Call to Order & Roll Call

- Present were: Mayor Joyce Russell; Council Members: Penny Miller and Cindy Peters and City Clerk Eddie May, Absent were: Council Members: Jeff Berg, Tad Miller, Pat Renchin; and Maintenance Manager Craig Koch.
- Quorum was not met. A meeting was scheduled for November 23, 2010 at 7:00 pm

City of Fertile

City Council Meeting Minutes November 23, 2010 - 7:00 PM, City Hall

Call to Order & Roll Call

- · Present were: Mayor Joyce Russell; Council Members: Jeff Berg, Penny Miller, Tad Miller, Cindy Peters and Pat Renchin and City Clerk Eddie May. Absent was: Maintenance Manager Craig Koch.
- · Pat motioned, Cindy 2nd to approve the October Minutes. Motion Carried.

Community Center

The City received a \$90,000 grant from the Worth County Development Authority, the charitable arm of the Diamond Joe Casino, to purchase the former Cherry Tree Builders property. The property will be used for a community center and city hall. The property was purchased for \$125,000. The remaining \$35,000 will be paid for with a line of credit with a 5% apr. The discussion was whether to get the line for the \$35,000 only, to

- be paid off in 15 payments; borrow \$55,000 to be paid off in 24 payments, or borrow \$65,000 to be paid off in 28 payments. The payments will come out of the monthly allocation we receive from the Casino - no tax payers money would be involved. The additional amounts, above the \$35,000 to purchase the building, would be used if needed to start the remodeling process. Our next WCDA grant will finish the project.
- · Cincly motioned, Tad 2nd to approve a \$65,000 line of credit, \$35,000 to be used to purchase the building and \$30,000 to be spent according to a budget to be approved at the next council meeting. Roll call vote was unanimous, Motion Carried.

Mayor's Report

- Crescent Moon has removed the porta-poties as of Nov 1st
- LeDoux signs has checked the Welcome to Fertile sign
- The DNR will be re-mapping the flood plain in 2012 for FEMA funding issues · Buck and Joyce Russell worked on the Christmas lights for Main street, Lights will not he hung on the bridge or in the park due to continued vandalism - Last year the City lost all of the lights due to cut wires
- · The Garden Club will be hanging new seasonal flags down main street
- · Fred Hare will be hanging the decorations on the light poles
- · The snow plow is fixed and ready to go for this year.
- To date, the Fertile Fire Departments have received \$265,608.98 from the WCDA, Worth County Fire Departments have received over \$1,332,861.90 (7 towns)

City Clerk's Report

- · WCTA stated that any connection to their cabling will require a full internet connection fee each month. This would mean that the city would need to pay \$560 per month for all of the necessary security camera connections. At this point, running our own cable and/or implementing a city wide wireless network would be more cost effective.

ity Council Meeting Minutes

December 21, 2010 - 7:00 PM, City Hall

Call to Order & Roll Call

- Present were: Mayor Joyce Russell; Council Members: Jeff Berg, Penny Miller, Tad Miller, Cindy Peters and Pat Renchin and City Clerk Eddie May.
- Pat motioned, Cindy 2nd to approve the November Minutes. Motion Carried.

Sealed Bids for the old Fire Station

- The City published notices in both the Northwood Anchor and the Forest City Summit requesting scaled bids for the purchase of the old Fire Station at 205 West Main.
- Bids were due by midnight on December 14th. The City received two bids.
- Fred Hare presented the highest bid at \$25,000.
- Cinuty motioned, Pat 2nd to approve the \$25,000 bid from Fred Hare. Roll call vote was unanimous, Motion Carried
- Fred has agreed to allow the City to leave the current warning siren at the building and to give the City access to the siren controls as necessary.
- Fred will gain possession of the building as soon as the proper paperwork has been filed by the City Attorney and the City has been able to move the contents of the building to the current City Hall/Maintenance building and/or the new building.

Fire Department

 The Fire Department announced that they will be looking for grant funding (not to impede upon the WCDA grants for the Community Center / City Hall and Library projects) for a new Emergency Response / Bunker vehicle. The current vehicle was made in 1978. The new vehicle will cost \$230,000. The Fire Department is looking for help to find and write the grants. The Council agreed that the City can help point them in the right direction, but that their time needed to be focused on the previously mentioned projects. The Fire Department understood and agreed.

Community Center

- · On Dec 13th the City closed on the new property. The deed has been filed with the
- County Recorder. The building was purchased with a \$90,000 WCDA grant and a \$35,000 loan to be paid off in less than 2 years. The City also secured an additional \$30,000 available if necessary to get the remodeling project started.
- · The City has secured insurance for the building.
- Bids were received from Breka Construction and Larsen Plumbing and Heating for the remodeling project. Hare Electric is waiting for the Electric Inspector and Fire Marshall to preview the plans before submitting their portion of the remodeling bids. Bids for the cabinetry are still forth coming.
- · The City has the option to accept additional bids.

