

Minutes Approval

- Berg motioned & Peters 2nd to approve the December minutes with a correction as follows. Motion Carried.
- <u>Peters</u> motioned and Miller2nd to approve the Central Disposal systems/Winnebago County Sanitary Landfill Planning Area 2009 Comprehensive Plan.

Iowa Municipal Water Association Well Head Protection Plan

- Peters motioned & Renchin 2nd to approve the Public Water Supply Wellhead Protection Regulations Ordinance. Role Call Vote – unanimous. Motion Carried.
- There will be a public hearing at the next Council Meeting to approve the Ordinance.

Mayor's Report

- Mayor Russell received a \$4,109 quote for the purchase and installation of a door wide enough and tall enough to pull the snow plow into the old Fire Station. We will be getting a quote for the extra carpentry needed to enlarge the current door opening.
- The City will be writing a WCDA grant for a generator and two water pumps for the
- The City has turned in a Community Grant application through the Alliant Foundation for a new emergency siren.
- Mayor Russell has been participating in several area budgeting meetings.
- The City will be forwarding information to the City Attorney pertaining to three property owners who have not properly responded to Ordinance violations.
- Two meters froze during the recent cold spell. They have been replaced. Be sure to watch the water lines in your home to be sure they have proper heating available.
- Appraisers from Des Moines will be in Fertile within the next several months. They have been hired by the County to perform independent assessments of all property in Worth County. Property owners are required by law to allow them access.

- May presented the December financials.

City Maintenance Report

- The power steering was repaired on the pick-up truck. The batteries and cables were replaced on the snow plow. There was a valve that broke on the skid loader. All this happened within a few day window.
- Craig has been plowing between 2:30 and 4:00 am.

- Vehicles and property not properly moved from the streets are subject to damage.



OUR FIRST MECHANICAL CORN PICKER

From George Kisner's Book "Childhood on the Farm"

The change from harvesting corn by hand to mechanical nach was slower than the oat and wheat machines. The horse drawn machines had a huge bowl wheel that turned the machinery. Corn pickers were much more complex and more than one wheel rolling on the ground could handle. Therefore, it was not until tractors were developed with a power-takeoff shaft in the early 1930's that mechanal pickers made their appearance.

My father purchased his first corn picker in 1946. By that time he owned an Oliver-Hart Parr tractor with rubber tires. There were still no brakes on it but it was a big improvement from the old McCormick Deering.

The picker was a one-row John Deere. Horses were still part of the operation and were used to pull the loads of corn to the corncrib. The picker required 4 corn rows to operate on and had a spout conveyer coming off to one side. The wagons with long horse tongues were fastened to a sturdy steel frame attached to the picker. The tongue went through a slot and there was a chain to pull the wagon with and it could be adjusted to fill different parts of ther wagon.

Going down a steep hill, it would roll ahead so fast it would almost throw the tractor sideways. Our dog, Skippy, always accompanied us when we worked. One day, while running alongside the tractor, he scared up a rabbit. He chased the rabbit as fast as his three legs could carry him. When the rabbit ran straight into the corn picker, Skippy foolishly followed. The rabbit was never seen or heard from again. After being buffed about by chains and rollers, Skippy was deposited on the wagonload of corn. We gave Skippy a hero's reward after listening to the story that evening from our father! A neighbor

ted one time that he had picked eleven loads in one day. This was about 450 bushels of corn and sounded almost miraculous!







2008 with Pastors Doug Farrell and Steve Hill officiating. Burial was in Brush Point Cemetery, rural Fertile.



MEATBALLS

2 eggs

1 envelope onion soup mix

1/2 cup seasoned bread crumbs

1/4 cup chopped dried cranberries

2 tbsp. Minced fresh parsley

1 1/2 pounds lean ground beef

SAUCE:

1 can [16 oz] whole-berry cranberry sauce

3/4 cup ketchup

1/2 cup beef broth

3 tbsp. finely chopped onion

2 tsp. Cider vinegar

Combine eggs, soup mix, bread crumbs, cranberries and parsley. Crumble beef over mixture and mix well. Shape into 1 inch balls; place 12-14 balls on a microwave-safe plate. Cover with waxed paper; microwave on high for 3-4 minutes or until no longer pink. Remove to paper wels to drain. Repeat with remaining meat-palls.

In a 2 quart microwave-safe dish, combine sauce ingredients. Cover & microwave on high for 3-4 minutes or until heated through. (3 doz.)


