### <u>Fertile Volunteer Fire Department</u> P.O. Box 93 Fertile, Iowa 50434

We would like to share with the citizens of Fertile what the fire department is doing and update you periodically through-out the year. The Fertile Volunteer Fire Department consists of ten active volunteers, one equipped 4x4 brush truck, two pump trucks, one tanker truck, ten full sets of bunker gear (10 to 15 years old) and six SCBA (Self Containing Breathing Apparatus) (2 to 3 years old). The fire department is supported by city funds, township funds and money raised through fund raising activities. In the past year, the state funding has been cut to the fire department. Our fire district covers the city of Fertile, approximately 55 square miles in southern Worth County, and northern Cerro Gordo County, including 12 miles of I-35 and 8 miles of Hwy 9. We also have a mutual aid with Hanlontown Fire and Rescue. Fertile Volunteer Fire Department is an intricate part of this community. Our fire fighters are on call 24 hours a day 7 days a week-as well as holding down full time jobs. These men attend a regular monthly meeting and attend continuing education classes through-out the year. Our department has one-licensed first responder, and two fire fighters in the process of completing the first responder course. Our department is responsive to fire and medical calls.

When a fire fighter goes to fight a fire they are exposed to many dangers. Some of the dangers are heat, sparks, fire, smoke, chemicals, and falling debris, to list a few. Bunker gear worn by a fire fighter protects them from these dangers. Bunker gear also keeps the fire fighter dry. Bunker gear consists of a jacket, pants, suspenders, helmet, and boots. The cost of one complete set is \$1,452.00. As of January 2005 – our bunker gear is 10 to 15 years old. The life span of bunker gear is 5 years. Our goal is to raise enough money to purchase ten complete sets of bunker gear in the year 2005.

Our volunteer fire fighters are as follows: Dwight Bruns (Fire Chief), Jeff Berg (Asst. Fire Chief), Warren Bruns (Medical and First Responder), Mike Dahn (Secretary), Brian Fairchild, John Jordan (Medical), Dan Lee (Safety and Training), Dan Miller (Treasurer), Josh Miller, and Bruce Waddington (Safety and Training).

Without these volunteers we would not have a fire department or rescue team. It is **vitally** important to protect our fire fighters. They put their life on the line while fighting a fire or responding to a rescue call. **Your support would be greatly appreciated.** Please send donations to: Fertile Volunteer Fire Department, P.O. One of the colorful characters who called on my father at his garage was an old Russian gentleman. When he wasn't spinning yarns about his accomplishments during the Russo-Japanese war he was plying his trade as a metal-man buying scrap iron, copper lead and brass. Old radiators, batteries, axles, anything made of metal had value. When he got down to business he weighed the scrap and paid us for it. This early effort at recycling kept the clutter down around the garage and put a little cash into the till. Dad was happy for Dale and me to sell any metal we could find discarded around town or out in the country so we became occasional scavengers.

In those days people burned combustible rubbish or buried compostable trash in the garden. This was easier and cheaper than trucking it to a dump. Several sites in the county degenerated into unofficial junk yards, and people would haul their durable discards to one of these for disposal. Any abandoned hollow qualified. If a farmer did not want any part of his land to become a dump he posted it, "No Dumping," and people for the most part respected his wishes.

Just south the highway a mile west of Hanlontown there was a man-made hollow from which someone had removed gravel. One could call it a pit but it was not a hole in the ground. It was rather a spot where an ice-age glacier had dumped a small hill of gravel as it retreated into what is now Minnesota. The entrepreneur was able to load the alluvium into his trucks without digging a pit. When he got too close to the county road to the east he had to stop digging or risk a cave in of the road and a war with Worth County.

Over time this deserted place became overgrown with weeds and started attracting trash from the people in the area. It was an informal junk yard. I became aware of the place shortly after the Russian junk-man called at the garage. Of course I wanted to scout it out for scrap metal and this was the reason I visited the site that day.

I drove the pick-up off the highway and parked. No one was within a mile of the place as far as I could tell. All was still as I wandered through the dried grass and weeds looking for scrap metal. Suddenly a cotton-tail rabbit, deciding I was too close for his comfort, jumped out of the bushes at my feet and scampered away. I jumped at least as quickly as the rabbit, adrenaline coursing through my veins. It was a "hare-raising" experience, and I could feel the hairs on the back of my neck bristle. That first moment of terror quickly faded to relief and humor. I wondered if the rabbit was as relieved as I was.