Mayor's Report

- On Nov. 24th, Craig notified Mayor Russell that he had accepted another full-time job. Buck Russell has taken over the water and sewer responsibilities, still supervised by Warren Bruns. Jeff Berg and Josh Miller have taken over the snow plowing duties. Eddie May and Matt Olson are alternates. The City will accept applications and consider either one full-time, or two part-time people to fill the position.
- On December 5th, the Globe Gazette published an article about the City of Fertile. They
 interviewed Mayor Russell and others in town. While the article was not 100%
 accurate, it was still a great plug for our little town. ⁽²⁾
- Vandalism: before the snow covered them, someone pulled up one of the new picnic tables at the ball fields. Luckily it can be re-installed with minor effort. Vandals have also pulled off the drop-box cover at the Library.
- The water tower was cleaned and inspected this spring. The interior lining is in good condition and only needs to be re-cleaned and inspected every 2 years. The exterior is in poor condition and needs to be painted within the next 3 years.
- Cindy motioned, Tad 2nd to approve a 10 year contract with Maguire Iron to inspect and clean the tower for \$1550 every two years. Motion Carried.
- Breka Construction installed a 10 foot garage door in-between City Hall and the Maintenance Garage. Once the new building is ready to move City Hall into, we will move the items from the old Fire Station into the current City Hall/Maintenance Shed building, thereby converting it completely into the Maintenance Shed only.

- · Buck is learning the new computerized controls at the water plant from Fred Hare
- Eddie has been in training to be a back-up snow plow driver. He got the snow plow stuck twice on his first night out, once on his second night out, and did not get stuck on his third time out. It appears that he is learning from his mistakes ^(C) (We greatly appreciate your patience, as us newbies are learning the ropes.)
- Eddic felt a little better though; knowing that he is not the only one giving Frank's towing some good extra Christmas cash, as the Waste Management Recycling truck and a County plow got stuck within a week from his fiascoes. – Tis the season.
- Jeff and Josh will be going around town trimming up several trees and bushes that have been hitting the snow plow. Also – please remember the snow ordinances and park your vehicles off the road, and move back your garbage and recycle bins when the plow is going to be out and about.

Committee Reports

- Housing Committee Rome has had some issues with his remodeling, but the contractor will be taking good care of him and get the issues fixed asap.
- Garden Club the first flag poles sent to us were not strong enough to handle the weight
 of the tlags in the wind. They have been returned and new wooden ones were sent in
 their place.

Other Business

- Dan Lee, at 101 West Main Street, applied for a variance to allow his commercial sign to be posted in a residential lot.
- Pat motioned, Cindy 2nd to approve a variance allowing a commercial sign, of the current size and location, to be erected and maintained at 101 West Main Street for Riverside Construction. Motion Carried.
- If the business were to change, or if the sign were to be made bigger, or moved closer to the edges of the property, the variance would have to be re-approved.

