Call to Order & Roll Call

Present were: Mayor Joyce Russell; Council Members: Jeff Berg, Penny Miller, Tad Miller, Cindy Peters, and Pat Renchin; City Clerk Eddie May and Maintenance Manager Craig Koch

Minutes Approval

 Pat motioned, Jeff 2nd to approve the October minutes. Motion Carried.

Mayor's Report

- Alice in Horror Land, the Library's Halloween party, was a success.
 Approx. 95 people rode the bus. A Big Thank You to the Library and Friends for the fun!
- Mayor Russell provided a copy of the City's Emergency Operation Plan to the City of Hanlontown to help in the development of their plan.
- 42 residents turned out for the City Elections last month. Mayor
 Russell was re-elected by receiving 38 votes. There were 4 write-ins
 for the Mayor's position. Council members Penny Miller, Tad Miller
 and Pat Renchin were all re-elected by receiving 33, 40 and 40 votes
 respectfully. There were 10 write-ins for Council Member positions.
- The Council encourages community members to become involved in their local government by attending Council Meetings and letting your voices be heard.
- Mayor Russell and Craig hung Christmas lights on the bridge. Lights will be put up downtown shortly after Thanksgiving.
- The City received a grant for \$53,000 from the Worth County Development Authority on the 16th. This money is from the proceeds of the Diamond Joe Casino in Northwood. It will be used to purchase the apartments east of the library. It also covers the cost to inspect for and remove asbestos, and to level the lot. This is being done in preparation for the Community Center, Library and City Hall municipal building project.
- A Big Thank You to the Worth County Engineers for blacktopping 1st street. The shoulders and painting is scheduled to be done before winter.
- Water Tower Paint and Repair will be performing maintenance on the water tower before winter as well.





She taught school for 37 years, most of which was for the North Central School District, Hanlontown center.


She was an avid outdoor person, loved to take long walks, garden and fish.






