City Council Meeting Minutes

December 6, 2005, 7:00 PM

City Hall

1.) Call to Order

The Fertile City Council met at 7:00 PM in regular session,
December 6, 2005, at Fertile City Hall.

2.) Roll Call
Present were Mayor Joyce Russell, Council members Jeff
Berg, Melanne Bang, Tad Miller, Gail Shropshire, and City
Clerk Eddie May.

3.) Minutes Approval
Tad Miller moved and Melanne Bang 2nd to approve the
November minutes.

4.) Public Hearing on Proposed Sewer Improvement Project and CDBG Grant Application Hearing was published in the Forest City Newspaper. No further discussion was made. Roll call vote made to continue the process.

5.) Waste Management

Margo Underwood was here to discuss the recycling program. She notified the City Council that they can increase pick-up to twice per month for .22 extra per month per household. Underwood also notified the City Council that recycling collection day will be changed from Tuesday to Thursday starting in January. Waste Management will be sending out an educational mailing regarding what can be recycled and when pick-ups are.

Discussion was made about empty houses. City Council agreed that anyone who does not utilize their garbage or recycling for a period time must notify the City Clerk directly in order for charges to be waived for that period. Tad Miller Moved, Melanne Bang 2nd, Jeff Berg declined to approve, change recycling to twice per month starting in January. Motion carried.

6.) Denny Bonwell

Denny Bonwell requested a licence for selling cigarettes and beer. City Council discussed the State regulations regarding this request. City Council postponed decision because Denny Bonwell was not in attendance.

7.) Community Protection Ordinance

A copy of the ordinance to restrict residency of sexual offenders prepared by the City Attorney was presented. A copy of the ordinance is available at City Hall.

Jeff Berg Moved, Tad Miller 2nd to adopt the ordinance. A role call vote was required: YES: Jeff Berg, Gail Shropshire, Tad Miller, and Melanne Bang. NO: no one declined.

Ordinance was adopted.

Jeff Berg Moved, Melanne Bang 2nd, to forgo the 2nd and 3rd hearings. Roll Call Vote: YES: Jeff Berg, Melanne Bang, Tad Miller, and Gail Shropshire. NO: no one declined.

Motion carried.

8.) Hazmat Ordinance

City Council will approach the City Attorney for the drafting of a new ordinance.

9.) Burn Pile Restrictions
Illegal burn materials have been continually placed into the burn pile such as bricks, garbage, leaves, etc. DNR will fine

the City if we burn illegal materials. The gate is now locked for the winter. The gate will be unlocked the last week of December and the first week of January for the disposal of Christmas trees. Discussion will be re-initiated in the spring for the next season's issues.

10.) Vandalism

City Council is asking parents to enforce the City Curfew ordinance which states that minors, 17 and under, cannot be off their property without an adult from 10:01 pm to 5:00 a.m. Melanne Bang will contact the County Sheriff's office to receive more information on the possibilities for a Community Watch Program.

11.) Mayor's Report

- Computer equipment will be installed in January for Worth County to locate cell phone callers during an emergency.
- Information for the CDBG has been sent to Marsha Cory, including pictures from the flooding submitted by residents.
- Mayor Russell and husband Buck hung Christmas lights this month. Darvin Stecker is fixing the burnt out lights.
- Mayor Russell attended a meeting in Northwood to discuss grants, fire dept, etc.
- City budget is due March 15th. We will publish in the newspaper by February 20th. We will approve the budget on March 7th.
- Dave Low will work for one more year with Warren.

12.) City Clerk's Report

- Financial statements for July through November were presented to the City Council.
- The FY 2005 Financial Report for the State has been published in the Forest City Summit. It will be sent to the State as soon as proof of publishing in received.

13.) City Maintenance Report

- Lagoon froze can't replace damaged drainage valve.
 Will replace when possible.
- Muscrat problem in the lagoon. Bruns asked for \$800 to repair their damage and for the Council to consider budgeting an amount for regular maintainance.
- USDA is coming to inspect the water/sewer system next week.
- Repairs were made on the city plow. Bruns requested that we begin to budget for replacement of the truck within the next 2 - 3 years.