City Council Meeting Minutes

January 18, 2010 - 7:00 PM, City Hall

- Call to Order & Roll Call
- Present were: Mayor Joyce Russell; Council Members: Jeff Berg, Permy Miller, Cindy Peters and Pat Renchin; and Maintenance Manager Buck Russell. Absent were: Council Member Tad Miller and City Clerk Eddie May. Minutes were recorded by Council Member Penny Miller.
- Cindy motioned, Penny 2nd to approve the December Minutes Motion Carried.
- Public Hearing on the sale of the old Fire Station
- The regular meeting was closed at 7:04 and the Public Hearing was opened.
- Mayor Russell read a letter, prepared by City Attorney John Greve, giving the legal description of the old Fire Station located at 205 West Main Street.
- The public was asked for any opinions or objections regarding the sale of the old Fire Station building to Fred Hare for the sum of \$25,000.00. No objections or other opinions were given.
- * Jeff Berg motioned and Pat Renchin 2nd that we approve the sale of the old Fire Station located at 205 IVest Main Street. Roll call vote was held, Motion carried.
- The Public Hearing was closed at 7:10 pm and the regular meeting was reopened.
- **Budget Submissions**
- The budget for the Worth County Sheriff's office was turned in to the Mayor for our review. They have asked for \$6.25 per person for the 360 people who reside in Fertile for a total budget of \$2,250.00 for the fiscal year 2011-12. Cindy Peters motioned and Pat Renchin 2nd to approve the Worth County Budget, Motion carried.
- Lisa May turned in the budget for the Fertile Library for review. The budget was increased by \$500 from last year to cover increased utility costs and other expenses.
- Dan Miller turned in the budget for the Fire Department for review. The Fire Department requested \$11,000.00 for 2011. The membership has risen from 7 to 14 and they will need more bunker gear as well as an expensive mandated radio upgrade.
- Penny Miller, from the Fertile Garden Club, turned in their budget for the year 2011. They are asking for \$700, which is down from last year.
- Fred Hare brought to the council's attention that the electrical service for the lighting on Main Street needs to be replaced. It is old and keeps burning out. He thinks we should move the electrical box, from the pole outside, into the old city hall, so that it could be inside instead of out in the elements Fred gave an initial quote of \$12,000 to \$15,000.
- · The lawn mower needs to be replaced for the city. Three quotes were given to the Mayor for the council's review. \$8,719.20 from Doug's Service in Garner for a Toro; \$5,550 from Kramer Hardware in Clear Lake for a Country Clipper, and \$5,000 from North Central Sales & Service in Leland for a Country Clipper. This price includes the trade-in of our current mower. All of them will service the mower and replace it while the mower is repaired with a loaner.
- The Library, Fire Department, Garden Club and special item budgets will be reviewed and approved or adjusted at a special budget meeting on February 2, 2011. A public hearing will be held on February 15th to approve the final budget numbers.
- **Community Center**
- · The state electrical inspector "grandfathered" in the current electrical service for the community center. This will save the city a lot of money that might have been required to re-work the service. The building currently is wired for 3-phase which is more than we will ever need. Fred will downsize it to a single-phase to save money.
- It was suggested that the air lines in the new building be used by the Fire Department. Pat moved and Cindy 2nd that the Fire Department be allowed to remove the air lines in the community center building and transfer them to the Fire Department building. Motion Carried. Any lines not used by the Fire Department will be returned to the community center building.
- The Community Center/City Hall 2nd phase WCDA grant application is due. The city requested quotes for electrical, plumbing and construction to submit for the grant. According to our city ordinances any bid less than \$50,000 does not require more than one bid be procured. Larson Plumbing and Heating quoted \$50,000, Hare Electric quoted \$39,855 and Brcka Construction quoted \$37,000. Pat Renchin motioned, Cindy Peters 2nd that the city of Fertile submit a grant application for the 2nd phase of the City Hall/Community Center in the amount of \$102,000 to WCDA. Motion carried. The 3rd, and final, phase of the City Hall/Community Center grant will be applied for in the fall WCDA grant awards.

Mayor's Report

- in 2010, the WCDA gave the City of Fertile \$209,793.08. Street improvements and purchase of the community center/city hall building for \$176,818.90. Fertile Days award of \$2,000.00, Monthly awards to City of Fertile total \$30,974.18 (used for Fire Department loan payments and a new water heater in the Library).
- A letter was sent requesting snow removal for the property at 110 West Main Street.
- The first week of January, the mayor and city clerk packed the contents of the old city hall up in • preparation for the move to the new city hall. On January 8th, everything was moved to the new city hall building. The City of Fertile would like to thank Dan, Penny and Josh Miller for their assistance and for the use of their truck and trailer. Thanks also to Cindy Peters, Warren Bruns, Buck & Joyce Russell and Eddie May for helping out.
- On January 7th, WCTA moved the phones to the new building.

Maintenance Report

- Buck reported that everything was running smoothly. Buck mentioned that the lagoon building needs painted, and sealed and the roof needs to be repaired as well. The gates at the lagoon need to be replaced and or removed. We could consider removing the secondary gates and install just one main gate. Warren said that another valve was leaking in the west lagoon (little cell) and we need to have that repaired.
- Advertisement for a maintenance person was listed in the paper on January 12th and also posted at various locations around town. 3 applications have been received so far. 2 of the applications were from people who do not live in Fertile and that is a pre-requisite for the job. They were not interested in moving to Fertile. Another applicant will graduate from NIACC in May. He stated that he would be willing to move to Fertile. The mayor and council will interview any and all applicants for this
- Tad Miller asked Cindy Peters to bring the idea of sharing the costs of a city maintenance man with another community. Cindy Peters had talked with the Mayor of Hanlontown, and they were not interested. The council discussed the pros and cons and determined that we would probably not be able to share hours with another city.
- The council has decided that the water meters will not be read and will be estimated for the months of January and February due to the large amount of snow and ice this winter.
- UTILITY BILLS can still be dropped off at the drop box located in the old city hall building. **Committee Reports**
- Fertile Days committee will meet at the new city hall on January 25th at 7:00 pm.
- Other Business
- · Cindy Peters will be researching and getting an estimate for three security cameras to be placed around town; much like Heritage Park of North Iowa has currently. They will utilize a "live cam website" which can be viewed by the public at any time via the internet. We will need to budget approximately \$3,000.00 for the cameras.
- Pat moved and Jeff 2nd to adjourn the meeting. Motion Carried. Upcoming Meetings
