalion, serving in the European Theater under Gen. George S. Patton's 3rd Army. Following his military service he returned to the family farm where he farmed for many years.

On July 13, 1943, he was united in marriage to Iryn "Kit" Merwin in Clear Lake, celebrating their 60th anniversary a week ago.

He spent much time in public service. He was a member of the Fertile Co-op Dairy Assn, Worth County DHIA, Fertile and Forest City School boards, Cerro Gordo 4-H Youth Council and Secretary-Manager of the North Iowa Fair from 1976 to 1984. He helped organize the Fertile Valley Farmers 4-H Club, serving as one of its first leaders.

He loved spending time with young people. His hobby was gardening. After retiring, he worked part-time at Clear Lake Krieger's Greenhouse.

He is survived by his wife, Kathryn, of Clear Lake; five daughters and their husbands: Jan and Fred Hare, of Fertile, Jim and Kren Weld, of Clarion, Amy and Keith Van Note of Minneapolis, MN, Jill and John David Murray, of Burnsville, MN and Eileen Zirbel of Rochester, MN; a sister, Merridy Hill, of Mason City; four grandsons, four granddaughters; five great-granddaughters; a great-great-granddaughter; and a wonderful extended family.

He was preceded in death by his parents; a sister, a Nelson; a granddaughter, Merry Weld Dick; and an infant daughter.

Thought for the day was given by Lois Anderson. Three birthdays this month were celebrated.


The next meeting will be September 9th at the home of Elaine Patten.

We went to a "Nordic Fest" for my family in Rio, IL in June and this was one of the dishes we had at the pot luck. Many of us copied this one!!

"Pineapple Scalloped"

3/4 cup butter

2 cups sugar

3 Beaten Eggs

1 can Crushed Pineapple (15 oz can)

1/4 cup Milk

4 cups bread crumbs (1/4 cup saved back for

the crumb topping)

Mix all together and put in a 9x9 lightly greased cake pan. Sprinkle on 1/4 cup bread crumbs for topping. Bake for 1 hour at 350°.

It is very tasty and something different to take to a pot luck.

"GARLIC TOAST"

Italian Bread—individual loaves or Sub Rolls. Slice 1/4 inch thick. Lay bread on a jelly roll pan. Brush butter or oleo on one side. Sprinkle with garlic powder in the amount you want for flavor.

Bake for 15-20 minutes at 350°. Cool and store in glass jar. Good with spaghetti & meatballs, lasagna etc.