14.) Approve Expenditures

Tad Miller moved, Gail Shropshire 2nd to approve the expenditures. Motion carried.

15.) Committee Reports

No committee reports were presented.

16.) Other Business

General discussion was made on maintaining City property values.

1.) Call to Order

The Fertile City Council met at 7:00 PM in regular session, January 3, 2006, at Fertile City Hall.

2.) Roll Call

Present were Mayor Joyce Russell, Council Members: Jeff Berg, Tad Miller, Gail Shropshire and Pat Renchin and City Clerk Eddie May. Absent was Melanne Bang.

3.) Minutes Approval

Mayor Joyce Russell found an error in December's Minutes as follows: the date of the next Council Meeting was noted as January 4, 2006 instead of January 3, 2006.

Jeff Berg moved and Gail Shropshire 2nd to approve the December minutes.

4.) Swear in New Council Members

Council Members Gail Shropshire and Tad Miller as well as Mayor Joyce Russell were re-sworn in. Pat Renchin was sworn in as a new Council Member to fill Paul Younger's vacancy.

6.) Proposed Amendment to the Snow Removal Ordinance

Mayor Joyce Russell and City Maintenance ManPresented an amendment to the Snow Removal Ordinance relating to accidental damage and right to removal of illegally parked property. The Ordinance is on file at City Hall and is posted at the City Library for citizen's review.

Jeff Berg Moved, Pat Renchin 2nd to approve Amendment to the Snow Removal Ordinance. Role Call Vote was unanimous. Carried. 2nd and 3rd Hearings were waived Jeff Berg, Gail Shropshire, roll call was unanimous. Carried.

7.) Mayor's Report

- Joyce and Warren met with Rural Water Association, an USDA approved service, for the City's required SEMS report. SEMS is required by the USDA as a part of our Emergency Management requirements.
- Dave Low reported to the DNR as requested
- City Attorney John Greve has initially stated that a hazmat ordinance would be difficult to legally pass because of discrimination against businesses in general. As long as a business is located within a commercial zone, and meets State and Federal regulations, they must be allowed to operate. Greve will meet with the Council

and concerned citizens at a future Council Meeting in order to discuss public safety issues.

8.) City Clerk's Report

- The purpose of the \$5.00 "Meter Fee" was brought up for discussion. The Council stated that the fee was initially set-up to cover ongoing maintenance on the water system. This was initially designated for Meter replacements, but was also intended for water tower painting and cleaning and other water system maintenance. Therefore the Council decided to re-name the fee to more accurately describe its purpose "Service Maintenance Fee."
- Discussion was also made in regards to the policy for late charges assessed to Utility Bills. Late charges have been assessed on only the water portion of the bill. The late charges were also being calculated on the immediate prior month of past due amounts only. The council agreed that the intent of the late charges are to cover the entire past due amounts including all services and all past due amounts. Late charges will not be assessed on past due late charges or taxes.

9.) City Maintenance Report

- In the absence of Warren Bruns, Jeff Berg or Tom Kirchbaum will operate the snow plow.
- A new time sheet will be prepared in order to break down the City Maintenance hours for water, sewer, parks, etc.

 Gail Shropshire moved, Tad Miller 2nd to approve the expenditures. Carried.
- 11.) Committee Reports
 No committee reports were presented.
- Budget Discussion
 Initial discussion was begun in regards to the 2006-2007
 Fiscal Year Budget.

MARJORY MASON 1903 -2005

Marjorie Mason of Boise, Idaho passed away on November 26, 2005. Memorial services were held December 11, 2005 at Boise First Congregational United Church of Christ in Boise, Idaho.

Maarjorie was born on Dec. 14, 1903, just three days before the Wright brothers' famous flight at Kitty Hawk. She was raised in Fertile, IA on a farm run by her parents, Sander & Carrie Sanderson, five brothers and one sister. Her Norwegian immigrant grandfather was a teacher and taught the last Winnebago Indian chief to live in that area to speak English. She saw the last Native American camp at Indian Rock and saw the first automobile drive into Fertile. Despite the difficult work and hardship of life on the farm, she managed to attend college and taught school at the tender age of 18.

