City Council Meeting Minutes May 18, 2010 7:00 PM, City Hall

Call to Order & Roll Call

Present were: Mayor Joyce Russell; Council Members: Jeff Berg, Penny Miller, Tad Miller, Cindy Peters and Pat Renchin: City Clerk Eddie May; and Maintenance Manager Craig Koch.

Minutes Approval

•

- One edit on April minutes Under Mayors Report it says that there will be a Sheriff's sale for 504 W. Washington. Revise to say 501 W. Washington.
- Jeff motioned, Pat 2nd to approve the April minutes. Motion Carried.

Waste Management Contract

• Waste Management representatives presented two options to last month's proposed rate increases allowing for a rate increase and a new contract for five years with guaranteed cost of living increases of 3% per year plus built in fuel surcharges if fuel exceeds \$3 per gallon.

• The proposed rate increases are outlined below:

• WM stated that we could save a little money by using smaller garbage carts: 96 Gallons 64 Gallons 32 Gallons

- The Council agreed that the 96 Gallon cart is worth the .50 difference.

- Eddie proposed that the fuel surcharge be based on a percentage scale keyed off fuel prices at the beginning of each fiscal year, rather than a static dollar amount based off current prices. This will cause the fuel surcharge 3-5
- years from now to be calculated from inflated prices, rather than current prices, since the 3% annual increase will already cover inflation.
- WM said they will consider this change and will present an updated contract prior to June's Council.
- WM also stated that they will include 2 roll-off bins for spring cleaning as part of the new contracted rate (at no additional cost to the City).
- The City will hold a public hearing at the next Council Meeting on June 15th to revise the utility billing ordinance to cover these increases.

Larsen Plumbing & Heating - Water Drainage Issues

- There have been complaints on extensive standing water on the North West corner of Larsen's property.
- The Council closed the meeting and toured the area. Since the ground was dry, they could not suggest a course of action.
- The Council will visit the site after the next rain to determine the severity of the issue. No course of action will be taken until then.

Mayor's Report

- On Earth Day, the City planted six trees along the south side of the ball fields and playground as part of a Trees Forever grant. Buck Russell and Kenny Strohman have volunteered to water the new trees.
- Buck and Joyce Russell have also planted a tree near the ball fields in remembrance of their Grandson Tanner.
- Rich Mengas of Alliant Energy presented a map of the City's electrical system. Each lighting fixture is uniquely numbered to allow for easier communication for updates and maintenance.
- Buck and Joyce Russell, Kenny Strohman, and Lloyd Knudson installed protective coverings over the ball field fences as requested by our insurance.
- The Little League has paid for upgrades to the dugouts including new fencing and cement foundations.
- Thank you for keeping your property looking nice this summer. Vacant property can be mowed by the City, at a considerable cost to the owner.
- On May 20th, Mayor Russell will present eight \$5,434.30 scholarships to Forest City Seniors, who live in Worth County, from the Worth County Development Authority (charitable arm of the Diamond Joe Casino). WCDA has also awarded \$80,063.72 to Forest City Schools for Fertile Students for the next school year.

- Eddie presented the April financials along with numbers up-to-date.

• The City currently has a \$37,728 Net Loss for the fiscal year. This deficit is the result of the road surfacing done in July. 2009, the \$30,000 purchase of Hall's Apartments and \$3.500 cost to remove asbestos, as part of the Community Center Project, the City's portion of the CDBG housing project, and un-budgeted Garden Club expenses budgeted for next year. \$33,500 will be reimbursed to the City from the WCDA g awarded last fall before the end of the fiscal year. The remaining deficit will be converted by un-spent budgeted line items and/or taken out of savings.

Maintenance Report

- lowa Jetting was called in to blow out several turtles that had plugged up the lagoon drains.
- Craig has taken a few courses towards his water/sewer license. (Warren is still the water/sewer superintendent) He is learning several new techniques for maintaining and analyzing the systems.
- Craig will be flushing the water mains soon. Watch the Forest City and Northwood papers for dates and times.
- If your water bill is drastically different from one month to the next, please notify Craig. You may have a water leak either in, or outside your home.
- Craig has been, and will continue to spray for weeds in the parks and ball fields. If Craig has to spray weeds in the City right of way, or on private property, the owners will be billed for this service.

Committee Reports

- Fertile Days: The Fertile Days Committee has been working hard to organize several activities for our celebration. A tentative schedule will be posted on the City's website at www.fertileiowa.us by the end of the month.
- Garden Club: The Garden Club has started to spruce up Main Street!

Upcoming Meetings

- The Fertile City Council will hold a public hearing at 7:00PM, Tuesday, June 15th, 2010, to propose an amendment to the utility billing ordinances to allow the City to cover the cost of service and administration. (2rd and 3rd hearings can be waived if there are no objections presented at the 1st hearing come and let your voice be heard)
- The Fertile City Council will meet at 7:15PM in regular session, Tuesday, June 15th, 2010, at Fertile City Hall.

