

City Council Meeting Minutes August 18, 2009, 7:00 PM, City Hail

Call to Order & Roll Call

Present were: Mayor Joyce Russell; Council Members: Jeff Berg, Penny Miller, Tad Miller, Cindy Peters, and Pat Renchin; and City Clerk Eddie May. Absent was Maintenance Manager Craig Koch.

Minutes Approval

- Jeff motioned, Cindy 2nd to approve the July minutes. Motion Carried.
- Public Hearing Mark Davis' Request for Transfer of Property
- Mark Davis of 210 West Main Street requested Council approval to transfer his
 restricted residential property to commercial zoning.
- A letter was mailed to each of his neighbors within a 200 foot radius from the said property informing them of his request giving them the opportunity to approve or disapprove of the zoning transfer.
- Of the nine properties that were notified, five submitted letters of rejection, three attended the meeting and voiced their rejection, and one left no comment.
- Pat motioned, Penny 2nd to reject the request for transfer of property from restricted residential to commercial zoning. Roll Call Vote was unanimous. Motion Carried. The property will not be transferred to commercial zoning.

Mike Dahn - Fertile Days Idea

- Mike presented the possibility of bringing in Impact Professional Wrestling for next
 year's Fertile Days celebration. The Council thanked Mike for showing interest in
 supporting Fertile Days. They requested more information regarding cost, minimum
 required attendance and proof of liability coverage. The Council gave Mike permission
 to begin conversations with IMW regarding the possibility contingent on this
 information.
- The Council would like to form a committee, with the leadership of the Council, to prepare for next year's Fertile Days celebration. Citizens interested in helping with the committee should contact City Hall before the next Council Meeting to voice their interest. A committee will not be formed unless there are a sufficient number of citizens willing to help. Please notify us asap if you are interested in helping.

Mayor's Report

- The City has received the money from the WCDA for the new road and for the water plant upgrades. The new road has been installed, as well as the water plant upgrades. Between both projects, the City received \$126,348.38 from the Worth County Development Authority!
- Water Tower Paint & Repair will be completing maintenance on the water tower in September. They will be cleaning the inside and repairing a leg.
- We will be receiving an extra \$1,848 for road repairs from the Governor's IJobs program this year as well as additional funds over the next 2-3 years.
- A loose dog recently bit a pedestrian. The City encourages pedestrians to be careful of dogs who are not on a leash. The City and County is addressing this particular issue with the dog owner according to the City Ordinances.
- The City has finally received the last payment from FEMA for the 08 flood.
- The paperwork has been filed and the City is now waiting for a court date to address the
 Ordinance infractions of the property at 410 North 3rd Street.
- The resident at 210 West Main Street had 21 days to clean up the property before the City filed an infraction. Progress has been made, but has not been completed. The City is allowing another 30 days for compliance.
- A Sherriff's sale will be held at the Worth County Courthouse on Sept. 22 for the property at 406 West Washington.
- The City will be requesting three bids from engineers to determine the appropriate
 action to take regarding the ditches on the east end of West Washington Street. Property
 owners are requested to attend the next two Council meeting to solve the issues related
 to the City right-of-way.

- Tad motioned, Pat 2nd to approve a resolution on equal opportunity policy. Motion Carried.
- Cindy motioned, Penny 2nd to approve a resolution adopting a code of conduct for the City of Fertile Community Development Block Grant. Motion Carried.
- Pat motioned, Penny 2nd to approve a resolution adopting a procurement policy for the City of Fertile Community Development Block Grant. Motion Carried.
- Tail motioned, Pat 2nd to approve a resolution adopting the affirmative fair housing policy. Motion Carried.

Other Business

Anne Jones, owner of The Mill, presented written requests of the City to remove a tree
that has been trapped against the dam, remove a dead tree on the bank to the west of her
property, and move a speed limit sign west of her property. The Council stated that her
requests were appropriate and that they will take action to meet her requests.

 The Fertile City Council will meet at 7:00PM in regular session, September 15, 2009, at Fertile City Hall.


Betty Waddington spoke briefly about the Fertile School Book and made a few laast minute sales. We thanked Betty for her fine job on the book.




Viola Roberts received a gift for being a graduate of the oldest class 1933 and Charlie Nye got a gift for being from the next oldest class, 1939.

Apple time is almost here—so here is an old favorite of my family.

1 3/4 cups flour

APPLE BARS

1 1/2 cups Crisco 1 1/2 tsp. Salt 1 1/2 Tbsp Sugar egg yolk and add water to make 1 CUP Mix Well and roll out crust to fit jelly roll pan. Reserve enough dough for top crust. FILLING: 1 1/2 tsp. Cinnamon 1 1/2 cups sugar (use less if you want) 5 Tbsp. Flour 10 to 15 apples pealed and sliced. (depends on the size of your apples) Mix well and pour into crust. Roll out top crust and seal onto bottom crust (like a pie) BEAT EGG WHITES & BRUSH ONTO TOP CRUST. MAKE AIR HOLES






