

City Council Meeting Minutes July 21, 2009, 7:00 PM, City Hall

Call to Order & Roll Call

Present were: Mayor Joyce Russell; Council Members: Jeff Berg, Penny Miller, Tad Miller, Cindy Peters, and Pat Renchin; Maintenance Manager Craig Koch and City Clerk Eddie May.

Minutes Approval

Jeff motioned, Tad 2nd to approve the June minutes. Motion Carried.

Pat Hyde - Curb Stop & Utility Bills

The curb stop at 308 West Main Street has been damaged and the water meter
has been removed. It is the property owner's responsibility to fix the curb stop
and the resident's responsibility to pay the past-due utility bills.

Mark Davis - Letter from Attorney

- Davis received a letter from the City Attorney in regards to non-conformance with the City's nuisance ordinances. Davis questioned how the property was a nuisance. Tad mentioned that the uncovered foam insulation was a fire hazard. Mayor Russell also stated that the unfinished building and grounds were deemed "unsightly structures" according to the State Code.
- Davis questioned if the Council was going to address other properties in town.
- The Council assured him that they have, are in the process of, and will continue to address issues as time and resources permit.
- Davis agreed to clean up the grounds within 21 days and to side the home within six months.

Tim Tuttle - 1st Street Drainage Issues

- Tuttle brought drainage issues along 1st Street to the attention of the Council.
 Tuttle stated that the sides of the drainage ditches are higher than the road,
 therefore they not allowing water to run off the road into the ditch. The water
 is running off via their driveway and thereby washing out the driveway.
- Mayor Russell stated that she would investigate various possibilities for fixing the situation suggested by Tuttle and the Council.

Water Tower Paint & Repair - Service Contract

 Cindy motioned, Pat 2nd to approve a contract with Watertower Paint & Repair in the amount of \$1550. Motion Passed.

Mayor's Report

- On July 8th, City Attorney John Greve attended a final hearing with the owners of 115 West Main Street in regards to non-compliance with the City Nuisance Ordinances. The owners have started work on all areas of the agreement and will be completing work this summer. As long as the work is completed on time, the case against the owners has been resolved.
- Mayor Russell and City Attorney John Greve will be going to court against the owner of 302 West Main Street in regards to non-compliance with the City Nuisance Ordinances.
- Heartland has completed this year's road construction. The City anticipates
 the re-surfacing of 1st Street later this summer by the County. The City will
 continue to re-surface the remaining streets as soon as financing allows.
- Larsen Plumbing has installed a new well pump at the water plant.
- As part of a WCDA grant, Hare Electric has installed a natural gas powered generator at the water plant. Two manholes have been replaced by Nettleton Excavating, and two pumps in the water plant will be replaced as part of the same grant.
- A BIG THANK YOU to Winnebago Cooperative Telephone Association (WCTA) for sponsoring a Kids Pedal Tractor Pull on July 9th. Due to inclement weather, the event was held in the new Fire Department building rather than on Main Street.
- Fertile Days is scheduled for August 1st and 2nd. The agenda is online at <u>www.fertileiowa.us</u> and on cable channel 2.
- The City will be spraying for mosquitoes on the 29th and 31st of July.
- There were 12 shut off notices sent out for un-paid utility bills. Five have made arrangements for payment, the rest are scheduled to be shut-off. If you

- receive a shut-off notice, please contact City Hall to make arrangements to avoid shut-off.
- Heavy trucks, fully loaded, have been entering the park. New weight limit signs are being posted. They can potentially damage the road and bridge.

- Eddie presented the Fiscal Year-End financials.

- Penny motioned, Tad 2nd to approve a \$1550.99 lien against the property at 302 West Main for un-paid utility & maintenance bills. Resolution Passed.
- Cindy motioned, Pat 2nd to approve the filing of a small court claim against the resident at 308 West Main in the amount of \$295.62 for un-paid utility bills. Resolution Passed.

Maintenance Report

- The transmission in the truck had issues after doing a lot of towing. The issues have been resolved.
- A bracket on the mower broke and was repaired as part of our service agreement
- Craig has been doing a lot of mowing, spraying and trimming. He has
 cleaned out the point, to allow for more fishing and better surveillance.
- Craig has found cars parked too far down the point; please do not park below the rock line.

Other Business

 The Fertile Garden Club requested permission to install apparatus for hanging flowers near the street lights on Main Street. The Council requested that they submit pictures and specifications for the apparatus in order to verify that they will be compatible with our street lights.


Ole met a guy the other day who is half Norwegian and half Palestinian Arab. His name? "Yasser Yubetcha."




The July meeting was a trip to Decorah. We left Fertile around 8:30 and spent the day enjoying many interesting places.

2 eggs

1 box (3 oz) instant pudding mix

1 pkg. (8 oz.) Cream Cheese

1 can crushed pineapple (small)

8 oz. container frozen whipped topping For the cake—combine cake mix, sour cream, eggs, peach pie filling, mix with a fork and pour into an 18 inch jelly roll pan. Bake at 350° F. For 20-30 minutes. Cool

Beat pudding into cream cheese Mix in pineapple Fold in Whipped topping SPREAD onto cooled cake Keep refrigerated until ready to serve.




