City Council Meeting Minutes July 19, 2011 - 7:00 PM, City Hall

Call to Order & Roll Call

- Present were: Mayor Joyce Russell; Council Members: Jeff Berg, Penny Miller, Cindy Peters and Pat Renchin; Maintenance Manager Buck Russell and City Clerk Eddie May. Absent was Council Member Tad Miller.
- · Cindy motioned, Pat 2nd to approve the May Minutes. Carried.

City Maintenance Position

- The City Council made an offer to a qualified candidate. The candidate declined the offer.
- The City Council is re-considering the offer including pay-rate and benefits including health insurance, vacation, and IPERS.

Mayor's Report

- On June 22nd, Buck and Mayor Russell cleaned up branches in Park.
- On June 29th & 30th Warren helped them clean up the picnic tables and shelter house to prepare for guests.
- On 7/2 the Suby Family reunion was held in the Park.
- Two other reservations, NI Shriners and the Fertile Girls Picnic, were unfortunately cancelled due to the rain and the heat.
- On June 30th, BMC and Nettleton Excavating re-worked the parking lot at the new City Hall and Community Center.
- On July 1s, the storm took down several trees, including one that landed across power lines near 101 School Street. Residents had minimal power for several days. Full electricity has been restored.
- On July 3rd & 4th, two tenters camped in the Park. Tenters must register with City Hall. City Hall will notify the Sheriff's Dept of the reservation. Otherwise, the park does close at 10:00 pm.
- On July 6th & 8th Aukes sprayed for mosquitoes. They will spray again before Fertile Days.
- On July 11th 200 tractors rode through town for the KGLO Tractor Ride. A BIG THANK YOU to Jerry Nye for directing traffic on the corner of Main and 1st Street!
- · A BIG THANK YOU to Jeff Berg for cutting down a ton of weeds at a couple of un-occupied properties that have been for sale.
- The City would like to remind everyone of the curfew ordinance. Minors cannot be off their parent's properties after 10:00 pm without a parent with them. The Sherriff's Dept will escort offenders home as a 1st warning. They will take them to Northwood after the 1st offense.
- · Pat motioned, Jeff 2nd to approve the appointment of Tad and Cindy as our Winn-Worth-Betco representatives. Motion Carried.

SUBY FAMILY REUNION JULY 2, 2011 FERTILE PARK, FERTILE, IOWA

On a beautiful bright sunny day sixty descendents of Andrew P. and Celia (Halvorson) Suby gathered in the William Roades Island Park in Fertile, Iowa for a family reunion.

As always at a Suby get-together the tables were overloaded with food for the noon potluck dinner. Leon and Shirley Suby, Allen and Nadine Suby and Linda (Suby) and Tom Price had organized the event and had decorated the tables in a 4th of July theme of red, white and blue.

Since we had not had a Suby reunion for some time we reacquainted ourselves and welcomed each other and started to share our stories of where life had taken us on our journey and tried to catch up on where everyone was living now, if they were still working, going south for the hard lowa winters, and where their children vere living.

Mark Suby (son of Roger and Colleen Suby and grandson of Henry and Iva Suby) has been our family historian and genealogist for many years. Several years ago he compiled a family booklet listing the descendents of Peder and Anna Larsson Suby who were father and mother to Andrew P. Suby. The booklet has interesting facts of where the family lived in Norway before coming to America and their journey to this new country.

Mark has spent countless hours visiting people, cemeteries, newspapers, courthouses, genealogy websites, etc. gathering information about the Suby family. He discovered several previously surnames before Suby was designated the family surname.

Mark brought all his information to the reunion along with a PA system and a flip chart tracing he family lineage back several hundred years. His presentation was very informative and enjoyed by everyone. Following Mark's presentation we continued to visit and enjoyed being back in the Fertile Park. Several of us had gone to school in Fertile and could recall Sunday school picnics as well as family reunions being held there. Basically it looks much the same as the trees are the same and the river still flows through. The raised footbridge is indeed an asset as it is unlikely that the ice will take it down.

Andrew and Celia lived in and around Fertile and raised their children there. They were members of the Fertile Lutheran Church. They are buried at Brush Point Cemetery on Hwy. 9 between Fertile and Hanlontown, along with several Suby family members. Their children are all deceased but they are survived by several grandchildren, great-grandchildren, great-great grandchildren and great-great-great grandchildren and perhaps some beyond.

This picture was in the last Reminder. After much deliberation, and looking at old pictures, Sara Oswald Innes, Council Bluffs and Ellamae Oswald Butler, Mason City and myself, we decided this Grandma Mary Ann (Min or Minnie) Purcell Oswald.

Mary Ann Purcell was born on October 28, 1876 in Haver Hill, Mass., the daughter of John and Mary Purcell. She came to Worth county with her parents and two brothers when only a baby and they settled on a farm about 3 1/2 miles north of Fertile, (John & Ruth Rovang home). Min taught school in the Fertile area She lived on this place until her marriage on June 22, 1898 to Andrew Oswald. Andrew died on June 5, 1921 of TB. Andrew and Min moved just 1 mile north of the Church of Christ, after their marriage ,(where Randy Oswald lives). In 2002 the farm that they owned became a Century Farm with Randy as the fourth generation farming this place.

Andrew and Min became parents of 11 children. Mary Ellen born 1899, died after only a couple months; Idona Annestatha 1900-1967; Veronica Rita 1902--1967; Albion (Doc) 1904-1983; Leo James 1905-1984; Mary Arvilla 1907-1976; Norman John (Bud) 1908-1988; EllaMargurite 1910-1918 ; Marcella Agnes (Cella) 1913-2008; Roland (Rollie) 1914-1984; Claire Collette 1916-1996. 2 cups frozen corn, thawed & drained

2 beaten Eggs

Boil 3/4 cup of Milk with the butter (Top of the stove or in Microwave) Dissolve flour in 1/4 cup of milk. Pour flour mixture into Milk mixture to make a thin white sauce. Add to the drained corn in a 1 1/2 quart greased baking dish. Mix in the beaten eggs. Bake in a 400 degree oven for 1 hour.
