

City of Fertile

City Council Meeting Minutes February 17, 2009, 7:00 PM, City Hall

Call to Order & Roll Call

Present were: Mayor Joyce Russell, Council Members: Jeff Berg, Tad Miller, Cindy Peters, Pat Renchin, Gail Shropshire, City Maintenance Manager Craig Koch, and City Clerk Eddie May.

Minutes Approval

 Renchin motioned & Shropshire 2nd to approve the Jan. minutes. Motion Carried.

Tom Quinten

 Tom voiced concern about his recent meter readings. The City estimated one bill, since the actual reading showed negative usage. The estimate was less than his average usage. Tom brought in a current reading which showed an increase from last month's reading. Warren and Craig said they would go the next day and investigate.

Worth County Sheriff's Department

- Chief Deputy Sheriff Dan Fank announced that the department recently confiscated \$104,000 from a drug case. He also mentioned that they have a new canine unit provided by donations. He re-iterated the open door policy that the new Sheriff has and encourages input from citizens. He then opened the floor up for questions.
- One citizen asked about stop sign enforcement throughout the city. Sheriff Fank said they would patrol more often. He also stated that the department has a new speed trailer that records vehicle speeds and can alert a nearby officer of that speed. He said that the officer can write a ticket without alerting the driver.
- Another question was raised as to the number of available officers. He stated that there are 7 active reserve officers in the county, with 2 of them residing in Fertile.
- Another question was raised regarding the Federal Stimulus package. Sheriff Fank stated that the department was financially fine and that the department hopes the package will allow unemployed residents to return to work.

Terry McCarthy – Yaggy Colby – Community Center/Library

- Eddie met with Yaggy Colby this morning to present the research and tentative plans drawn up by the Community Center Committee, approved by the Library Board Monday night's board meeting and by the City Council at December's council meeting. The tentative plans include a new building for the library and community center. In this plan, the current library would be renovated for use as a city hall and the previous fire station would be renovated for use as the city maintenance shed.
- Terry presented a proposal to offer Architectural services for the new Community Center/Library. The services would include a building program assessment (a study of what the city needs for space), a schematic site plan (overhead view), basic building floor plans, exterior 3D model and renderings (with the ability to rotate and "walk through" the design), and a construction cost

- estimate. The services would be billed at an hourly rate not to exceed \$9,500.
- The architectural renderings need to be created before any fundraising and grant writing could commence. The Community Center Fund and the Library currently have the funding available, in non-tax money, to cover the costs for the architectural renderings.
- A question was raised regarding the financing of the project. If
 the city would need to receive loan monies or would need to raise
 taxes, the city would need to approve the actions. (Neither of
 these actions are being considered at this time.) The City plans to
 raise the necessary funds through capital campaigns and grant
 writing.
- A question was also raised as to the cost of maintaining the new building. This question cannot be specifically answered until the plans have been finalized. At that point, a thorough assessment can be made.
- Renchin motioned & Miller 2nd to approve Yaggy-Colby's proposal for architectural services. Role Call Vote – four yes, one abstain. Motion Carried.
- Once the plans have been finalized, they will be presented to the public for input. All comments are welcome.

Penny Miller - Celebration Community Church

- Penny requested the ability to replace one week's worth of room rent with cleaning.
- Peters motioned & Miller 2nd to approve the substitution of one week's worth of room rent with one cleaning of City Hall per month. Motion Carried.

Public Hearing: City Budget

- A public hearing was held to approve the City's 2009-2010 budget. The budget was published in the Northwood Anchor and is available online at: www.fertileiowa.us
- No comments were presented
- Renchin motioned & Shropshire 2nd to approve the 2009-2010
 City Budget. Role Call Vote unanimous. Motion Carried

Public Hearing: Water Supply Wellhead Protection Regulation Ordinance

- A public hearing was held to approve the Ordinance. The ordinance outlines regulations regarding the protection of the City's wellhead, and drinking water source, from contamination.
- Berg motioned to hold the 2nd and 3rd hearings. Motion Failed.
- Renchin motioned & Miller 2nd to waive the 2nd and 3rd hearings. Motion Carried.
- Peters motioned & Miller 2nd to approve the ordinance. Roll Call Vote – Unanimous. Motion Carried.

