

ity Council Meeting Minutes ovember, 21 2006, 7:00 PM, City Hall

.) Call to Order

The Fertile City Council met at 7:00 PM in regular session, October 17, 2005, at Fertile City Hall.

.) Roll Call

Present were: Mayor Joyce Russell, Council Members: Tad Miller, Patrick Renchin, Gail Shropshire and City Clerk Eddie May. Absent: Council Member Jeff Berg and City Maintenance Manager Warren Bruns.

.) Minutes Approval

Miller moved and Renchin 2nd to approve the October minutes. Motion Carried.

.) Worth County Board of Supervisors and Sheriff's Department The Worth County Board of Supervisors and the Worth County Sheriff's Department are asking for a service rate increase for the next fiscal year. The last time they raised rates was in the 30's. The Council tentatively agreed to their request and will make the final decision during the budget hearings.

.) Anne Jones

Property owner Anne Jones has filed a complaint against the City regarding the repairs to the Dam made in the Mill. Jones was not in attendance. Her complaint was presented to the City Attorney, John Greve.

.) Appointment of a Council Member to fill Bang's Seat

No one has voiced their interest in filling the position vacated by Bang. This position will remain open. All interested residents may voice their interest, either in person or in writing, at the next Council meeting.

.) I/I Reduction Project

Update on Progress

- As of 11/13/06 the first phase of the project is 28% completed. The estimated completion date of the first phase is 12/31/06. So far, they are on schedule.
- The second and final phase is projected to be completed June 2007.
- The contractors and the City will maintain the loose gravel sections of road that have been torn up during construction. These sections need to settle before resurfacing in the spring. Please drive carefully through these sections.

Approval of Project Expenditures

 Miller moved and Shropshire 2nd, to approve project expenditures through CDBG draw #2. Motion Carried.

Public Hearing (1 of 2) Regarding Sewer, Water and Landfill/Recycling Rates

- Mayor Russell opened the public hearing at 8:10 p.m.
- May presented financial and utilization reports regarding the utilities. May also
 presented a sample rate structure from another City. May suggested using a rate
 structure that lowers the minimum charges and begins to charge usage with the
 first gallon. Utilization figures need to be double checked before finalizing the
 specific rates.
- The suggested rates for Garbage and Recycling are at a \$.50 per service increase starting January 1st.
- No comments were received from the public.
- The second hearing will be held at the next Council Meeting in December. It is projected that the rates will be finalized at that meeting.
- Mayor Russell closed the public hearing at 8:45 p.m.

).) Mayor's Report

- Minor road repairs will be made in the next month. Most repairs will be held off until spring due to the construction project.
- The old grey City truck was sold for scrap.
- Forest City Ford will be trading a pickup blade for the City's skid loader snow blower attachment.
- All surface rust was removed from the new City truck.
- New Christmas decorations have been installed in the park. Check them out at night! The FB&I committee will also be installing new decorations soon.
- New lightweight tables have been purchased for City Hall.
- A number of Shut-off notices were returned to City Hall un-received. They
 were sent certified mail and will be kept at City Hall for proof of submission.

10.) City Clerk's Report

- · May presented the October financials.
- The City received the full amount requested from a grant through the Worth County Development Authority. The grant goes to cover the costs of repairing the dam. The City would like to thank the WCDA for this opportunity.

- 3^{ru} Thursday. This will add 4 more collections throughout the year and will not cost the City any extra.
- May presented pricing for security cameras. Due to the increased vandalism this past summer, the Council is considering the installation of security cameras in many public areas.
- May presented cost figures for accepting credit cards as an option for utility payments. The Council agreed that the cost is too high. Interested residents are encouraged to look into auto bill pay services from their banks.
- May presented the suggestion to have CPA Larry Pump's office review the financials on a quarterly basis. The Council would like to know who can and will perform a full audit. May will present the Council with options at the next;
 Council meeting.
- May presented the 2006 Financial Report (The City's "tax return") for Council
 approval. It will now be published in the Forest City Summit. Renchin
 moved, Miller 2rd to approve the 2006 Financial Report. Motion Carried.

City Council Meeting Minutes December, 19 2006, 7:00 PM, City Hall

1.) Call to Order

The Fertile City Council met at 7:00 PM in regular session, December 19, 2006, at Fertile City Hall.

2.) Roll Call

Present were: Mayor Joyce Russell, Council Members: Jeff Berg, Tad Miller, Patrick Renchin, Gail Shropshire, City Clerk Eddie May and City Maintenance Manager Warren Bruns.

3.) Minutes Approval

Miller moved and Shropshire 2nd to approve the November minutes. Motion Carried

Public Hearing to Update Residents on the Improvements to the Sanitary Sewer System.