Eventually Marjory met and married Earl Baker in 1924, who was also a teacher and principal. The couple moved to Colorado where she continued to teach in small schools, moving to a new one every few years. While they lived outside of Sterling, CO, she gave birth to her son, Richard, in 1925. On the drive home from the hospital with her newborn son, their car was overrun by a huge dust storm. The stories she told of the difficult life in the dustbowl were astounding.

World War II brought her back to teaching in Snyder and Monte Vista where the winter temperatures could dip to 50 low zero. Her son, Richard, enlisted in the Navy in 1942, serving for three years in the Pacific. It was shortly thereafter that she divorced and decided to continue her studies, earning her degree and life teaching certificate in 1948.

She moved to Twin Falls where she taught eighth-grade history and geography for six years. In 1954 she was offered a position in Mason City, IA where she taught junior high geography for 16 years. She remained in Mason City for nearly 10 years after retiring, deciding to move to Boise, Idaho, in 1979 to be near her two brothers and their families living there.

In Boise, she was active in her church and there met Floyd Mason who she married in 1979 (when she was 79 and he was 83). They were happily married for three years before he passed away.

On her 90th birthday she celebrated by flying in a hot air balloon; on her 95th she rode in a helicopter and on her 100th she rode in a sidecar of a brand new Harley Davidson motorcycle (which was broadcast on television).

Despite her being the eldest child and having some very serious health problems as a girl, she outlived all her siblings. Her incredible memory and ability to discuss current events and politics were difficult to match, even in her final days.





PHOENIX

The 4th day went without special incident and we reached Phoenix about 7 pm that evening. I allowed myself to be put on a leash and taken out on the grass with Muffy, although I felt greatly dissed. Harriet's son Jeff lives in an apartment and I was quite interested in a huge aquarium he has with large fish. The fish and I stared at each other but there was no way to get at them. I would not mind staying, for there were excellent hiding spots, but we spent all our nights in a motor home.

One night we were parked on a street called Hazelwood Avenue and I got free! Harriet took me out about 9 p.m. with Muffy, and when I tried to pull her in a different direction, my collar slipped right over my head. Imagine the ruckus that caused! There was a 15-foot strip of grass and trees and then an iron fence that protected an abandoned apartment complet.

The first thing I did was slip under that fence and make plans. The trees were low, with branches that were easily climable. The apartments had lights, but with my yellow-grey color I was almost invisible. I ducked back under the fence and let George get about 10 feet from me. Then, with him calling "Here, Angel, Come Here, Kitty", I dashed madly up a tree and looked down at him. Then, I slipped under the fence again and explored the apartments. There were stairs, which I could climb to the second floor. I even went across the street to some houses, even though I knew better than to cross streets! This was truly a high point in my adventurous life! About 2 hours later I was sitting in a tree about 20 feet from the camper, when I looked down and saw a slim yellow cat staring up at me. When I spoke to him, I found that he only spoke \$panish! He just sat there twitching his tail. I wondered how to get back safely to my camper, especially when he was joined by one of his friends! They did not climb the tree after me, thank goodness, but just stayed below looking up at me.

About that time George came out with a big light and shined on me and then on my two enemies. They slowly retreated around the corner and I decided to come back to the right side of the fence. Muffy came out and George fed her some of my treats, so I came over to get some. George grabbed me rudely by the tail and took me inside. Back in Iowa, I sometimes hang out with the cats down on the corner and just let them try and top that story!

After 3 days in Phoenix, it was on to California for us. Harriet has a great--grandson who is 11 months old, and she is anxious to have a look at him.

I keep trying to learn to drive like George, but the best I can do is sit on his lap and put my paws on the steering wheel. I can push some of the buttons on the console beside the driver, but all that does is extend the leveling jacks. That makes them start scraping and makes George very nervous.

