City Council Meeting Minutes June 20, 2006, 7:00 PM, City Hall

1.) Call to Order

The Fertile City Council met at 7:00 PM in regular session, June 20, 2006, at Fertile City Hall.

2.) Roll Call

Present were: Mayor Joyce Russell, Council members Jeff Berg, Tad Miller, Gail Shropshire, Patrick Renchin and City Clerk Eddie May. Absent: Council member Melanne Bang.

3.) Minutes Approval

Berg moved and Renchin 2nd to approve the May minutes. Motion Carried.

4.) Public Hearing on the SRF Loan

The Public Hearing to review the City's application for a State Revolving Loan Fund (SRF) loan from the Iowa Department of Natural Resources was opened by the mayor at 7:05 p.m. The mayor reviewed the City's sewer plan which included information relating to proposed improvements to the sanitary sewer collection system. It was reported that anticipated project costs were estimated to be \$476,600. The project will be partially funded with a \$300,000.00 Community Development Block Grant with the remaining costs to be financed with the SRF Loan. In addition to the proposed sewer improvements, the SRF loan will also be used to refinance \$160,000 in existing USDA – Rural Development debt that still is outstanding. The total SRF loan amount that has been applied for is \$340,000.00. The interest rate is 3.25%.

The City Clerk reported that there had been no written comments or concerns filed prior to the hearing.

There being no oral questions from the public at this hearing, the hearing was closed at 7:35 p.m.

In Attendance: City Officials as stated above, along with Residents: Evelyn Elthon of Fertile and Julie Jesson of Fertile.

5.) Vandalism Within the City

- Several reports of vandalism have been turned into the Worth County Sherriff's office this last month. The William Rhodes Island Park sign has been stolen. Garden Club Flowers have been uprooted and deposited into the Post Office Mailbox. Mail boxes in town have had their doors opened and flags raised, with mail reported missing. Trespassing of personal residences has occurred, along with defecation of property and distance phone calls have been placed. The electrical systems within the park have also been vandalized.
- The Worth County Sherriff's department has increased their patrol as a means to curtail this activity. The City is asking residents to keep their eyes open for possible illegal activity. If suspicious activity is noticed, please contact the Sherriff's Department immediately, so they can investigate. (800-458-1234)

7.) City Pick-up Truck

BREAD MAKER BUNS & CARMEL ROLLS By Rose Suby

1/3 cup sugar

2 Tbsp. Butter

Heat these 4 ingredients in Microwave for 3 minutes. Pour into Bread Maker Pan. Beat <u>2-3</u> <u>eqgs</u> with a fork and add to above. ADD - <u>3</u> <u>1/2 cups regular flour</u> and <u>2 1/2 tsp. yeast</u>. (1 small package) that has been dissolved in <u>1/4</u> <u>cup warn water</u> with <u>1 Tbsp sugar</u>. ADD to rest of ingredients and set machine on 'Dough'. I check the machine often as it may need more flour till it rolls freely from adhering to the sides and forms a ball. UNPLUG and let rise to the top. Punch down, shape into rolls & let raise. Butter top of buns and bake 350° around 20 minutes.

FOR CARMEL ROLLS:

1 cup Milk

3/4 cup salt

After raising once, roll out and spread with butter, cinnamon and brown sugar. Roll and cut. Place on Carmel sauce -

1 stick butter or oleo 1 cup Brown Sugar 1 1/2 tsp. Cinnamon 1/2 cup corn syrup

Bring to a boil, cool and add 1 tsp. Vanilla. Nuts or cherries may be added to the rolls if desired.
