

The Fertile City Council met at 7:00PM in regular session, October 4, 2005, at Fertile City Hall. Present were Mayor Joyce Russell, Council members Tad Miller, Gail Shropshire, Melanne Bang, Jeff Berg. Absent Paul Youngers. Tad moved and Gail 2<sup>nd</sup> to approve September minutes. Gloria Kirschbaum turned in her resignation as City Clerk, effective September 30th, 2005, motion by Melanne and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Tad to accept her resignation. Carried. Larry Pump, CPA, audit, was present to inform Council about Audit. Mayor Russell called for a Executive Committee-Of-The-Whole, closed session, for discussion of Mr. Pump and Council. Mayor Russell called meeting back to order. Mr. Pump asked to be released from Audit Contract, for the amount of \$2500.00. Tad made motion and Melanne 2<sup>nd</sup>. Carried. Mr. Pump asked the City Council to approve a Consultant Agreement, for the sum of \$3000.00, for their firm to come in and help set up our books and get everything balanced. Motion by Melanne, 2nd by Gail. Carried. Kristin Urdahl, Accountant, was present and gave Council job description for her to come in once a month or whenever needed to help City Clerk and do monthly reports for Council, she will work on an hourly basis. Motion by Gail, 2nd by Tad. Carried. Edgar May has applied for the City Clerk position, but asked to be given till Friday, Oct. 7th to give Council answer. Motion by Tad and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Gail to accept Yaggy-Colby as the project engineer administer for sewer project. Motion by Melanne and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Tad to accept Simmering-Cory as the block grant administer. Motion for a Public Hearing, set for Nov. 1st at City Hall on CDBG sewer application. City Attorney, John Greves has sent letter to PIM's Attorney on solution of dumpster problem on main Street side walk.

Hare Electric turned in bid for wiring of new Main Street lights. Bid not to exceed \$5900.00. Motion to accept bid, but to be billed in actual cost, not to exceed \$5900.00 by Tad and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Jeff. Carried. Pit Bull in City attacked another dog and owner is in the process of removing dog from City. Building Permit was applied for by Shane Wagner to put up garage on his property. Motion to grant a variance was approved. Motion by Tad, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Jeff, Carried.

Congratulations to Warren Bruns, City Maintenance person, he has completed his classes and taken the test for his Grade #1 license for water and sewer and passed. Dave Low plans to retire in January and Warren will be doing the testing after that. We were informed that the dead tree at 302 W Main will be removed by Alliant in a few weeks. Motion by Jeff, 2nd by Gail to purchase new computer, printer and software, not to exceed \$2500.00, as recommended by Larry Pump, CPA, as all County, State and Federal forms will now have to be e-filed. They will not accept paper forms any more. We had a complaint about dogs running loose in town again and we informed the people that you need to call Worth County Sheriffs office and they will handle it. City Ordinance states all dogs and cats must be on lease or chained up. Randy Brederson, for the little League, stated he had not received the check for \$500.00 that was put in budget for this year. Council will address this when the books are brought up to date and balanced. Cresent Moon, Dick Burns, presented the Council with a check for \$2208.00 for revenue for sewer. Thank You. Bob Jones brought up discussion on Knapper Oil, tankers, being parked near his property. Council will address this with Knapper Oil owners. Motion to approve expenditures by Melanne and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Tad. Carried. Jeff Berg will contact Alliant and let them know about trees that are in wires and need trimmed. Warren is working on getting lagoon sprayed for thistles and removing the sheep. Complaint on banging of truck boxes at Waupaca is being taken care by the Manger of Waupaca. People that were sent letters to clean up property will be given six more months, if they have made improvements to correct the problems. Jeff motioned to adjourn meeting, 2nd by Tad. Carried. Minutes by Penny Miller, Thank Joyce Russell, Mayor

# FERTILE FIRE DEPARTMENT UPDATE October 2005

We would like to update everyone on what has happened in the Fertile Fire Department in the past three months. The Fertile Fire Department meets the first Monday of every month. Meetings are lead by Fire Chief Dwight Bruns. Members are as follows: Warren Bruns, Mike Dahn, John Jordan, Dan Lee, Bruce Waddington, Josh Miller, Jeff Berg and Dan Miller. Fire Fighters regularly attend the meetings each month.


The Fertile Fire Department would like to thank those who made their breakfast on August 13th a great success. The fire department netted \$1,000.00. We would also like to thank those who have donated monies in the past few months.

