

City Council Meeting Minutes May, 24 2007, 7:00 PM, City Hall

1.) Call to Order

The Council Meeting scheduled for May 16, 2007 was postponed due to schedule conflicts.

The Fertile City Council met at 7:00 PM in regular session, May 24, 2007, at Fertile City Hall.

2.) Roll Call

Present were: Mayor Joyce Russell, Council Members: Jeff Berg, Loren Hoffman, Patrick Renchin, and City Clerk Eddie May. Absent were Council Members: Tad Miller, Gail Shropshire, and City Maintenance Manager Warren Bruns.

3.) Minutes Approval.

 Renchin motioned and Hoffmann 2nd to approve the April minutes. Motion Carried.

4.) Roads Proposal

- Mayor Russell proposed the blacktopping of the three remaining gravel alleyways within the city limits.
- Hoffmann motioned and Renchin 2nd to approve the paving of 3 alleys. Berg disapproved. Motion Carried.

5.) Mayor's Report

- The Sherriff has dealt with the canines that have been killing local chicken and sheep.
- The city has obtained a map showing the lot lines for the properties east of the water treatment plant. Trees will be thinned and/or removed in order to allow access to the north side of the affected properties.
- Mayor Russell presented an updated Emergency Operations Plan for the NIMS program. This is an Emergency Management program. Without the approval of this program, the city cannot receive Federal Funding.
- Mayor Russell would like to remind the residents to consider their neighbors by keeping properties free from noxious weeds, garbage and other hazards. The Worth County Weed Inspector is investigating several complaints within the City.
- The City has a contract which provides a new lawn mower every two years. Fertile received a new Country Clipper as part of this contract this spring.
- Mayor Russell has researched the cost of creating a skating park for area skateboarders. The cost for new equipment would be over \$34,000.00. The council suggested looking for used equipment. Our insurance has also notified us that they will not cover anything related to a skate park.
- The City would like to remind parents and youth that it is illegal
 to skateboard on any public road within the State of Iowa.
 Skateboards can be confiscated and fines can be given. The
 tennis courts have been designated as a skateboarding area.
- A teenager was recently found climbing the water tower. Please realize that this is a Federal offense.
- The ball diamond project is nearing completion. The picnic tables should be installed this weekend, and the playground should arrive on June 6 or 7.
- The City has installed a new volleyball net near the ball diamonds. Please feel free to use the court at your leisure.
- Alliant Energy has added a new street light to cover the playground equipment.

- Several houses within City limits will be foreclosed within the month of June. Information about each foreclosure is posted on each home affected.
- The City is applying for a \$5,000 grant for street signs and posts.
- Kids have been seen vandalizing postal boxes again this spring Please report any vandalism to the Post Office and the Sherriff's Office. We need everyone's help to stop the vandalism.
 Remember, this also is a Federal offense.
- The vandalism continued as the bridge lights were destroyed again. (THANK YOU DICK WORSLEY for replacing the lights!!!). Graffiti has also been found at City Hall and at the ball diamonds.
- It was asked if residents with pools would have to pay sewer usage on the portion of water used for filling their pools. The response was yes, they have to pay, even though the water does not go into the sewers. This is because it is currently impossible to measure the amount of water used for filling pools, watering lawns, washing cars, etc.
- Mayor Russell would like to thank Advantage Business
 Solutions for creating a website for the City of Fertile.
 (www.fertileiowa.us)
 The site looks great, check it out today.

6.) City Clerk's Report

- May presented the April financials.
- A lien was presented for overdue utility bills against the property at 205 East Main Street.
- Renchin moved, Berg 2nd to approve the lien. Motion Carried.
- May suggested to offer an option for City Utility bills to be emailed rather than mailed. He also suggested the use of PayPal for City utility payments on the website. The council agreed, as long as each option is purely voluntary for residents
- Hoffmann moved, Renchin 2nd to approve the set-up of a PayPal account. Berg abstained. Motion Carried.
- Hoffman moved, Renchin 2nd to approve the expenditures. Motion Carried.

7.) City Maintenance Report

- Bruns was absent due to conflicting City schedules. Mayor Russell presented his notes.
- A valve at the water plant is being repaired. Warren has had to manually fill the water tower in the interim.
- A damaged grinder pump for the lagoon is being replaced and we are re-building the damaged pump. We will then have 3 reliable grinder pumps.
- Both phases of the sewer project are now complete. Because we are under budget, we will be replacing 3-4 more manholes than planned. Heartland Asphalt will be black-topping the roads once they are finished with the highway 18 project in Clear Lake.