Alliant Energy - Street Light Resolution

- The fire department requested that two new street lights be installed, one on the East side and one on the West side of their new building at 101 State Street.
- Shropshire motioned & Renchin 2nd to approve the addition of two new street lights. Roll Call Vote – Unanimous. Motion Carried

Mayor's Report

- Mayor Russell and Craig helped Hare Electric take down the Christmas decorations on Main Street.
- The WCDA will present their spring grant awards on April 15th.
 The city applied for \$63,280 to replace two pumps at the well house, replace two manholes, and to equip the well house with a natural gas powered generator. The city was awarded a total of \$167,661.86 during 2008 from the WCDA!
- The Fire Department officially moved to their new building on February 8th. An open-house will be held once the weather warms up.
- Four properties have been turned over to the attorney for noncompliance with city ordinances. The attorney has given the residents till June 1st to begin remediation.
- The City has renewed their water supply permit.
- A rabid opossum was disposed of in City limits. Please report any animal that appears to be acting odd to the Worth County Sherriff's Department. (800-458-1234)

City Clerk's Report

- Eddie presented the January financials.
- The following statistics report the % of budgeted revenue received year-to-date as well as the % of budgeted expenses spent year-to-date: (we are 58% of the way through the year)

- Renchin motioned & Shropshire 2nd to approve the Jan. Expenses. Motion Carried.
- Liens were placed on 4 residents for non-payment of utility bills.
 Addresses are as follows: 302 West Main, 210 East Washington,
 108 West Washington and 501West Washington. If you find yourself behind on payments and receive a notice, please contact the City Clerk to make arrangements to avoid the placement of a lien.
- *Miller motioned & Renchin 2nd to approve the liens*. Roll Call Vote Unanimous. Motion Carried

City Maintenance Report

- Craig replaced defective locks at the lagoon building.
- The County put up "bump" signs surrounding the culvert on 1st Street. Please remember that the speed limit is only 25 in that area. The road is scheduled to be blacktopped this summer.
- As spring approaches, please help keep your culverts and ditches free of obstacles.

Upcoming Meetings

- The Fertile City Council will meet at 7:00PM in special session, March 3, 2009, at Fertile City Hall to discuss the Community Center/Library architectural renderings
- The Fertile City Council will meet at 7:00PM in regular session, March 17, 2009, at Fertile City Hall. The architectural renderings will be approved at this meeting.



MILK COWS

From George Kisner's Book "Childhood on the Farm"

My father usually had about 5 or 6 milk cows on the farm. Ins gave us milk for the family to drink, calves to raise for sale, meat for the family, and cream to sell at the Fertile Creamery. The cows were milked by hand twice daily. It was the children's job to drive the cows up from the pasture each night and morning. Then they would be let into the cow-barn and fastened in their station.

Every cow knew her own place and would butt angrily any cow that took her spot. After the cows were in their places, my father would take a milk pail and stool and sit down on the right side of the cow to milk.

I always was anxiou to help and when I was about 5 my father would let me milk one cow that was known as an "easy milker." When I had done my best, he would always check to see that there was no milk left in the bag.

We always had 4 or 5 cats sitting around and had a milk pan to give them milk from the bucket. Sometimes they grew impatient and my father would squirt milk directly into their mouths.

After milking, some milk was saved for family and the rest was separated and the cream sold. Milking cows was a very tiresome chore. It restricted the family to the farm since it always had to be done twice a day. Sometimes you had a "kicker cow" and she would usually upset the bucket if not the milker. Sometimes we put a small rope loosely around her flanks and that always stopped her from kicking.







The Norwegian government recently purchased 1,000 used septic tanks; and as soon as they learn how to drive them, they plan to invade Sweden.



THE LEGEND OF HUNGRY HOLLOW

Hungry Hollow is a deep ravine running along the South side of the Winnebago River with a high bluff on the South side of it. It is a refuge for wild game and animals, and full of wild flowers. It was a favorite hunting ground as well as a battle field for the Winnebago Indians for many years.

It derived its name from a man and his family nearly losing their lives there. A man and his family moved into this ravine along Lime Creek and lived in a dougout. They lived there thru the summer but when winter came, they found they had neither clothing, food or fuel to last thru the terrible winter they would have to face.

This man started out to find help for his family in the middle of a snow storm. His clothes were not warm enough for such cold weather, but he walked on in the storm in the direction of the nearest home. He fell unconscious before he found this house, but the Lang family saw him and carried him into their home. When he became conscious, he asked them to save his family. They brought them to the Lang's home by sleds and kept this family until spring. They then returned to the East.

To this day, this ravine is called "Hungry Hollow".


