City of Fertile

City Council Meeting Minutes March 15, 2011 - 7:00 PM, City Hall

Call to Order & Roll Call

- Present were: Mayor Joyce Russell; Council Members: Jeff Berg, Penny Miller, Cindy Peters and Pat Renchin; Maintenance Manager Buck Russell and City Clerk Eddie May. Absent was Council Member Tad Miller.
- Cindy motioned, Penny 2nd to approve the Feb. Minutes. Motion Carried.

Fred Hare / Hare Electric

- Fred Hare purchased the old Fire Station and plans on connecting the building to his existing business building. Fred was wondering if the water and sewer were to be disconnected, would he need to pay two water/sewer bills.
- The Council agreed that precedence set by Larsen Plumbing, Sandifer Recycling, Fertile Lumber Company and Brcka Construction allows for only one water/sewer meter when buildings are combined into one connected location and utility connections are removed or combined into one system. Therefore, Hare Electric will only have one water/sewer connection and one minimum charge for each service (water and sewer).

Fertile Fire Department

- The Fertile Fire Department has contracted with Steve Meyer Consulting to write a grant for a new Fire Truck. Fire Chief Josh Miller and Mayor Russell have been gathering all the information necessary to fill out the grant. The grant will be submitted in April and could take up to 3 years for approval.
- The Fertile Fire Department will be using the new City Hall to host a series of First Responder's courses on Monday evenings from March 22nd May 30th.
- The City has entered into a 28E Agreement with several cities in the North Iowa Area including Mason City. This agreement allows the sharing of resources between cities to help manage emergencies responses such as fires, natural disasters and hazardous material contaminations.

Mayor's Report

- Warren Bruns & Mayor Russell completed a Tier 2 report for the DNR regarding our inventory of hazardous materials.
- Mayor Russell spoke with the City's Attorney and he stated that the liens against 110 West Main Street need to stay on the property and that the purchaser of the property will be required to pay them. Kathryn Olson's estate should not be responsible for them.
- ICAP, the City's insurance provider completed their annual loss control report and found three areas the City needed to fix: two new stop signs at the corner of 1st and Main, securing of loose items in the Fire Department's pickup, and obtaining certificates of insurance by contractors working for the City. All issues are in the process of being
 brought into compliance.
- A big Thank You to Hare Electric, Buck and Mayor Russell for the hard work done in taking down the Christmas decorations on Main.
- A big Thank You to Randy Harms, Josh Miller, and Jeff Berg for cleaning up the salt and sand unfortunately dumped at 503 West Washington, Craig Koch and Kara Swingen, when the snow plow got stuck during a blizzard. The City will rake and seed the area this spring.

- The City of Fertile is the only town in Worth County to have an increase in population from the 2000 Census to the 2010 Census. The City increase from 360 to 370. A big Thank You to everyone who filled out their Census papers. This will help with grant funding!
- Governor Branstad has proposed an increase in the Gaming Tax from 22% to 36% to help balance this year's state budget. For information regarding the increase, and how it may affect available grant funding, contact the Worth County Development Authority at 641-324-1618.
- The City has received several phone calls requesting information on renting the new Community Center, including a group who wanted to have a square dance and wedding reception. Unfortunately the building will not be available for large group rental for another year, if the grants go through as hoped. The City Hall portion of the building is available for small group rentals though. The rates for rental are: \$75 per day for non-residents and \$50 per day for residents. Both residents and non-residents must also submit a \$25 deposit for cleaning. If the room is reasonably clean after the event, the deposit will be returned. Chairs and tables can also be rented for use outside the building for \$25. This rental fee will go to purchasing new tables and chairs. *Cindy motioned, Jeff 2nd to approve the new rental rates*. Motion Carried.

- Fertile Days: Skreta is scheduled to return for an evening concert! The parade, a peddle pull, community meals and other activities are already in the planning, as well as a few food vendors. Fertile Days will be August 6th and 7th this year.
- The Community Center Committee will meet on Tuesday, April 26th at 7:00 at City Hall. We will know if we have received the WCDA grant by then. If all goes well, we will start finalizing the plans for the fall grant, and gathering information for the Library portion of the project. The public is welcome to attend and offer input.

- The Fertile City Council will meet in regular session at 7:00PM, Tuesday, April 19th, 2011, at Fertile City Hall.

About 25 years ago, when Mason Dity was going strong in the brick ind tile business, some promoters that they had discovered some clay in the bank of the Winnebago river. ust east of Fertile: and as the Northwestern railroad line had latey come thru Hanlontown the time seemed opportune to start a brick-Jard.

Pcat For Fucl. It was said that the clay was uiable for making pressed brick and some thot there was plenty of peat in the neighborhood that could be used for fuel, the it is not reused in that way.

A company's was organized and itock sold. Some brick was burneds vith coal as fuel and there are arying accounts as to its quality

Some say that the product would lot stand being soaked with water, out others point to the creamery pulding in Fertile, still standing and showing that good brick was possible out of that claybank. Is Picturesque Ruin. Ohers assert that the plant was tarted as a speculation only, to be inloaded on to the buyers of stock is soon as possible.

It has seen some backsets and discouragements, as most of those behind the enterprise had to depend on what was recommended as expert labor, or to learn everything for themselves from the ground up. 4 EGGS separated

1/2 cup Lemon Juice1 1/3 cup Sugar (1 cup if using Splenda)

1/4 teaspoon salt

3 tablespoons Butter (oleo)

2 1/2 cups water

6 tablespoons corn starch

Heat water in a pan.

Beat egg yolks, sugar, corn starch and lemon juice in a bowl.

When water boils, add <u>slowly</u> to the above ingredients. Stir until thick. Add butter and pour into Baked Cruss MERINGUE

4 egg whites

1/4 teaspoon Cream of Tartar

Pinch of salt

2 tablespoon sugar.

Beat until stiff. Top pie with Meringue and put in 350° oven for 10 minutes to brown the peaks.