8.) Other Business

- The Fire Department will be straightening out the flag poles on the fire hydrants within the City. They will also be adding reflectors to make them more visible at night.
- Residents have been complaining about dog barking. Please respect your neighbors and follow the noise ordinances.
- Tom Kirshbaum voiced his opinion that City needs to dig out the culverts along the roadside. This will allow the storm water to flow to the river.
- Tom also voiced his opinion that the City should not lowered the water and sewer usage minimum. He is concerned that the current rates will discourage people from living in Fertile. The

 The DNR has approved the proposal to decrease the slope of the dike in the park. This will allow easier maintenance of the dike.

 Mayor Russell visited with the Humane Society about abandoned pets. The Humane Society cannot intervene unless the pets have noticeable signs of physical neglect.
 Mayor Russell confirmed with the Sherriff's Department that

any liens placed on the property must be paid before the new owners can get clear title, no matter how the house is sold.

 The playground equipment, picnic tables and benches have been installed up at the ball fields.

 A BIG THANK YOU to Haugen Lawn Service for donating the time and materials for spraying the ball fields.

The city will be sprayed for Mosquitoes three times this summer.

 Todd and Larry will receive a Governor's Award from Governor Chet Culver at the Iowa State Fair for pulling the boys from the river this winter.

 Fertile has put a bid in for the picnic tables from Hanlontown. If the City wins the bid, the tables will be place in the park.

 Three gravel alleys have been blacktopped. One more section of road remains to be done.

The Worth County Development Authority has granted \$2000 to the FB&I committee for Fertile Days. Fertile Days will be August 4th and 5th.

) City Clerk's Report

· May presented the May financials.

May suggested that the council consider placing a Franchise Fee
on the utility contracts the City has with Alliant. The Fee would
allow the City to continue to progressively handle City issues
such as the ailing city sewer system and prepare for future
expansion of services such as the Community Center.

Hoffman moved, Miller 2nd to approve the expenditures. Motion Carried.

.) Committee Reports

 Weeds & Garbage – solutions were suggested for the continual upkeep of the parks and recreational areas. Busy summer schedules, coupled with weather issues, have delayed trimming in several areas.

 Community Center – the committee has visited several area libraries, fire departments and community centers for ideas and suggestions. The committee is in the process of assembling an informational survey to be mailed to the residents of Fertile and the surrounding areas.

).) Other Business

 Tom Kirshbaum re-voiced his opinion that City needs to dig out the culverts along the roadside and repair the storm water system. He has placed new tile in his culvert and re-covered it.

0.) Next Meeting

 The Fertile City Council will meet at 7:00PM in regular session, July 17, 2007, at Fertile City Hall.

City Council Meeting Minutes June 19, 2007, 7:00 PM, City Hall

1.) Call to Order

The Fertile City Council met at 7:00 PM in regular session, June 19, 2007, at Fertile City Hall.

2.) Roll Call

Present were: Mayor Joyce Russell, Council Members: Jeff Berg, Loren Hoffman, Tad Miller, Patrick Renchin, Gail Shropshire, and City Clerk Eddie May. Absent was City Maintenance Manager Warren Bruns.

3.) Minutes Approval.

Berg motioned and Renchin 2nd to approve the May minutes.
 Motion Carried.

4.) Sewer Project Update by Yaggy Colby

• Terry McCarthy presented an update on the sewer project. Nettleton has completed phase I and phase II of the project, other than the patching of the roads. Because of cost saving efforts of Nettleton, Yaggy Colby and the City, we will be able to repair 4 more manholes than what was originally in the plan. Nettleton will make the extra repairs within the next 2-3 weeks. Heartland Asphalt will then patch the roads. The project should be completed by July 31.

5.) Curfew Ordinance and Juvenile Delinquency

- A group of concerned citizens asked Mayor Russell to invite Sherriff Ganz to attend the meeting to discuss the issues we h had over the last few years regarding curfew and delinquency. Sherriff Ganz reviewed the city ordinance pertaining to the curfew and found it to be enforceable.
- The curfew applies to anyone under the age of 17 between the hours of 10:01 p.m. and 5:00 a.m. The complete ordinance can be reviewed at City Hall.
- Ganz encouraged the idea to initiate a Neighborhood Watch Program. He also stated that any citizen can perform a citizen's arrest.
- If a citizen witnesses any questionable behavior they are encouraged to call the Sherriff's office at 800-458-1234. Fertile has 2 Reserve Officers living in city limits. Under normal circumstances a Deputy or a Reserve Officer can be on site within 10 minutes.
- Sherriff Ganz encourages the use of video cameras, cell phone cameras or audio tape to capture the behavior. He also stated that if those are not available, eye witness testimony does still stand-up in court.
- Ganz also encouraged the idea of placing municipal video surveillance systems in all public areas. The video feed could be recorded at City Hall and/or piped directly to the Sherriff's Office. The Council is still discussing this option.