A few nights later, we stayed at a place called Blithe, California. They did not have a Wal-Mart, so we stayed at a place called Albertsons. I heard him telling Harried the conversations he has had at coffee shops and sometimes the merit comment.

In Blithe, he met a man who called himself a Greyhound tourist. He traveled the entire United States by bus, stopping at various cities. The reason he was in Blithe was that his funds only lasted for half of the month and a friendly motel keeper in Blithe let him have a room for nothing. His other favorite city was Duluth, MN and his ambition was to be there in the winter for the ice fishing on the lake. He was clean, though a bit shabby, and kindly allowed George to buy him hot tea.

George says no one asks for money from him, but they always seem glad when he offers it. The natives say they only use it for drugs, but George is not too bright when it comes to money. I have never once heard of a panhandler approaching Harriet, but George tells of going to Tijuana, Mexico and having a whole flock of children follow him until his money was completely gone.

I Have Arrived on the Other Side

Hello friends in Fertile, Iowa!!

This is Arlene Lee and I am writing to you from the Dominican Republic. The ladies from the Reminder asked me to write a bit to tell you about what I am doing here.

The Dominican Republic shares the island of Hispanola with Haiti in the Caribbean Sea. It is about one third the size of Iowa, but has about 3 times the population. It is mountainous and has beautiful beaches and is the first place Columbus discovered when he came to the 'new world'

I am here to work as a missionary with an organization called Students International. The ministry focuses on community development and including visiting students in that process. By the term 'community development' I mean that we help communities to improve in healthcare, agricultural production, education, etc. as well as grow in their relationship with Jesus. We believe that the former things are part of the process of helping people to overcome sin in all areas of life. My focus will be agricultural ministry in a town called Los Higos. In addition to our long-term work in the community, teams of North American students (9th grade through college age) come for short-term trips to work along side us. I will translate for students and coordinate their time when they are visiting the ag ministry site.

I arrived on November 16. Since then I have used my time to get to know the other missionaries on my team, visit the ministry site, and participate in some long-term planning for the agricultural ministry. In January, I will go to another town for 3 months to study Spanish. When I return in April, I will begin full time ministry!

I would like to give you some glimpses into my daily life here in the Dominican



Republic, as well. I think the quickest and most fun way to do so would be to describe to you my experiences by using the 5 senses (an idea I got from some friends who did this while in Bolivia):

What I am hearing: loud music and fireworks (for Christmas), roosters crowing, motorcycles roaring, rustling palm branches, Spanish

What I am smelling: fresh lemons in my yard, breakfast cooking over fires, jasmine

What I am feeling: kids' fuzzy heads, soil under my fingernails, my hair blowing riding the motorcycle, itchy misquito bites

What I am tasting: fresh oranges, sweet lemons and coconut; moro (rice and beans); strong, sweet coffee; aujama, taijota, and yucca (different vegetables); mango yogurt

What I am seeing: small trucks overflowing with people, green mountains, old men playing checkers, beautiful faces of varying colors, kids in uniforms walking to school, geckos, a horse that wanders our neighborhood

The Fertile Church of Christ is my sending church, and I receive support from several individuals, including some of you who are reading this. Thanks for your support and for your prayers!

1935 SURPRISE APPLE CAKE From "Forgotten Recipes" book

2 cups graham cracker crumbs

2 Tbsp. Melted butter

1/2 tsp. Ground cinnamon

3 eggs

1 can sweetened condensed milk

2 Tbsp. Lemon juice

Grated rind of one lemon

2 cups applesauce

Mix graham cracker crumbs, butter & cinnamon; spread about 1/4 of crumb mixture on bottom of a buttered 10" cake pan. Separate eggs, & beat the yolks well. Add condensed milk, lemon juice, rind, & applesauce to beaten egg yolk. Beat egg whites until stiff, fold into milk mixture. Pour into cake pan and cover with remaining cracker crumbs. Bake 350° for 50 minutes. \$18 a week could feed 10 in 1935, capes were the fashion, and since there were no ball points, people wrote with fountain pens. Perhaps they used their \$2.50 Waterman to copy this recipe from a favorite magazine.






