From George Kisner's Childhood on the Farm

When I was 4 years old, my father decided to try sheep raising for profit. He went out and bought 10 Merino ewes from our neighbor, Jim Hanson. He needed a buck sheep also and found one over by Pilot Knot, which he purchased from Val Kiefer. He put the sheep in a small pasture north of the apple orchard and my job was to fill their water trough every day.

The ewes and I got along fine, but from the first meeting I was terrified of the buck. I would warily watch him as I carried a bucket of water over to the trough and at the first ominous sign, I would drop the bucket and get over the fence.

This irritated my brother Charles to no end and he would tell me over and over that if I did not run, the buck would not chase me. This philosophy was well and good for a 200-pound boy that played football for Waldorf College, but for a 50-pound 5 year old it made no sense at all. He was determined, however, that I should overcome my fear of the buck, so one day he took me out in the middle of the small pasture.

"Now", he said, "You just stand here and hold your ground and the buck will back off and not hurt you."

With this, he walked away outside the fence. Now the buck had been standing with the rest of the sheep watching the proceedings with great interest and as soon as he realized that I was all alone in the middle of the pasture, he shook his tail, lowered his head and ran toward me. I promptly turned and ran as fast as I could for the safety of the fence, screaming as loud as I could for my mother. I reached the safe zone just in time and had to endure the scorn of my brothers and sisters from that day forward.

They say animals have a finely tuned sense to see fear in humans, but it did not take any great psychic to know what a small boy was feeling, running as fast as he could, screaming all the way!