6.) Mayor's Report

- Alliant Energy has submitted a 25 year contract to the City for franchise rights. The council is considering a Franchise Fee option. The Fee would be charged to the utility customer and paid to the City.
- Mayor Russell presented the Fertile Emergency Operation Plan which provides a plan of action and evacuation in case of disaster.







OUR FARM HORSES

From George Kisner's Book "Childhood on the Farm"

Even though our farm was small, it required a minimum of four and sometimes five workhorses to properly till it. The disc harrow needed four horses, the one bottom sulky plow took three horses, the corn planter two, the one-row cultivators took two each and even though these operations did not take place all at once, it seemed we were always short of horse power.

My earliest recollections were of two mares named Florie and Bess and a giant of a horse called Old Sam. Our father would make do by borrowing horses from a friendly neighbor, Irwin Owens. Mr Owens had vast acres, numerous horses and did not seem to mind our father's borrowing.

When I was Il years old, I was allowed to drive three horses on a drag-harrow while my father drove two horses on the corn planter. I worked ahead of the corn planter, so we were only a few rods apart. I was extremely proud of being part of this important farming operation, though my legs ached every night from walking in the loose ground all day. I was determined to do a man's work and would harness the horses by standing on a box in order to get the harness up over their backs.

Sometimes, when my father was working in a different field, my mother would go with me to see that I got in no trouble. Mostly though, the horses knew their jobs far better than I did and would patiently walk back and forth across the fields, obediently turning at the end of each row. Some farmers had special horses for each job, but my father was just lucky if he could get enough horses in the fields.

We children frequently rode the workhorses when they were not in use. We would lead them under a tree and one of us would hold the horse while the other mounted from a tree branch. We knew how to put a bridle on, and that was the only equipment needed for horseback riding. One time, when my sister Frances and I were riding double in the pasture, a pheasant flew directly in front of our horse, Wanda. We both fell off and Wanda went running back to the safety of her barn stall. I was not hurt but Frances' arm was broken and she had to wear a cast for several weeks. All the children were extremely envious! The two mares, Florie and Bess, had colts each year so soon we had Amos and Andy, and the next year, Belle and Wanda.

Amos and Andy and Belle all had untimely deaths with sleeping sickness, fence cuts and various illnesses. Wanda, with her placid disposition lived to the ripe old age of 20. Her only partner at the end in 1952 was a horse name Blackie, which my father had bought from a neighbor for one hundred dollars. By that time everything was done with tractors and we no longer relied on horsepower.,

Bars or Cake! Kit Zirbel

Beat 2 large eggs, add a brownie cake mix (any kind) and a can of Cherry Pie Filling. Beat by hand 'til thoroughly mixed. 350° oven in 9x13 pan for cake or 10x15 cookie sheet for bars.

OPTION: Use German Chocolate cake and German Chocolate frosting. (Keeps for days when covered.)

OPTION: Beat 2 large eggs and add a box of Spice Cake mix and a can of Apple Pie Filling. (You may want to cut the apples in smaller pieces) Mix well. Bars or Cake. Your choice.


Add chopped nuts or raisins for bars. Or make a brown sugar frosting.

350° for 20-25 minutes for bars.


"THE MANY USES OF 3% PEROXIDE"

- 1. Take a capful and rinse your mouth for 1 minute daily, & hold in your mouth for 1 minute. (It says right on the bottle 'mouth wash and gargle')
- 2. Clean your counters and table tops with peroxide to kill germs and leave a fresh smell. Can put a little on a dishrag or put in a spray bottle.
- 3. After rinsing off your wooden cutting board, pour peroxide on it to kill salmonella & other bacteria.
- 4. Got a fungus on your feet? Spray a 50/50 mixture of peroxide and water on the fungus. Let dry. Do this every night until fungus is gone.
- 5. Of course everyone knows it pays to clean up cuts and infections with peroxide. Soak the wound in peroxide (put on cotton ball) for 5 to 10 minutes, daily until wound is healed.
- 6. Of course you know that a solution of 50/50 sprayed on your wet hair after a shower & combed through, will gradually lighten your hair leaving it a natural highlighted.