- The project involves the repair of sewer mains and sealing leaky manholes in order to minimize I/I in the system. The project is funded in part by a Community Development Block Grant.
- The goals of the project and project beneficiaries have not changed since the grant application was submitted to the State of Iowa in December 2005.
- Construction on collection system improvements began in October of 2006 and is approximately 75% complete. The grant is scheduled to close-out July 31, 2007.
- Project expenditures to-date include CDBG funds of \$85,390.00 and local funds of \$50,149.65.
- · Oral comments were presented as follows:
 - · Construction is completed for the winter. It will resume in the spring.
 - · The roads will be grated through the winter.
 - Road repair and re-seeding will occur in the spring and as the project closes.
- Miller moved, Renchin 2nd to approve the expenditures through CDBG draw #3, Motion Carried.

5.) Public Hearing Regarding Utility Rates

- May presented figures related to the utility income and expenses, including the new loans for the sewer upgrades.
- Rate adjustments were voted in as follows:
 - Garbage rates raise from \$11.00 to \$11.50
 - Recycling rates raise from \$1.75 to \$2.25
 - Water Minimum will stay the same at \$19.50 (\$14.50 minimum plus \$5.00 maintenance fee)
 - Water usage will stay the same at \$0.15 per 100 gallons
 - Water usage rates will begin at 100 gallons of usage, rather than 2100 gallons
 - Sewer Minimum will stay the same at \$25.00
 - Sewer usage will rise from \$0.15 per 100 gallons to \$0.25 per 100 gallons
 - Sewer usage rates will begin at 100 gallons of usage, rather than 2100 gallons
- The approved rates will affect households in differing degrees. Low usage residents may see a \$2-3 increase per month. Higher usage residents may see a \$7-10 increase per month.
- An explanation of the new rates will appear on the back of bills for the next several months.
- A copy of the resolution is available for review at City Hall by appointment.
 Miller moved, Renchin 2nd to approve Resolution 06-19-12 approving the new utility rates effective 1/1/2007. Role call vote was unanimous. Resolution Passed.

6.) Budget Hearing

- The Library and Fire Department will submit their budget during the January Council Meeting.
- No representative from the Little League was in attendance.
- All budgets must be submitted during the January Council Meeting.
- May submitted salary figures from the League of Cities.
- May presented a draft for a cafeteria plan for City employees.

7.) Mayor's Report

- . The old City truck was sold.
- The City purchased a 1993 International plow truck. The new truck is 10
 years newer than our previous truck. It also has a shaker box, upgraded
 spreader and a bottom blade that the old truck did not have. The City has
 attached the old plow blade to the new truck. The old truck will be placed for
 sale with sealed bids taken through January.
- All curb stops within the city limits are now functional. Nettleton will bill the city for the improvements. The city will bill each resident.

- The City Attorney has served papers to several residential properties who
 where not in compliance with safety and beautification ordinances. The
 property owners have until the end of December to comply with the ordinance
 before further legal action is taken.
- The FB&I committee has purchased the new street light decorations. Hare Electric donated their boom truck and labor to hang the decorations. Thank you Fred and Tom.
- The City will be writing a grant for new picnic tables, benches and playground
 equipment for the park and the ball fields.

8.) City Clerk's Report

 May presented the November financials. The City is on track with most budget line items. All out of order items have been explained to the Council.

9.) City Maintenance Report

- Nettleton and Bruns have been working to repair the lagoons. All repairs will be completed in December.
- Bruns has noticed a considerable difference in sewage intake since the project has begun.

10.) Approve General Expenditures

Renchin moved, Miller 2nd to approve the expenditures. Motion Carried.

11.) Other Business

- The FB&1 committee requested the organization of a committee for the Fertile Community Center. May will present a charter for the committee at the January Council Meeting.
- Loren Hoffman voiced his desire to fill the vacant Council seat.

12.) Next Meeting's Business Topics

13.) Upcoming Meetings

- The Fertile City Council will meet at 7:00 PM in regular session, January 17th, 2006, at Fertile City Hall.

City Council Meeting Minutes January 16, 2007, 7:00 PM, City Hall

1.) Call to Order

The Fertile City Council met at 7:00 PM in regular session, January 16, 2007, at Fertile City Hall.

2.) Roll Call

Present were: Mayor Joyce Russell, Council Members: Jeff Berg, Tad Miller, Patrick Renchin, Gail Shropshire, City Clerk Eddie May and City Maintenance Manager Warren Bruns.

3.) Minutes Approval

Miller moved and Shropshire 2nd to approve the December minutes. Motion Carried.

4.) Presentation of Community Center Project Committee

- May presented a charter to establish a committee which will facilitate the planning, preparation and follow through necessary to assist the city Council in the construction of a new Community Center.
- The charter will be mailed with invitations for various community organizations to participate in the committee.
- Resolution: Renchin moved, Shropshire 2nd to pass resolution 07-01-16 establishing the Community Center Project Committee, Roll call vote was unanimous. Motion Carried.
- Renchin moved, Shropshire 2nd to appoint Eddie May as the chairman to the Community Center Project Committee. Roll call vote was unanimous. Motion Carried.
- The first meeting for the Committee is set for Tuesday, February 6 at 7:00 at City Hall. All interested Residents are invited to attend.

