

1.) Call to Order

The Fertile City Council met at 7:00 PM in regular session, February 7, 2006, at Fertile City Hall.

2.) Roll Call

Present were Mayor Joyce Russell, Council Members: Jeff Berg, Tad Miller, Melanne Bang, Gail Shropshire and Pat Renchin and City Clerk Eddie May.

3.) Approval of Minutes

Gail Shropshire moved, Tad Miller 2nd to approve the January Minutes. Carried.

4.) Public Hearing on Proposed City Budget

The 2005-2006 fiscal year budget was presented for a public hearing and final Council approval.

Jeff Berg Moved, Pat Renchin 2nd to approve the 2005-2006 fiscal year budget. Role Call Vote was unanimous. Carried.

- 5.) Mayor's Report
 - In January, Joyce met with other Worth County Mayors to approve the Worth County Assessor's Budget.
 - In January, Joyce became NIMS certified.
 - Joyce has contacted a potential purchaser of the current street light Christmas decorations. (These decorations are too heavy for the new street lights being installed this spring.)
 - Nettleton Excavating has been requested to bid done in the city park and in road repair for late early spring.
- 6.) City Clerk's Report
 - In January, the financial records were presented to Accountant Kris Urdahl. Kris made suggestions for consideration before we send the records to the auditor. Those suggestions are being investigated and implemented. For the CDBG grant, the City will be required to have an independent audit completed following this current fiscal year.
 - Due to limitations on the current water and sewer billing software, Eddie is researching a suitable replacement.
- 7.) City Maintenance Report
 - The weather has damaged several city water meters.
 Warren has replaced several meters recently and will be replacing a few more within the upcoming weeks.

- 8.) Approve Expenditures
 Pat Renchin moved, Tad Miller 2nd to approve the expenditures. Carried.
- 9.) Committee Reports
 No committee reports were presented.
- 10.) New Business
 - In regards to this spring, safety issues relating to children and traffic were discussed. The Council thanks all citizens for continuing to do their best to keep Fertile a beautiful and safe environment.
 - The Worth County Tractor Ride will begin their day trip from Fertile. More details are to come.
- 11.) Agenda Items for Next Meeting

TRIPLE BERRY COBBLER Blueberries, Blackberries, Red Raspberries

1/4 cup all-purpose flour

1/4 cup sugar (1/4 cup Splenda can be used, instead of sugar)

1/2 teaspoon baking powder

1/4 teaspoon salt

1/4 cup 2% milk

2 tablespoons butter/oleo, melted

3/4 to 1 cup of frozen mixed fruit

Vanilla ice cream, optional

In a small bowl, combine the flour, sugar, baking powder & salt. Combine the milk & butter; stir in the dry ingredients until smooth. Pour into 2 8 8-oz ramekins or custard cups that have been spayed with nonstick cooking spray. (Can also use small glass cake pan). Top with the berries. Bake 350° For 30-35 minutes or until fruit is tender. Serve warm with ice cream. 2 servings. You could double the recipe if you think guests might drop in for coffee-lunch!