EXODUS OF INDIANS FROM CERRO GORDO IS RECALLED (from old Globe Gazette & Fertile Reminder) L.L. Ebaugh Believed Only Living Man Who Saw Departure of Tribe.

FERTILE, IOWA, JUNE 26, 1

Lewis Leonard Ebaugh, for many years a resident of Clear-Lake but now of Fertile, is believed to be the only man living who witnessed the exodus of the Indians from Cerro Gordo county in May, 1873,

From a vantage point on Camp Rock, a huge granite boulder on the south bank of the Winnebago river in Grant township, one mile south-west of Fertile, he saw the last band of Winnebago emerge from the wooded flat on the opposite side of the stream and swing westward in single file on the old wagon trail which at that time followed the river from Mason City to the Minnesota line.

In quest of a story, I called recently on Mr. Ebaugh at his home, I found him a hale and hearty man, almost a giant in size, square shouldered and still straight as a lance. As he shook my hand in greeting, I winced under his iron grip. In the course of an hour's talk, he smoked his pipe incessantly; and when he spoke of his early years in the state, his eyes glowed with happy reminiscence.

He Came to Iowa in 1870

Mr. Ebaugh came to Iowa in the raw days of 1870 when wolves ran in packs and when the banks of the Winnebago river were dotted with Indian tepees. During his first two years residence n Grant township, he lived within 80 rods of a tented village containing 750 Winnebago Indians.

"The village," said Mr. Ebaugh, "was situated at a point where the north boundary of Cerro Gordo crosses the Winnebago river south-west of Fertile. The tents were rough affairs but warm and comfortable in winter. They were built of poplar poles covered with coarse slough grass matting, canvas cloth and ox hides. There were 80 tents or more strung along the river for half a mile."

"During the winter of '72 and 73' they spent their whole time hunting and trapping and made a clean sweep of all game. By spring there was not a deer or wolf left in this part of the state, nor scarcely and otter, mink or other fur bearing animal."

Ice Water for Baths

"They were a healthy people and lived well on buckhead hominy, parched corn and beans. Regardless of the weather, the children were given daily baths through the ice on the river, an ordeal which they appeared not to mind in the least." The whole camp was overrun with dogs of every description, and scores of typical Indian ponies were tethered to the trees without shelter of any kind."

"We were living at the time on what was known as the Warren Serrine homestead, on the south side of the river, 80 rods from the camp. The place is now owned by David Beckman. On may 16, 1873, an Indian called on father and presented him and myself with a dozen fish and muskrat spears. He announced that the camp was being razed and that they were leaving for Dakota territory in four days."

"On the fourth morning following his visit, I climbed to the top of Camp Rock, a large boulder on the bank of the river which in the early days was known as a land mark or mile post on the river trail. From this vantage point, I had a good view of the procession as it emerged from the woods and moved slowly upstream."

Was Picturesque Sight

"It was a picturesque sight, one I never forgot. They were leaving a region they loved; and as the procession got underway many turned for a last look at the spot where their homes had been."

"There was not a wheeled vehicle of any kind in the cavalcade. The tent material was transported on long polesx strapped at one end to the horse's shoulders, the other end dragging on the ground and held together with cross ties on which the load was carried. Children rode the four to a pony in canvas bags slung across the backs of wolly little ponies not much larger than the Shetland breeds. Aged bucks sat their mounts erect and proudly, and portly squaws perched on top of the tent material. Most of the younger squaws trudged afoot carrying cumbersome packs; and young bucks with guns on their shoulders, often broke rank to let fly a heavy charge at a whirring partridge or prairie grouse."

"By the time the last rider passed by, the vanguard had reached a point two miles up the stream, and by noon the last Indian disappeared around a bend in the river.

Never Returned to Site

"So far as I can recall," Mr. Ebaugh concluded, "this was the last band of Indians in the county. They never returned to the site of their old village. Eight years later, however, in 1881, a band of 50 arrived from Wisconsin and camped one winter just across the Worth County line near Fertile."

Mr. Ebaugh was born in Ohio, and was accompanied west by his parents and two brothers. He arrived in Mason City at the time his uncle, John McMullen, was opening that town's first general store. Another uncle, Lew McMullen had a few years previously filed a homestead on the present site of Forest City, but owing to an Indian scare originating farther west, he had relinquished his rights and returned to the Mason City settlement. At the time of the Indian exodus, Lew McMullen lived in a log house on a timber tract joining the Serrine homestead on the north; and on the dividing line between the two places stands Camp Rock, the boulder alluded to by Mr. Ebaugh in his story. The McMullen land is now owned by S.L. Sanderson who resides on the place.
