City of Fertile

City Council Meeting Minutes August 21, 2007, 7:00 PM, City Hall

1.) Call to Order

The Fertile City Council met at 7:00 PM in regular session, August 21, 2007, at Fertile City Hall.

2.) Roll Call

Present were: Mayor Joyce Russell, Council Members: Jeff Berg, Loren Hoffman, Tad Miller, Patrick Renchin, Gail Shropshire, City Maintenance Manager Warren Bruns and City Clerk Eddie May.

3.) Minutes Approval.

• Renchin motioned and Berg 2nd to approve the July minutes.

Motion Carried.

4.) Public Hearing - Alliant Energy Franchise

- A public hearing was held in order to hear the public's opinion on the 25 year contract with Alliant Energy for the electric utility.
- There were no comments presented from the public.
- The Council thanked Alliant for their exceptional service.
- Renchin moved, Shropshire 2nd to waive the 2nd and 3rd hearings. Motion Carried.
- Hoffman moved, Berg 2nd to approve the 25 year contract.
 Roll call vote was unanimous. Motion Carried.

5.) Sewer Project – Final Acceptance and Payment Approval

- Terry McCarthy from Yaggy Colby presented the final acceptance and payment information to the Council.
- The project has been completed. A 5% retainage fee is being held for 30 days for the completion of any known tasks. If any resident has noticed any incomplete repairs, please notify Mayor Russell within the next 15 days.
- The repairs to the system are covered the next two years. If any repair needs to be re-repaired, it is covered by the project guidelines.
- Miller moved, Renchin 2nd to approve the final acceptance and payment. Roll call vote was unanimous. Motion Carried.

6.) Utility Rates for Apartment Complexes

- Gary Michelson, the owner of the Church Apartments voiced his
 concerns about the utility rates for the apartments. The City has
 historically charged minimum fees for each apartment, no matter
 how many meters are installed. He is asking for a reduced rate,
 since he is paying for multiple residencies on one lot.
- The Council has asked May to report the average usage rates for each complex within the City limits.
- The City Council will address this issue at the next Council Meeting.

7.) Blacktopping City Streets

- The City received bids from Heartland Asphalt and North Iowa Sand & Gravel for blacktoppir. the remaining streets to the East of First Street.
- The City has \$20,000 budgeted for road repair. The extra road repairs made after the sewer project came to \$8400. This leaves \$11,600 remaining for additional road repairs. The bids came in around \$20,000. Because the City did not receive the entire Roads budget last year, the Council has decided to wait until spring to make the suggested road repairs.

• Miller moved, Renchin 2nd to reject all road repair bids. Motion Carried.

8.) Mayor's Report

- David, Dwight, Dick and Warren Bruns along with Buck Russell, pulled out the rotted tree which fell into the river.
- Titles for the Fire Trucks have been ordered by Mayor Russell.
- Larson Plumbing and Heating installed a new water fountain up at the ball fields.
- Most of Fertile Days was rained out, but a Big Thank You goes out to all who volunteered to make the events happen in spite of the rain.
- Work orders for mowing the bank-owned properties have been made. If the properties do not get mowed, the City will mow.
- Buck and Mayor Russell hung new flags down Main Street.

9.) City Clerk's Report

- May presented the End of Fiscal Year financials with the Administrative Allocation. The end of the year financials will be submitted to the State with postings submitted to the Fertile Reminder and the Forest City Summit.
- May presented the notice of outstanding obligations (loan balances) that was reported to the State.
- May presented this fiscal year's budget by fund.
- · May presented July's financials.
- May met with Electronic Engineering to discuss the security camera system for the City. They will present a bid before the next Council meeting.
- Denny and Sharon Ganz will be resigning as Meter Readers this fall. A Big Thank You to Denny and Sharon for all their hard work. Buck Russell has offered to read the Meters.
- Shropshire moved, Miller 2nd to approve Buck Russell for the Meter Reader position. Motion Carried.
- The Fire Department and the Library are working together to write a \$90,000 grant to the WCDA. The Fire Department will be requesting \$64,000 for a truck chassis. (They will be asking for another \$72,000 during the next grant application for the truck apparatus.) The Library will be asking for \$16,000 for new computers, desks, chairs, a copier, fax machine, and several mp3 players to be used with a new audio book program.
- Renchin moved, Miller 2nd to approve the expenditures. Motion Carried.

10.) City Maintenance Report

- Bruns reported that the fill from the burn pile and road repairs
 has been used up at the ball fields for a parking lot and at the park
 as the dike walls.
- Bruns requested the approval to purchase a tool set. The council approved of the purchase.

11.) Committee Reports

• Community Center – The committee is putting together an informational survey to send to in-town and area residents regarding the need for and ideas for the facility. They plan on presenting this survey to the Council next month

12.) Next Meeting

- The Fertile City Council will meet at 7:00PM in regular session, September 18, 2007, at Fertile City Hall.
- 13.) Adjourn Renchin moved, Shropshire 2nd to adjourn. Meeting adjourned.





Caramel Pull Apart Rolls

24 frozen dinner rolls (cut in half) 1 cup brown sugar 1/2 cup butter (oleo) melted 2 Tbsp. Milk

1 large box vanilla pudding (cooked variety)

1/2 tsp cinnamon

12 cup chopped pecans (optional)

MIX: Melt butter. Mix in brown sugar, milk, pudding, cinnamon and nuts.

Grease a 9x13 inch pan. Arrange one layer of cut in half dinner rolls.

Pour half of brown sugar mixture over first layer.

Add second layer of cut in half dinner rolls and pour the rest of the brown sugar over the top.

Spray a sheet of tin foil with Pam and cover tightly over rolls. Let stand at room temp. overnight.

Next morning, uncover and bake for 25-30 minutes at 350°.

Let stand for five minutes and then invert onto a platter.




