Citizen inquiry included information request about the tile in city streets. Yaggy-Colby will be consulted. Concern about a dead tree falling on a neighbor's home was brought to the attention of the council. Meeting adjourned.



Fern Midtgaard gave a presentation on "Mum Plants". This was very interesting and informative.



LEMON ICEBOX DESSERT

1-1/2 cups all-purpose flour

4-1/2 teaspoons sugar

3/4 cup cold butter

FILLING:

8 eggs separated

2 cups sugar divided

2/3 cup lemon juice

3 tablespoons grated lemon peel

1 tablespoon unflavored gelatin

1/2 cup plus 2 tablespoons cold water, divided

1/2 teaspoon cream of tartar

TOPPING:

1 cup heavy whipping cream

1 tablespoon confectioners' sugar

1 cup flaked coconut

1 tablespoon grated orange peel

In a bowl combine flour & sugar. Cut in butter until crumbly. Press into a greased 13x9 x2 baking dish. Bake at 350° for 18-20 minutes or until lightly browned. Cool

In a heavy saucepan, combine egg yolks, 1 cup ugar, lemon juice & peel. Sprinkle gelatin over 1/2 cup cold water; let stand for 1 minute. Add to the egg yolk mixture. Cook & stir over medium heat until mixture reaches 160° & coats a metal spoon. Remove from heat & cool.

In another saucepan, combine egg whites, cream of tartar & remaining sugar & water. Cook over low heat, beating with a hand mixer on low speed until mixture reaches 160°. Poor into a large mixing bowl and beat on high until soft peaks form. Gently fold into yolk mixture. Spread over curst.

In a mixing bowl beat the cream & confectioners' sugar until soft peaks form, spread over filling. Combine coconut & orange peel; sprinkle over top. Cover & chill for 4 hours or overnight. Refrigerate

leftovers. 12-16 servings.