5.) Budget Hearing

- The Library submitted their budget, requesting an 11% increase from last year. The increase will help offset salary benefits.
- The Fire Department submitted their budget, requesting a 47% increase from last year. The increase is for training and new equipment.
- The Little League submitted their budget, requesting a 40% increase from last year. The increase will help provide upgrades to the ball fields.
- Mayor Russell laid out several key elements to this year's budget including increased Sherriff and ambulance fees. ·
- The council discussed wages for all City employees.
- The Council, in order to match other Iowa cities with similar population, proposed an increase in the Council Member fees and Mayor's fees. The Council also discussed the possibility of hiring Joyce Russell to act as the City Manager in regards to the duties she performs above and beyond the Mayoral position. A public hearing will be held during the next Council meeting to approve an amendment to the City Ordinances regarding these fees.
- The Budget Hearing will continue at the next Council meeting.

6.) Mayor's Report

- The Fire Department recently received a new fire truck. Look for Engine 310 to be on the roads soon!
- A grant will be written to the WCDA for playground equipment, picnic tables and park benches for the ball fields. (New equipment for the Island Park will be requested in the following grant.) Application must be presented to the City Clerk by February 15th for any other City organization who would like to add their project to this semester's WCDA grant.
- The new City snow plow faced its first Fertile challenge, Besides a few minor "breaking in" issues, the truck performed wonderfully. New door signs have been installed on the truck - look for Warren on those snowy days ahead.
- Alliant Energy repaired the street light by the Church Apartments. Alliant has been notified of the broken light on West Main.

- · Demolition on the old school gymnasium is nearing completion. The ground will be seeded. No plans for the property have been announced - it will take some time for the ground to properly settle.
- Several Christmas lights, as well as the lamp on the footbridge, were broken over New Years. The City will be working with the Sherriff's Department to install surveillance cameras this spring, in order to curb future vandalism.

7.) City Clerk's Report

 May presented the December financials. The City is on track with most budget line items, but needs to watch the bottom line. All out of order items have been explained to the Council.

8.) City Maintenance Report

• Bruns stated that the lagoon generator is failing to start due to freezing gas lines. Discussion was made as to a solution. Bruns will investigate further.

9.) Approve General Expenditures

• Renchin moved, Miller 2nd to approve the expenditures. Motion

10.) Other Business

- The Fire Department asked that the following officers be appointed, by the Council, as Board Members of the Fire Department: Jeff Berg - Fire Chief, Josh Miller - Assistant Chief, Mike Dahn - Secretary, Dan Miller - Treasurer, John Jordan, Dwight Bruns and Dan Lee -Medical Director, Safety and Training Officer, Bruce Waddington -Maintenance Director.
- Renchin moved and Shropshire 2nd to approve the Fire Department Board Officers. Motion Carried.


SENIORS



My first years of school were at a country school. It was a small one-room building with two outdoor toilets in the back. One building designated "Boys", the other "Girls". In complete charge was one teacher (always a lady) and usually eight or ten students, depending on the size of the families. The grades included first through eighth and sometimes only one or none to a grade. The children always walked to school.

Our farm was about one and one-half miles from the school following the road or half that distance cutting across the fields. I was only five the first year but my two older sisters looked after me and probably would even carry me part of the way if I whined enough.

One day in the very late fall, a sudden blizzard struck. There was no radio or telephone at the school, so there was no advance warning whatsoever. The fierce snow and wind made visibility only about 50 feet. The temperature was also rapidly dropping toward zero. The teachers was only about 20 years old and did not know what to do. It was very apparent to her that she could not send the children out in the storm to go home. We children thought it great fun and ran from window to window watching the snow pile into huge drifts.

At that time a big wagon pulled by two farm horses appeared out of the storm. It was my father! He had come to see everyone safely home! Quickly, he banked the fire in the potbellied wood stove and locked the schoolhouse door. Then he loaded everyone on the wagon. The children were always warmly dressed, but the teacher always wore a dress and light stockings. My father brought a blanket to wrap around her and there was loose straw in the wagon box for the children to huddle in. The sides of the wagon protected us from the icy wind.

When the teacher and neighbor children had been delivered safely to their homes, the snow was blowing so bad my father could no longer see to drive! He loosened the reins on the horses and told them to take us home. Then he got down in the straw with us children and tried to stay warm.


Our two horses, Florry and Bess, wanted nothing better than to return to their warm stall with plenty of hay. After a bit, we raised up and peered out. Sure enough, we were pulling up the long driveway to our house! Our father stopped in front of the house to let us off and then took the horses to the barn. We ran into the house and told our mother about the fun we had had. The next day the storm had passed and school was held as usual.