We have received grant monies from INS Charity Grant of \$1,500, WCTA \$100.00 and Hanson Foundation of \$3,000.00. We appreciate your donations immensely. Thanks again! Bunker gear fund is now at \$7,20000. Total needed to purchase nine sets -\$13,500.00. At the October meeting, Jamie Sorenson from Hanlontown Fire Department provided information on purchasing full sets of bunker gear. The plan is to order the bunker gear in the next few months.

The Fire Department is continuing to work on raising monies to purchase Self Containing Breathing Apparatus. We received \$750.00 in an INS Grant toward SCBA's bringing this fund to a total of \$850.00. The cost of one SCBA is \$750.00.

The Fire Department men serviced two fire trucks, swamp buggie and the water tanker. In the past few months the Fire Department has been on three fire calls and thirteen rescues. October 4, 2005, the fire department made 52 fire rescue call this year. Dan Miller and Dwight Bruns attended a meeting in September for National Incidence Management System. Dwight Bruns attended Worth County EMS meeting in October. Jeff Berg attended a continuing education symposium for First Responders. Criteria and application for being a Fertile Fire Fighter was updated and amended to meet government and state regtulations.

#### JANE E. EBAUGH 1914 - 2005

Jane E. Ebaugh, 91, of Forest City, died October 10, 2005 at the Good Samaritan Center in Forest City



Funeral Services were held Oct. 14, 2005 at the United Methodist Church in Forest City with Pastor Charles Wallace officiating. Burial was at Oakland Cemetery in Forest City.

Jane Ebaugh was born on April 29, 1914 in Brooklyn, IA, the daughter of Frank and Emma Lelia Talbott.

She received her elementary education in Brooklyn and graduated from Brooklyn High School in 1931. Jane attended Iowa State University in Ames, IA, graduating in 1937.

She began teaching in Fertile, IA and it was here that she met William Stanley Ebaugh. The two were married in Brooklyn at Jane's parents' home on June 20, 1940. The couple made their home in Fertile, and Jane quit teaching to raise a family. When World War II interupted, Stan went into the service and Jane began teaching in Fertile again. After the war, in 1946, the family moved to Forest City.

After her three children were older, Jane worked for Gulf Oil in Forest City and then worked in the Winnebago County Treasurer's Office, retiring when she was 65.

The was a long-time volunteer at the Good Samaritan Center and enjoyed caring for her elderly neighbors and friends. She was an active member of United Methodist Church in Forest City where she taught Sunday School and was involved with circle activities.

Jane is survived by her children and their spouses: Mike and Marlys Ebaugh of Forest City and Mary and Doug Hatlevig of Iowa Falls, IA; a sister, Nina Talbott, of Hermosa Beach, CA; one daughter-in-law, Janay Ebaugh; seven grandchildren, four great-granddaughters and several nieces and nephews.

She was preceded in death by her parents, her husband Stanley in 1973; her son, William in 2005; a brother, Robert; a sister, Mary; and two sisters who died in infancy.



### The Journey





### **CHOCOLATE WALNUT SQUARES**

From Kit Zirbel

1 cup butter softened

2 cups sugar

4 eggs, lightly beaten

1 tablespoon vanilla (this is correct amount of Van.)

2 cups flour

1/2 teaspoon salt

2 cups chopped walnuts

2 squares (1 oz. ea.) unsweetened chocolate, melted.

**FROSTING** 

5 teaspoons flour

1 cup milk

1 cup butter, softened

1 cup confectioners' sugar


In mixing bowl, cream butter and sugar. Beat in eggs & vanilla. Add flour & salt; mix well. Fold in walnuts. Spread half of the batter into a greased 9x13 baking pan. Add chocolate to the remaining batter, mix well. Carefully spread over batter in pan. Bake at 350° for 30-35 minutes or until cake tests done. Cool completely.

#### FROSTING -

Mix flour & milk in a saucepan. Cook and stir over medium heat until a thick paste forms, in about 10 minutes. Cool COMPLETELY.

In a mixing bowl, cream butter & confectioners' sugar. Add vanilla & mix well. Gradually add the milk mixture; Beat for 5 minutes. Frost Bars. Store in the refrigerator.

>Peal and dice extra tomatoes and put in plastic freezer bags and freeze for soups, hot dishes, etc. This is an easy way and great way to have tomatoes for special dishes and you haven't let your tomatoes go to waste.




